PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, thanked the Board for the generous check in the amount of \$25,000 to improve Garwood's recreational facilities. He stated that in reference to Resolution 2013-848, he asked about the 2 municipalities that did not attend the meeting. He also asked about the two representatives for municipalities who did not attend the meeting relating to Resolution 2013-850.

Mr. Paterson asked if Resolution 2013-851 is a result of the upcoming campaign. He asked if Resolutions 2013-853 through 856 will offset taxes. He asked if the individual mentioned in Resolution 2013-860 is the same person that retired from the Prosecutor's Office. In reference to 2013-864, he questioned if hiring a vendor was necessary and spoke about the vendor's contributions relative to both Resolution 2013-864 and 2013-868. He said he appreciates Freeholder Granados' questions about Resolution 2013-871, adding that the firm should be responsible for the professional design costs of the building, not the residents.

Ms. Drake responded to Resolutions 2013-848 and 850. She stated that in reference to Resolution 2013-848, Fanwood received \$18,000 to improve an ice skating rink and Rahway received \$124,080 to improve their softball field, resurface 3 tennis courts and a basketball court at Madison Elementary School. She stated that she did not have the information available regarding the municipalities for the two remaining Greening Union County grant awards as mentioned in Resolution 2013-850.

County Counsel Barry stated that in reference to Resolutions 2013-851, 864 and 868, the answer is no. The vendors are chosen from a prequalified list; and contributions are irrelevant.

Director Zuber stated that in reference to Resolution 2013-868, Maser Consulting has a lot of experience with these type of projects, such as properties in Bayonne, Cedar Grove, Seton Hall Preparatory School and other counties, along with some properties in Union County. He added that they are qualified to handle this project.

County Manager Faella stated that relative to Resolution 2013-860, there is no relation between the vendor and the employee who retired from the Prosecutor's Office.

Director Sanchez stated that Resolution 2013-871 is the Final Change Order. So far, it has shown to be successful and the anticipated revenue was set at \$5.6 million and said it looks like they are on tract to generate \$6.2 million in revenue. This would result in an increase of revenue by \$600,000. He stated to date, there has been 110,000 rounds of golf, 55 events totaling 5,000 guests, 170 patrons and 600 kids in the junior golf, 2 national and international junior golf tournaments. He stated that the First Tee America had the First North East Regional Golf training from Maine to Virginia was held at the facility. Director Sanchez made reference to a Star Ledger article lauding the course as a great public golf course.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, stated that Director Sanchez spoke about the revenue pertaining to Resolution 2013-871, but would like to know about the expenses.

John Bury, Kenilworth, asked which properties have been appraised within the last 2 years, referring to Resolutions 2013-846 and 847. In reference to Resolution 2013-851, he asked what type of

qualifications are needed to be placed on the approved list.

Ms. Drake stated that the appraisal firms mentioned in Resolutions 2013-846 and 847 are retained for future appraisals needed. She stated that two Green Acres approved appraisers is required by the State. The contracts for the appraisals are done annually.

County Counsel Barry stated that an RFP and/or an RFQ is required for services like engineering, architects and attorneys. He said political contributions does not play a factor in being qualified.

Tina Renna, Cranford, stated that Cranford paid out a net amount of \$5,789,000 to the Open Space Trust Fund to date, further stating that Cranford paid approximately \$600,000 in 2012 and received \$88,000 in return. She said the school system doe not maintain the sports system as there is a fee to play sports of \$125 per student. She stated that Westfield has paid \$10.5 million into the Trust Fund. She claims the municipalities are required to post signs that the projects are supported by the Freeholder Board.

Ms. Renna asked who the vehicles were last issued to relative to Resolution 2013-861.

Chairman Carter stated that applications for the Trust Fund projects are submitted by the municipalities.

County Manager Faella confirmed her statement.

Director DiRado stated that in reference to Resolution 213-861, the Dodge vehicle was used by the Union County Police Department as a patrol car and then by the Juvenile Detention Center and the Crown Victorian was used by the warrant squad in the Sheriff's Office.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

This meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on any matter.

Councilman Robert Rubino of Summit, thanked the Freeholders for the dollars to make improvements to their recreational programs, especially for Wilson park. He said he appreciates the time that County Manager Faella spent with them over the summer.

Councilman Rubino stated that the City Treasurer provided him with two charts, which he gave to the Clerk of the Board to distribute to the Freeholders regarding Summit's taxes. He asked the Board to consider a 2% nominal cap without any waivers, and to have a goal of a 0% tax increase. He said the average household in Summit pays \$8 for City taxes compared to County taxes of \$382 per household per year. He urged Union County to merge the Sheriff's Office and the County Police Departments.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, asked for the expenses for the Galloping Hill Golf Course facilities to date. He stated that at the last Freeholder Meeting, County Manager Faella spoke about how outraged they were as a result of a former County employee's actions. He urged the Board to investigate the

years prior to what the employee pled guilty to, not only the past 4 or 5 years.

Mr. Buettner made mention of the past Freeholder Debate, stating that Freeholder Kowalski was speaking about how many jobs the Galloping Hill Golf Course facilities created. He said the calculations estimate that the County spent \$250,000 per job. He asked about the expenses for the facilities.

Mr. Buettner asked why the trees were cut down near the 9th hole. He gave a breakdown of all the expenses at the Galloping Hill Golf Course which totals approximately \$25 million.

Chairman Carter stated that jobs were created for full time, part time, seasonal and construction jobs as a result of the new Galloping Hill Golf Course and its facilities.

Freeholder Kowalski stated that there was also 100 construction jobs that were made available.

Chairman Carter stated that all money is from the capital expense account.

County Manager Faella confirmed Chairman Carter's statement.

Director Sanchez explained that two trees were removed near two putting greens because the roots were growing under the green, which takes nutrients away from that area. This would have had an adverse affect on the health of the golf course and will result in more maintenance costs.

Tina Renna, Cranford, suggested to put the Trust Fund tax on a reprieve. That the Open Space Trust Fund has paid out \$6.5 million to date. She stated that Union County has three departments, the County Police, the Sheriff's Office and the Corrections Department performing the same job. She urged the Board to consider merging the departments.

Chairman Carter said the Board is not taking the improvements/upgrades to Asset Management lightly.

Ms. Renna stated that there was no explanation from the Board or County Manager Faella about the former Director of Division of Facilities Management's actions. She said the public deserves an explanation and a full investigation should be done on all the departments.

County Manager Faella stated that there are measures that have been put in place regarding those improvements and upgrades and will continue to look to improve and review them.

County Counsel Barry corrected a previous speakers statement. He said that the majority of County jails are indeed controlled by the Sheriff's Office.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, said he was pleased to hear that Chairman Carter voted no for Resolution 2013-871. He spoke about construction costs and code requirement costs. He stated that property values have decreased, therefore, taxes should be going down. He said it is not normal procedure for a government entity to be using the Cap Bank process. He added that he is in favor of districting the Freeholders.

Mr. Paterson said that each piece of equipment should be tracked. He is in favor of merging the County Police and Sheriff's Office, and asked the Board to consider it.

Mr. Paterson made reference to former County Manager Devanney continued involvement with the County and MusicFest funds.

Director DiRado stated that the bar codes are laminated with serial numbers on the County equipment.

Chairman Carter stated that the public misspoke about the Open Space Trust Fund. The municipalities are receiving more than the checks that were issued to the public tonight.

Ms. Drake provided the public with some of the Open Space Trust Fund projects and acquisitions that have been benefited by the City of Summit:

To name a few: American Water Property - \$9 million; which was a very important acquisition to the City, as the property would have been developed had the County not purchased the land; 5 acres on Glenside Avenue for \$4 million, where the City only contributed \$1 million. She also mentioned another \$1 million in County Trust Funds towards turf soccer fields in Summit. She stated that the Trust Fund also assists with trees, developing land and improving recreational facilities, which are available to all Union County residents.

Chairman Carter stated that over \$13 million has been spent to preserve open space in Summit through the use of the Trust Fund, adding that they are getting back much more than what they have contributed.

Vice Chairman Hudak spoke about merging the police and sheriff's department in Bergen County. He stated that he has been on the Fiscal Committee for the past 2 years, and they have reviewed all the options on merging the departments. However, the County Police provides different services than the Sheriff's Department, such as marine rescues and a bomb squad. He said that most counties have County Park police and the parks still need to be patrolled. He stated that several counties are looking at a regional police office.

John Bury, Kenilworth, asked which properties need to be appraised and he asked about the pre-approved list of vendors. He also asked if the \$25 million that was spent for the Galloping Hill Golf Course is for the building only, and asked if there was a breakdown of costs available.

County Counsel Barry stated that Ard Appraisal and Appraisal Associates, Inc. are being retained for potential litigation and for the property on West Grand Street in Elizabeth. He said in some instances one appraisal is sufficient, but Open Space Trust Fund acquisitions are required to have two appraisals per Green Acres. He said the appraisal firms are not limited to using them for the Open Space Trust Fund.

Mr. Mineo stated that the pre-approved list consists of services, such as architects, engineers, construction management and sport field consultants. He said County Counsel's office issues an RFQ and interested parties respond by submitting their qualifications; typically in November.

County Counsel Barry explained that either an RFP or an RFQ are offered in the fall. He said the requests typically go out in November or December, though some are done in mid year.

FREEHOLDER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Freeholder Kowalski stated that the fees to participate in school sports is not part of the Open Space Trust Fund. She stated that Cranford has a great park system and listed all the amounts that were spent on improving the parks, by the dollars of the Open Space Trust Fund. She said it takes a lot of time, effort and money to maintain parks on a day to day basis.

Freeholder Kowalski announced that there will be a river clean up this coming weekend in Cranford.

Freeholder Kowalski said that the Annual Four Centuries in a Weekend event will be held on Saturday, October 19th and Sunday, October 20th. Every year there is something different, and this year, they are welcoming the historian Robert Sullivan to the restored Masker's Barn at the Deserted Village in the Watchung Reservation.

Freeholder Kowalski also mentioned another historical event on Friday, October 25th for unveiling the first Union County Memorial to honor our Medal of Honor recipients.

Freeholder Kowalski urged the public to write to Executive Director James Weinstein of NJ Transit to urge for direct train service from the Raritan Valley Line into New York City at peak hours and weekends.

Freeholder Kowalski said that she was pleased to hear that a previous speaker is using the Galloping Hill Golf Course. She added that the Golf Course contracts have added to economic development.

Freeholder Mirabella announced that on Saturday, October 19th, the annual Red Ribbon Day Drug Prevention Walk will be held in Nomahegan Park in Cranford from 11:00 to 4:00.

Freeholder Mirabella encouraged the public to attend the information center on Saturday, October 19th at Union County Vocational-Technical Schools.

Freeholder Mirabella wished Chairman Carter, Freeholder Granados and Freeholder Kowalski the best of luck on Election Day. He mentioned that he attended the Freeholder Debate and said he was confident they would be re elected.

Freeholder Granados stated that he attended the groundbreaking for the new Family Court facility at 2 Cherry Street in Elizabeth. He said the project is slated to be completed in December 2014.

Freeholder Bergen reminded and urged voters to vote on Election Day, November 5th.

Freeholder Jalloh spoke about the Federal Government Shutdown. He said, so far the federally funded programs run by the County have remained unaffected, and although an agreement has been reached, it is a temporary relief. The agreement allows for funding of the government up until January when the threat of another shutdown can occur. He said the Board is committed to continue to provide essential services to our residents.

Freeholder Mirabella stated that in reference to the County Police and Sheriff's Office, they provide different functions and services.

Freeholder Estrada congratulated Mayor Corey Booker on his election as the U.S. Senator.

County Manager Faella thanked Vikki Drake and her staff, Edith Marie, Judy Biniaris and Deputy Director Rountree, Director Graziano, Director Brennan and Director Zuber for all their hard work pertaining to open space. He said open space is the jewel of our County.

County Counsel Barry said that there were many comments regarding the RFP/RFQ process tonight. He explained that RFP/RFQ's are done because they are needed by many departments throughout the County and are posted to the County's website.

County Counsel Barry stated that Executive Session will be discussing Engineering/Architects for the Hospital and litigation Counsel. He said they will be posted on the website throughout the course of the year.

Vice Chairman Hudak stated that on Wednesday, October 30th another installment of a free breakfast networking series, Union County Means Business event will take place at the Union County Performing Arts Center's Hamilton State in Rahway from 8:00am to 10:00am.

Vice Chairman Hudak wished Chairman Carter, Freeholder Kowalski and Freeholder Granados the best of luck on Election Day. He also congratulated Mayor Corey Booker on his election as the new U.S. Senator. He said unfortunately, it cost New Jersey tax payers \$24 million dollars for having a Special Election one month prior to the General Election.

Chairman Carter also congratulated Mayor Corey Booker.

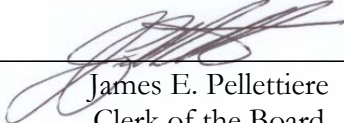

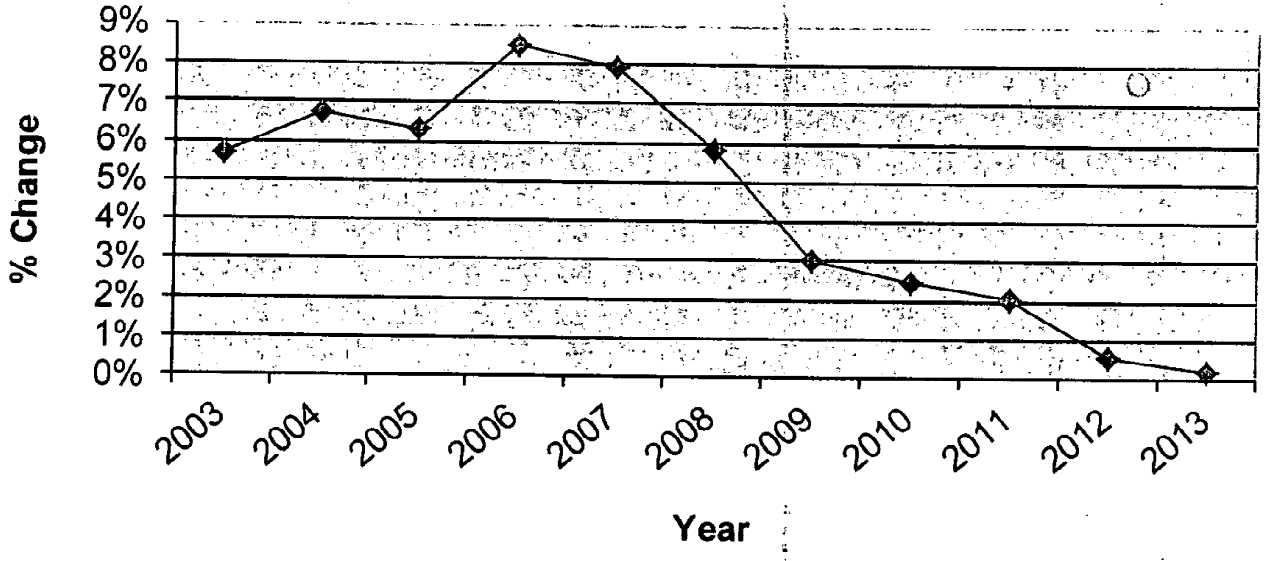

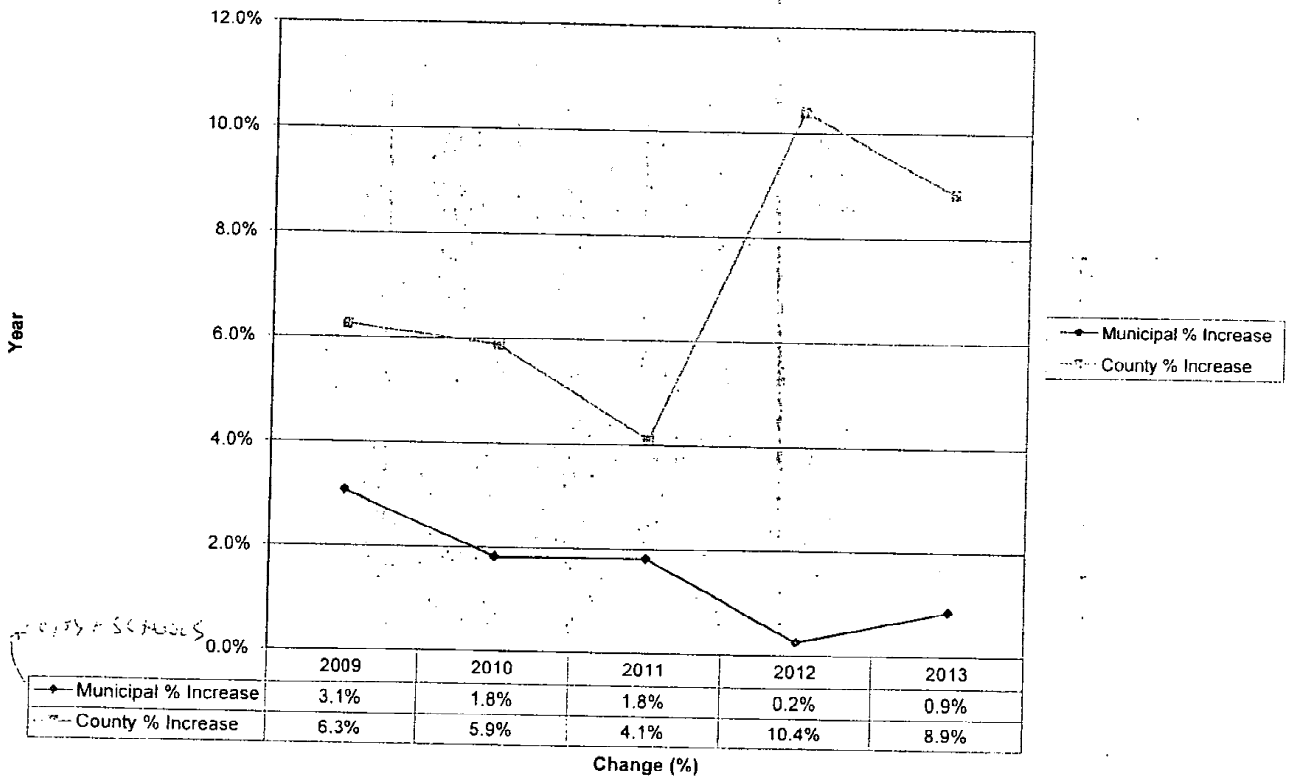
