Seed Starting/Container Gardening

Jim Nichnadowicz, County 4-H Agent

In this hands-on workshop, you will learn techniques for sharing the wonder and magic of seed starting with children. We will work with the easiest seeds for youngsters to grow and discuss the options for caring for the seeds once they sprout. We will also review how to use an indoor grow-frame. Copies of the seed starting/gardening curriculum, "Garden in the City", will be given out to all who attend. We will also learn how to use simple containers (buckets, tubs and crates) to build your container garden in minutes; and discuss how to best maintain them.

Cooking with Kids for a Healthy Life

Cooking garden produce brings the classroom from seed to plate. Teaching youth basic cooking techniques like chopping, mixing, and sautéing, equips them with skills they will use for their lifetime. Research shows the more kids are exposed to unfamiliar foods, the more likely they are to eat them. This workshop will include a food demo and familiarize participants with excellent curriculum that promotes garden-enhanced nutrition education.

Starting a Community Garden

You have the enthusiasm to start a vegetable garden at your school or in your community—now its time to make your plans! This workshop will help you select a good location for the garden and a style that will work for you and your gardeners. We'll talk about budgeting for the garden and materials you will need to grow vegetables. Once these decisions have been made, its time for site preparation, planting and maintaining your vegetable crops!

Improving Your Soil Through Composting

Whether you have a school garden or not, incorporating composting into a curriculum is a great way to teach kids about relationships in ecosystems, soil food webs, and recycling. We'll review a sample lesson plan, discuss techniques for getting youth excited to compost, common pitfalls, and the basic concepts and supplies needed to get started.
