- Apr. 5 Early Spring Hike Take advantage of the beauty of spring by hiking one of our nature trails. Along the way look for wildflowers, young leaves, bird nests and baby animals
- Apr. 12 Leaf Out Project BudBurst needs your help! It is the perfect time of year to watch new leaves unfurl and flower buds burst into bloom. Become a citizen scientist by observing and recording what happens in your own backvard
- Apr. 19 Conservation Counts Get ready for Earth Day and learn ways to "Go Green" around your house and yard. Make a craft using recyclables and discover how you can make a difference.
- Apr. 26 Sounds of Spring Become an animal detective and use your ears to listen for common spring sounds. Can you identify a robin singing, a chipmunk chipping or cricket chirping? Find out how and why animals communicate. Let your ears lead you on a walk in search of spring sounds.
- May 3 Outdoor Creativity Many famous poets, writers, artists, and musicians have been inspired by nature to create their works. Learn about some famous pieces that were inspired by the outdoors, and then try your hand at using nature to inspire the artist in you!
- May 10 Migratory Birds Warblers, hawks and wrens are migrating north. Discover why birds migrate and learn simple techniques to help you identify them. Use binoculars to get an up close look at some backyard birds.

May 17 Fun With Fungi - The kingdom of mushrooms is comprised of some pretty fun-guys; some that even glow in the dark! Find out interesting facts about these important decomposers, and dissect a mushroom to learn about its parts. Take a walk in search of turkey tails, fairy rings and puffballs.

May 24 A Naturalist's Notebook - A great way to learn about the natural world is to keep a journal with sketches and notes. Construct your very own naturalist notebook using upcycled materials. Complete your first journal entry on a walk through the reservation.

May 31 Storm Chasers - Discover what causes tornadoes, hurricanes, thunderstorms and floods. Find out how to prepare for severe weather and learn what to do if you are ever caught in a storm. Create a mini tornado in a bottle to take home!

June 7 Stream Search - Discover the diversity of life that is found in a stream. Collect, identify and release crayfish, salamanders and aquatic insects. Find out how these animals are indicators of a stream's health. Wear shoes that can get wet.


