BOROUGH OF ROSELLE PARK (2015)

Descriptions of New Ward Boundaries January 2022

The following data resources were provided by the NJDEP Stream centerlines 2015; NJDOT Street centerlines 2015; TeleAtlas Street centerlines 2010. The parcels (2021) were provided and referenced as the interpretation made by the New Jersey Geographic Information Network (NJGIN). The municipal boundaries 2021, were provided and referenced as the interpretation made by the NJ Office of GIS. This source data was utilized for the preparation of the election district word description as stipulated under N.J.S.A. 19:4-13 et seq., as required by Administrative Law 13:17-3.1 for submission to the Office of the New Jersey Secretary of State (SOS).

The Borough of Roselle Park in the County of Union in the State of New Jersey is comprised of a total of Five (5) Wards. Due to population changes and other concerns documented during Census 2020, new boundaries for these wards are required to meet Title 40, 40A (Municipalities, Counties) guidelines and the Borough's current needs. The new boundaries for these wards are described herein.

Ward One

The First Ward of the Borough of Roselle Park shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border is a point on the physical centerline of Walnut Street and the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned);

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of East Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28);

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of East Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28), to a point where said boundary is intersected by another point on the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of East Grant Avenue;

Thence, Eastwardly, following along the physical centerline of East Grant Avenue, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Galloping Hill Road, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the City of Elizabeth, Union County shared border;

Continue, Southwardly, following along the physical centerline of Galloping Hill Road, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the City of Elizabeth, Union County shared border, crossing the physical centerline of East Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28), to a point where said boundary intersects the Borough of Roselle Park, Borough of Roselle and the City of Elizabeth, Union County shared border, which is also the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned);

Thence, West, following along the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned), which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Walnut Street, which is also the point of beginning.

Ward Two

The Second Ward of the Borough of Roselle Park shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the physical centerline of the East Grant Avenue is intersected by the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Thence, Southwest, following along the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Chestnut Street (County Route 627);

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Chestnut Street (County Route 627), to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of East Roselle Avenue;

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of East Roselle Avenue, to another point of intersection with the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of East Sumner Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border;

Thence, East, following along the extended physical centerline of East Sumner Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Galloping Hill Road, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border;

Continue, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Galloping Hill Road, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of the East Grant Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the City of Elizabeth, Union County shared border;

Proceed, Southwesterly, following along the physical centerline of the East Grant Avenue, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of the Walnut Street, which is also the point of beginning.

Ward Three

The Third Ward of the Borough of Roselle Park shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border is a point on the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619) and the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned);

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619), crossing the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28) and the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue;

Thence, West, following along the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Larch Street;

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Larch Street, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of West Sumner Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border;

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of West Sumner Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Walnut Street, which is also another point on the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Union, Union County shared border;

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to another point of intersection with the physical centerline of East Roselle Avenue;

Thence, West, following along the physical centerline of East Roselle Avenue, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Chestnut Street (County Route 627);

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Chestnut Street (County Route 627), to its point of intersection with the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Thence, Northeast, following along the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, to a point where said boundary intersects with another point on the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of East Grant Avenue;

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of East Grant Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with another point on the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of East Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28);

Thence, West, following along the physical centerline of East Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28), to a point where said boundary intersects with another point on the physical centerline of Walnut Street;

Continue, South, following along the physical centerline of Walnut Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned), which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border;

Thence, West, following along the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned), which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619), which is also the point of beginning.

Ward Four

The Fourth Ward of the Borough of Roselle Park shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Borough of Roselle Park, Township of Cranford and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border is a point on the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Thence, North, following along the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border, from the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28);

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Jerome Street;

Thence, North, following along the physical centerline of Jerome Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue, continuing around the southeast side of Lincoln Park, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Laurel Avenue;

Thence, Southeast, following along the extended physical centerline of Laurel Avenue, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Thence, Northeast, following along the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619);

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619), to a point where said boundary intersects with the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned), which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border;

Thence, West, following along the centerline of Central Railroad of New Jersey-Main Line right-of-way (abandoned), which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Ward Four (cont'd)

Continue, West, following along the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border, to the point where said boundary intersects the Borough of Roselle Park, Township of Cranford and the Borough of Roselle, Union County shared border, which is also the point of beginning.

Ward Five

The Fifth Ward of the Borough of Roselle Park shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border is a point on the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28);

Thence, North, following along the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border, from the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28) to a point where said boundary is intersected by the Borough of Roselle Park, Township of Cranford and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border;

Continue, Northwardly, following along the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West Colfax Avenue, which is also another point on the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of West Colfax Avenue, to another point on the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border;

Thence, North, following along the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West Sumner Avenue;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of West Sumner Avenue, which is also the Borough of Roselle Park and the Borough of Kenilworth, Union County shared border, to a point Report of the Roselle Park Re-Warding Commission – January 2022

where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Larch Street, which is also a point on the Borough of Roselle Park, Borough of Kenilworth and the Township of Union, Union County shared border;

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Larch Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue;

Thence, East, following along the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619);

Thence, South, following along the physical centerline of Locust Street (County Route 619), to a point where said boundary intersects with the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way;

Thence, Southwest, following along the centerline of New Jersey Transit-Raritan Valley Line right-of-way, to a point where said boundary intersects with the extended physical centerline of Laurel Avenue;

Thence, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of Laurel Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of West Webster Avenue, continuing around the southeast side of Lincoln Park, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Jerome Street:

Continue, South, following along the physical centerline of Jerome Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28);

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of West Westfield Avenue (N.J. State Highway Route 28), to a point where said boundary intersects with the point on the Borough of Roselle Park and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border, which is also the point of beginning.

The Borough of Roselle Park is currently located in Legislative District Twenty-One and Congressional District Ten.
