TOWN OF WESTFIELD (2020)

Descriptions of New Ward Boundaries January 2022

The following data resources were provided by the NJDEP Stream centerlines 2015; NJDOT Street centerlines 2015; TeleAtlas Street centerlines 2010. The parcels (2021) were provided and referenced as the interpretation made by the New Jersey Geographic Information Network (NJGIN). The municipal boundaries 2021, were provided and referenced as the interpretation made by the NJ Office of GIS. This source data was utilized for the preparation of the election district word description as stipulated under N.J.S.A. 19:4-13 et seq., as required by Administrative Law 13:17-3.1 for submission to the Office of the New Jersey Secretary of State (SOS).

The Town of Westfield in the County of Union in the State of New Jersey is comprised of a total of Four (4) Wards. Due to population changes and other concerns documented during Census 2020, new boundaries for these wards are required to meet Title 40, 40A (Municipalities, Counties) guidelines and the Town's current needs. The new boundaries for these wards are described herein.

Ward One

The First Ward of the Town of Westfield shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border is intersected by the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad);

Thence, Northwardly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Mountainside, Union County shared border shared border;

Continue, Eastwardly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Mountainside, Union County shared border shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Priscilla Lane;

Continue, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Priscilla Lane, which transitions into the physical centerline of North Chestnut Street, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of East Broad Street (County Route 509);

Thence, Southwesterly, following along the physical centerline of East Broad Street (County Route 509), to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of East Plaza (County Route 610), which is also a appoint on the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad);

Continue, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad), crossing over the physical centerline of Crossway Place, to a point where said boundary is intersected by a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border and the point of beginning.

Ward Two

The Second Ward of the Town of Westfield shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Mountainside, Union County shared border is intersected by the physical centerline of Priscilla Lane;

Thence, Northeastwardly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Mountainside, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of East Broad Street (County Route 509), which is also a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Springfield, Union County shared border;

Continue, Southwardly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Springfield, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects with the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border;

Thence, Southwardly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Cranford, Union County shared border, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of East South Avenue (County Route 610), which is also a point in the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Garwood, Union County shared border;

Proceed, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of East South Avenue (County Route 610), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Livingston Street;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Livingston Street, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Stirling Place;

Thence, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of Stirling Place, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Cacciola Place

Continue, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Cacciola Place, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Central Avenue (County Route 613);

Proceed, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of Central Avenue (County Route 613), to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Park Street;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Park Street, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Carleton Road;

Continue, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of Carleton Road, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Ross Place;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Ross Place, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of the Boulevard;

Thence, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of the Boulevard, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610);

Proceed, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610), to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of Watterson Street;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Watterson Street, to its point of intersection with the physical centerline of East Plaza (County Route 610);

Thence, Northeasterly, following along the physical centerline of East Plaza (County Route 610), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of East Broad Street (County Route 509);

Proceed, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of East Broad Street (County Route 509), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of North Chestnut Street;

Thence, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of North Chestnut Street, which transitions into the physical centerline of Priscilla Lane, which is also a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Mountainside, Union County shared border and the point of beginning.

Ward Three

The Third Ward of the Town of Westfield shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the physical centerline of East South Street (County Route 610), at its intersection with a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Garwood, Union County shared border;

Thence, Southeasterly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Garwood, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Clark, Union County shared border;

Thence, Southwest, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Clark, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of Dakota Street;

Continue, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Dakota Street, to a point on the physical centerline of the Boulevard;

Proceed, Northwesterly, various courses, following along the physical centerline of the Boulevard, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Ayliffe Avenue;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Ayliffe Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Summit Avenue;

Thence, Northwest, following along the physical centerline of Summit Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Clifton Street;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Clifton Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Rahway Avenue;

Thence, Northwesterly, various courses, following along the physical centerline of Rahway Avenue, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Watterson Street;

Continue, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Watterson Street, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610);

Proceed, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610), to another point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of the Boulevard;

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of the Boulevard, to a point where said boundary intersects with the physical centerline of Ross Place;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Ross Place, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Carleton Road;

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Carleton Road, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Park Street;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Park Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Central Avenue (County Route 613);

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Central Avenue (County Route 613), to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Cacciola Place;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Cacciola Place, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Stirling Place;

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Stirling Place, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Livingston Street;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Livingston Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of East South Avenue (County Route 610);

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of East South Avenue (County Route 610), to a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Borough of Garwood, Union County shared border, which is also the point of beginning.

Ward Four

The Fourth Ward of the Town of Westfield shall include all of the territory and inhabitants thereof contained, in an area which is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border is intersected by the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad);

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of East Plaza (County Route 610);

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of East Plaza (County Route 610), to a point where said boundary intersects the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610);

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of West South Avenue (County Route 610), to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Watterson Street;

Thence, Southwest, following along the physical centerline of Watterson Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Rahway Avenue;

Thence, Southeasterly, various courses, following along the physical centerline of Rahway Avenue, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Clifton Street;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Clifton Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Summit Avenue;

Thence, Southeasterly, various courses, following along the physical centerline of Summit Avenue, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Ayliffe Avenue;

Thence, Northeast, following along the physical centerline of Ayliffe Avenue, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of the Boulevard;

Thence, Southeasterly, various courses, following along the physical centerline of the Boulevard, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of Dakota Street;

Thence, Southeast, following along the physical centerline of Dakota Street, to a point where said boundary is intersected by a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Clark, Union County shared border;

Continue, Southwesterly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Clark, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary is intersected by a point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border;

Thence, Northwesterly, various courses, following along the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border, to a point where said boundary is intersected by the physical centerline of the Conrail Central Railroad right-of-way (a railroad), which is another point on the Town of Westfield, Union County and the Township of Scotch Plains, Union County shared border and also the point of beginning.

The Town of Westfield is currently located in Legislative District Twenty-One and Congressional District Seven.
