

THREE WAYS TO VOTE

VOTE BY MAIL

Any voter may apply to vote-by-mail by completing the Application for Vote-by-Mail Ballot and returning the application to the County Clerk.

After you received and complete your Vote by Mail Ballot, return the ballot by:

- ✓ Mailing it back
- ✓ Placing it in one of Union County's 24 secure ballot drop boxes
- ✓ Returning it to Union County's Board of Elections Office by close of polls on Election Day.

IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING

This new option allows registered voters to cast their ballot in person, using a voting machine, during the designated voting period prior to Election Day. You can now choose to vote, in-person, at a time that's more convenient for your schedule.

IN-PERSON VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

The most conventional method of voting. Voters can cast their ballot on Election Day at their designated polling location. Polls are open on Election Day from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Contact our office or visit our website to find your designated polling place.

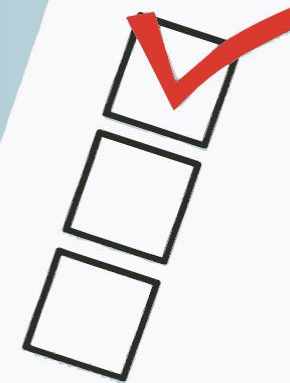

WHAT WE DO

The Union County Board of Elections is responsible for:

- ✓ Maintaining the Union County Voter File of over 353,000 voters
- ✓ Conducting elections in Union County, including the Primary Election, the General Election, School Board Elections, and Municipal Elections
- ✓ Securing, maintaining, and programming 574 voting machines and over 1,000 electronic poll books for Early Voting and Election Day
- ✓ Counting paper mail-in and provisional ballots, plus military and federal overseas ballots
- ✓ Hiring, training, and assigning over 1,800 poll workers for Early Voting and Election Day
- ✓ Coordinating over 160 polling locations for Early Voting and Election Day
- ✓ Preparing and delivering 434 Election Day supply bags
- ✓ Securing, maintaining, and collecting mail-in ballots from 24 secure ballot drop boxes in Union County



Poll workers perform essential services on Election Day, ensuring every voter's Constitutional right to vote. Poll workers:

- Must be 18 years old*
- Must be a registered voter in Union County
- Must read and write English legibly
- Must be able to get to your polling location
- Attend mandatory training when required
- *Minors who are 16 or 17 years old may also work up to eight (8) hours on Election Day

On Election Day, poll workers are required to work from 5:15 a.m. until just after the polls close at 8:00 p.m. In-person training is mandatory for first-time poll workers. Union County voters can apply to become a poll worker at ucnj.org/pollworker

Poll workers are paid \$300 for working Election Day.

IMPORTANT ELECTION DEADLINES

Primary Election Day

First Tuesday after the first Monday in June

Last Day to Change Party Affiliation

55 days before the Primary Election

Last Day to Register to Vote for the Primary Election

21 Days before the Primary Election

Early Voting Period for Primary Election

In non-Presidential years, this is the Friday through the Sunday before Primary Election Day. In Presidential years, this is the Wednesday through the Sunday before Primary Election Day. Hours are 10:00 a.m. through 8:00 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays, and 10:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. on Sundays.

General Election Day

First Tuesday after the first Monday in November

Last Day to Register to Vote for the General Election

21 Days before the General Election

Early Voting Period for General Election

Nine days of voting starting the tenth day before Election Day (Saturday) through the following Sunday. Hours are 10:00 a.m. through 8:00 p.m. on weekdays and Saturdays, and 10:00 a.m. through 6:00p.m. on Sundays.
