CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Williams presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 5:03 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed, Vice Chair Rebecca Williams, Commissioner Sergio Granados, Commissioner Christopher Hudak, Commissioner Bette Jane Kowalski, Commissioner Lourdes M. Leon, Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, and Commissioner Andrea Staten; with Chairman Alexander Mirabella and Commissioner Angela R. Garretson absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Bruce H. Bergen Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

Vice Chair Williams addressed the public:

Good evening, and welcome to another remote meeting of the Union County Board of Commissioners. My name is Rebecca L. Williams, I am the Vice Chair of the Board, and I am standing in for Chairman Mirabella tonight. Thank you all for joining us.

I want to start off by recognizing First Lady Tammy Murphy, who visited the FEMA vaccination site on Pearl Street in Elizabeth earlier this week. The County has been assisting in this operation, as part of our efforts to help ensure that eligible residents have equal access to a COVID-19 vaccine. I would like to thank First Lady Tammy Murphy and Governor Murphy for their support.

We are continuing to distribute vaccines through the Union County Vaccine Center at Kean University, and we encourage everyone to get vaccinated as soon as they are eligible and vaccines are available. We add new appointments as soon as supplies come in, so please keep checking the Vaccine Center scheduling page, at ucnjvaccine.org, for the latest updates. Meanwhile, let's all continue to protect each other, and observe the safety guidelines. Wear a mask, keep your distance, and avoid large gatherings.

Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded inquired about the additional motels being added to the Code Blue Emergency Shelter Initiative.

Director Anderson advised that several locations had been added including the Ramada Plaza Totowa, The Gateway Family YMCA, Efficiency Inn, and Travel Lodge Avenel. She added that several of the out-of-county motels would be used exclusively for COVID-19 positive cases.

- 2. Amending Resolution Number 2020-460, to reflect a grant extension of six (6) months for the 2020 Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Spending Plan for a new grant period of January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021; with no other changes. (Commissioner Sergio Granados)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq., to Ready To Go Restroom Trailers, Pittsburg, PA, for the purchase of a Shower Trailer for an amount not to exceed \$83,900.00. Commissioner Granados asked Director Anderson to elaborate on this great initiative facilitated by Chairman Mirabella.

Director Anderson advised that this campaign would provide mobile shower and laundry services for those in need, predominantly in Elizabeth and Plainfield. She added that a traveling mobile unit would be made available upon request to the other municipalities.

Commissioner Granados noted the importance of the initiative in providing such an essential service.

County Manager Oatman advised that the facility had been closed due to COVID-19 and the County was pursuing options to repurpose the facility to make it more useful, open, and inviting during this closure.

Authorizing the County Manager to utilize the County's option to extend a Concession contract: OFF Management, LLC., Roselle, NJ, pursuant to BA# 23-2018, for a Mobile Food/Ice Cream Truck for Rizzuto Park for the period of two (2) additional seven (7) month seasons of April 2021 through October 2021 and April 2022 through October 2022, in the revenue amount of \$9,828.00. (Commissioner Andrea Staten)
- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to utilize the County's option to extend the Concession contract: Maglione's Italian Ice, Iselin, NJ, pursuant to BA# 21-2018, for Mobile Food/Ice Cream Truck for Ponderosa Park, for the period of two (2) additional seven (7) month seasons, April 2021 through October 2021 and April 2022 through October 2022, in the revenue amount of \$7,025.00.
