THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2021 AGENDA SETTING MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Mirabella presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 5:03P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairman Alexander Mirabella, Commissioner Angela R. Garretson, Commissioner Sergio Granados, Commissioner Christopher Hudak, Commissioner Bette Jane Kowalski, Commissioner Lourdes M. Leon, Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, and Commissioner Andrea Staten were present; with Vice Chair Williams absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Bruce H. Bergen Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

Chairman Mirabella addressed the public:

Good evening and welcome to another remote meeting of the Commissioner Board. As always, we have a lot of ground to cover.

Let's start by congratulating the candidates who won their campaigns on Tuesday.

That includes our colleague on the Board, Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded, who will be serving her second term. We are also very proud to welcome Rahway Councilman James Baker to the Board for the first time.

Turning now to other matters, we continue to provide COVID-19 vaccines to all Union County residents age 12 and up, free of charge. Vaccination for children ages 5 to 11 has just received approval, and we will be rolling out that program shortly as well. I can't stress enough how important it is to get vaccinated.

The virus is still active, it is still deadly, and it is still on the attack. If you need a free COVID vaccine, if you need a free test, and if you need emergency food supplies and other resources, please get in touch. You can call us, email us, follow us on social media, or visit us online at ucnj.org for the latest updates.

I also want to thank everyone who participated last month's gun buyback program. Union County residents turned in more than 500 guns during a single day, on October 23. Many of these guns were in working condition and were kept around the house, which raises the possibility of theft or misuse. Thank you again, for taking this important step to reduce the risk of gun violence in our community.

I also have some good news to report about our efforts to preserve open space in Union County. We are moving ahead with the acquisition of a vacant property in Berkeley Heights, and we plan to restore it as part of the Passaic River Parkway.

I would like to thank Berkeley Heights Mayor Angie Devanney and County Manager Ed Oatman for their work in creating this rare opportunity to add more land to our public parks.

Also, I want to thank Human Services Director Debbie-Ann Anderson for her work in launching our "Fresh Start" initiative. This is a new outreach service that combines in-person guidance with a mobile laundry, shower, and restroom facility. It is the first county-based service of its kind in New Jersey. The Fresh Start program will bring essential services and additional resources to our unsheltered residents, including those left homeless due to a natural disaster or other emergency.

We also continue to support the efforts of FEMA to provide federal emergency disaster relief to those impacted by Tropical Storm Ida. FEMA has extended the deadline to apply for individual relief to December 6, so if you believe you are eligible, please visit DisasterAssistance.gov to get the process started. And, we are working with FEMA to help our residents apply for disaster-related food benefits under the D-SNAP program. We'll be announcing those details as soon as they are confirmed.

On a different note, I'm happy to report that our Sensory Friendly Theatre series continues at the Performing Arts Center in Rahway on Sunday, December 5 at 1:00 p.m. with the classic ballet "The Nutcracker." Sensory Friendly Theatre is a wonderful resource for parents with special needs children. It provides a welcoming, judgement-free space to enjoy enriching activities in a community setting. Prior to going into the business portion of this meeting, I am proud to announce that we have a very special presentation this evening. And, I would like to thank both Anjali Mehrotra and V rutti Patel for agreeing to help this Board celebrate Diwali for the very first time!

PRESENTATIONS BY THE BOARD

A presentation was made by Anjali Mehrotra, of Mountainside, Vrutti Patel of Roselle Park joined by the Board of County Commissioners in celebration of Diwali.

Anjali Mehrotra thanked the Board, in particular Chairman Mirabella and Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded, for allowing them to make this presentation in celebration of Diwali. She provided background information related to the celebration, advising that Diwali was the most important holiday in the Indian tradition and was celebrated by lighting diyas to symbolize the triumph of good over evil.

Vrutti Patel added that Diwali had become a national festival enjoyed by even non-Hindu communities. She noted that some communities observed the holiday between 2-5 days at which time homes were decorated with lights and lamps and neighbors would exchange gifts and sweets and light fireworks. Anjali Mehrotra invited the Commissioners to light their respective diyas in honors of good's victory over evil and wished everyone a Happy Diwali. Chairman Mirabella thanked Anjali Mehrotra and Vrutti Patel for their wonder presentation, noting the importance of the holiday and the Board's desire to continue this celebration annually.

Prosecutor Daniel advised that both these items related to two federal grants. He added that these items would cover the costs associated with per diem victim advocates, noting that the Department wanted to expand upon these services. He advised that the first grant would primarily cover services for victims of sexual assault, strangulation, and similar crimes. He added that the second grant focused primarily on services related to domestic violence victim witness advocates, noting that the grant would allow the department to increase training and expand resources in this area.

- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a license agreement allowing Hudson County's Public Safety Training Academy to use the Emergency Vehicle Operating Course Track at the Stamler Police Academy. (Chairman Alexander Mirabella)
