CALL TO ORDER

Chair Williams presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 6:02 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chair Rebecca Williams, Vice Chair Christopher Hudak, Commissioner Angela R. Garretson, Commissioner Bette Jane Kowalski, and Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded were present, with Commissioner James E. Baker, Jr., Commissioner Sergio Granados, Commissioner Lourdes M. Leon, and Commissioner Alexander Mirabella absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Bruce H. Bergen Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

Commissioner Kowalski asked Prosecutor Daniel to elaborate on this item.

Prosecutor Daniel advised that this item related to a one-week program conducted annually, as well as six-pop- up events throughout the year conducted in known, high-use CDS areas. He further advised that individuals attempting to purchase CDS would be apprehended by law enforcement and taken to Union County Police Headquarters where they would be offered an opportunity to enroll in in-patient and or out-patient treatment counseling through County-partner Prevention Links, adding that participation in the program would be considering relative to case disposition. He noted that while he didn't have the exact figure, there was more participation in the program this year in comparison to the previous year. He added that this program had been on-going for many years and was federally funded, with no matching grant requirements, which allowed for the continuation and expansion of this critical program at no cost to the County.

Vice Chair Hudak noted the change order and asked Director Graziano to elaborate on the increase.

Director Graziano advised that the change order was mainly a result of a recent County inspection conducted on County buildings, adding that as a result of the inspection, fire alarm systems had to be installed and or upgraded in older buildings to bring these facilities up-to-code.

Vice Chair Hudak inquired about the frequency of said inspections and whether or not the aforementioned issue arose from the most recent inspection.

Director Graziano advised that he believed this issue arose during the last inspection, adding that such inspections were conducted annually through the Department of Administrative Services. He noted that even though some buildings were not staffed 24/7, the cited improvements had to be made to incorporate the necessary fire alarms systems at these facilities.

Chair Williams asked Director Anderson to elaborate on this item.

Director Anderson advised that this item related to a partnership with the Union County Clerk's Office through which a portion of monies collected from document filing costs was placed in a trust fund account that would be subsequently used to provide various resources, including homeless case management, for documented and undocumented residents throughout Union County. She added that these funds were instrumental in providing resources relative to homeless prevention, housing alternatives, and mitigating shelter needs.

- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to approve the 2022 Union County GAP One-Time Spending Plan in the total amount not to exceed \$381,570.00 for subcontracted services to be provided during the period of August 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 and authorizing the transfer of funds among the agencies during the contract period should service needs change. Vice Chair Hudak inquired about the change order and asked Director Anderson to elaborate on the nature of the increase.

Director Anderson advised that this year the Department had over 90 in-school youth participate in work-experience programs and or mentoring services through the Youth-Forward Program. She added that this program offered good, wrap-around services that would also allow in-school youth to obtain bus passes and gain work-experience through various non-profit, County-partner organizations.

Vice Chair Hudak asked which organization facilitated the aforementioned program and asked Director Anderson to confirm that the expansion of services was related to increased participation.

Director Anderson advised that the program was initially designed to accommodate 23 participants, adding that this year there were 93 in-school youth participants. She noted that Community Access Unlimited was a County partner, adding that the program was funded through Workforce Innovation Opportunities and their partnership with Economic Development.

Vice Chair Hudak noted his approval of funding this initiative.

7.
