CALL TO ORDER

Chair Williams presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 6:01 P.M.

Chair Williams commended Clerk Joanne Rajoppi relative to her and her staff's efforts during the General Election.

1. Commissioner Baker asked Sheriff Corvelli about the number of adult detainees currently in the Union County Jail.

Sheriff Corvelli advised that there were currently 402 detainees.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a Shared Services Agreement between the County of Union and the County of Bergen for the relocation of the Union County Juvenile detainees on an as need basis for a contract period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2026 in a total amount not to exceed \$675,000.00. Commissioner Baker asked Sheriff Corvelli about the number of Union County juvenile detainees.

Sheriff Corvelli advised that there were currently 22 juvenile detainees.

Chair Williams asked Deputy County Manager Wagner to elaborate on this item.

Deputy County Manager Wagner advised that this item related to mandatory work-training for TANF clients, adding that a moratorium had been placed on these requirements due to COVID-19. She noted that as a result, funding for this program had gone unspent, further advising that she expected the moratorium to be lifted eventually and these requirements to be reinstated. She noted the importance of the cited program in getting clients ready for work-related opportunities.

6. Concurring with Resolution Number 2022-41 of the Union County Workforce Development Board's contract to Union County Vocational Technical Schools to operate the Simon Youth Academy to provide Out-of-School Youth an alternative educational program leading to a high-school diploma for the period of November 1, 2022 to December 31, 2023 under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Out-of-School Youth Grant in an amount not exceed \$333,000.00. (Chair Rebecca Lynne Williams)

Chair Williams asked Deputy County Manager Wagner to elaborate on this item.

Deputy County Manager Wagner advised that the Simon Youth Academy was a program that offered out-of-school youth with an opportunity to obtain their High School Diploma through the cited alternative education program held at Jersey Gardens Mall. She further advised that there were currently seventeen students enrolled in the program, adding that over the last five years the program had seen 48 graduates. She noted that the program was

incredibly beneficial in allowing students to make educational strides and obtain work-related experience in the mall.

Director Graziano advised that new traffic signals would be installed at the cited intersections, in addition to other miscellaneous improvements.

Commissioner Kowalski asked Director Graziano to provide an update on the renovation of the UC Dispatch Center as well as when the work would be completed.

Director Graziano advised that the renovation was going well, adding that several dispatch stations had been added and the project was moving into Phase 2. He noted that the change order partially related to a transition from part-time inspection to full-time inspection and oversight of the project. He also added that due to Hurricane Ida, additional complications arose, requiring several adjustments to the project including mitigation services, creation of new surveys for FEMA as well as raising the generators and electric panels that had been previously installed. He advised that adjustments being made as a result of Hurricane Ida were being submitted to FEMA for reimbursement. He further advised that he expected the project to be completed for the first quarter of next year.

He further advised that Roselle had just transitioned to receive full dispatch services through the U.C. Dispatch Center and that the Department was eager to incorporate more public safety agencies once space permitted. He noted several supplychain issues that resulted in delays, adding that the generator for the facility took over a year to be delivered, noting other electrical components that were still outstanding.

- 1. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with Spec Rescue International, Virginia Beach, Virginia, to provide exercise support and training to members of the Metro Urban Search and Rescue (MUSAR) Task Force from the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Region, through the 2020 UASI grant, in an amount not to exceed \$41,280.00. (Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded)
- 2. Authorizing the County Manager to accept and expend the FY2022 COPS Technology and Equipment Grant funds from the Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) to provide equipment to increase coverage on the NJ Interoperability Communications System (NJICS) in an amount not to exceed \$1,270,000.00. (Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded)

Commissioner Baker inquired about this item.

Director Moran advised that this item related to a technology grant that would allow for the expansion of the public safety radio system with a 4th location in the Western portion of the County to expand coverage. He noted that this project had been well-received by the County's municipal partners, adding that every public safety agency in Union County, excluding two municipalities, operated under one frequency. He noted that this resource continued to allow for greater connectivity between public safety agencies throughout the County.
