#### ORDINANCE FOR INTRODUCTION

839-2022 BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW ADDITIONAL FURNISHINGS, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT, NEW INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$62,381,711 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE STATE GRANTS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

The County of Section 1. "County"), State of New Jersey is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new additional furnishings, new communication and signal systems equipment, new information technology telecommunications equipment and new vehicles, including original apparatus and equipment, by and for said County, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The and acquisitions includes improvements

materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements and acquisitions described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred "purposes"), to as respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the State grants and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements and acquisitions shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall assessed against property be specially benefitted.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements and acquisitions is not a current expense of said County.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be

provided by the State grants hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$1,491,775 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. The aggregate sum of \$9,081,850 received or to be received as grants from the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the infrastructure improvements authorized in Section 4.C above.

Section 7. The sum of \$2,238,853 received or to be received as a grant from the NJDOT is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the equipment acquisition authorized in Section 4.H above.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$2,200,474, appropriated

for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said County, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$2,200,474 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 9. To finance said purposes, bonds of said County of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$48,860,534 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 10. То finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said County of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$48,860,534 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes

issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 11. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, by the County Manager and by the County Treasurer and shall be under the seal of said County and attested by the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the County Treasurer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one

time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 12. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 16.36 years computed from the date of said bonds.

It is hereby determined and Section 13. stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of said County, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said County, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, increased by this ordinance by \$48,860,534 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 14. Any funds received from private parties, the State of New Jersey or any of its agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes (other than the State grants hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of

such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 15. The County intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements and acquisitions described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the County incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the County hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 16. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the County, and the County shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property

within the County for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 17. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform provisions with the of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance full Board showing detail of the amended budget capital and program as approved the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with of Board the Clerk the County Commissioners and is available for public inspection.

Section 18. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after fi

## FIRST READING STATEMENT

Commissioner Sergio Granados, Fiscal Subcommittee Chairman, moved Ordinance Number 839-2022 for First Reading and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise same in accordance with the law. The Public Hearing and Final Reading will be held on October 6, 2022.

On a motion made by Commissioner Granados and seconded by Commissioner Kowalski, roll call showed seven members of the Board voted in the affirmative with Commissioner Garretson and Commissioner Mirabella absent.

## PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting was opened for the purpose of commenting on resolutions being offered for adoption and on any governmental issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the county.

Bruce Paterson, of Garwood, noted the prior night's UCIA meeting and inquired about the amount left over from the 2012 UCIA Correctional Facility Bonding. He

made comments relative to Ordinance No. 839-2022, adding that he intended to submit an OPRA request to access the supplemental documentation. Relative to Reso Nos. 2022-738 and 2022-771, he inquired about the flu-vaccination programs cited. Relative to Reso No. 2022-757, Mr. Paterson asked for more information relative to the space-study. Relative to Reso No. 2022-762, Mr. Paterson asked if the County had any remaining salt left over from the previous winter. He also asked how much salt was used during the previous winter and how much the County had been reimbursed by the various municipalities for their use of the County resource. Relative to Reso No. 2022-769, he inquired about the increase in funding. Relative to Reso No. 2022-774, Mr. Paterson asked if an analysis had even been done to compare election-printing costs in Union versus other counties in NJ. He also asked why additional monies were being requested for a NTE item. Relative to Reso No. 2022-779, Mr. Paterson asked for an overview of the new labor contract. Relative to Reso Nos. 2022-788 & 2022-789, he asked for an overview of both matters.

Relative to the 2012 UCIA Correctional Facility Bonding, County Manager Oatman advised that the total balance being returned was \$751.20. He further advised that the UCIA was working on clearing up old, dormant accounts that had been forgotten under the previous administration. He added that in the past year, the organization had returned approximately \$735,000 to various municipalities, including: \$448,000 to the City of Plainfield and \$65,000 to the Plainfield Board of Education; and \$223,000 to the Township of Union.

Relative to Ordinance No. 839-2022, County Manager Oatman advised that the bond appropriated \$62,381,711, but did not account for approximately \$15 million in grant monies received by the County for various projects, adding that the County was only authorizing approximately \$48 million in debt.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-738, County Manager Oatman confirmed Director Moran's earlier information and advised that 1,700 flu vaccinations were administered in 2020, with another 950 administered in 2021. He confirmed these items were timely and on-schedule for the 2022 flu season.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-757, County Manager Oatman advised that this item was related to an architectural study to determine the best use and configuration for the cited locations to maximize space and productivity.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-762, Director Graziano confirmed that some rock salt remained from the previous year, noting that \$458,000 was spent on a (NTE) contract of \$612,000. He added that costs per ton would be increasing approximately 25%, rising from \$61.53 a ton to \$79.64 a ton. He further advised that the bid specifications accounted for 10,000 tons of salt, adding that 6,900 tons had been used the previous year. He confirmed that towns involved in the County's Co-op would pay the County's rate on rock salt.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-769, Deputy County Manager Wagner advised that funding for the Area Plan Contract Spending Plan was distributed in installments. She further advised that as funding was awarded, the County would receive the monies an allocate as necessary. She added that this item related to the fourth installment of said funding.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-774, Clerk Rajoppi advised that she was not aware of any formal cost analysis/study conducted, but given her affiliation with COANJ, she could determine that Union County compared favorably in terms of election costs with counties of a similar size. She noted that election costs in Union County were comparable to costs in Middlesex County. In comparison, she noted that a County like Bergen County that had more districts incurred more costs. She confirmed that these additional charges were necessary in order to comply with the requirements of the new legislation.

Relative to Reso No. 2022-779, County Manager Oatman advised that the agreement was a 4-year contract with the usual terms governing salaries and benefits.

On a motion made by Commissioner Leon and seconded by Commissioner Baker roll call showed seven members of the Board voted in the affirmative, with Commissioner Garretson and Commissioner Mirabella absent.

2022-807 CHAIR REBECCA LYNNE WILLIAMS, COMMISSIONER ALEXANDER MIRABELLA, & THE ENTIRE BOARD: Recognizing October as Fire Prevention Month as a means to raising awareness of efforts taken to prevent losses due to fire and other life safety concerns; and further commending the City of Plainfield for hosting its annual Plainfield Fire Department's Fire Prevention Fair held on October 8, 2022.

On a motion made by Commissioner Leon and seconded by Commissioner Baker roll call showed seven members of the Board voted in the affirmative, with Commissioner Garretson and Commissioner Mirabella absent.

2022-808 CHAIR REBECCA LYNNE WILLIAMS, COMMISSIONER ANGELA R. GARRETSON, & THE ENTIRE BOARD: Recognizing the following honorees of the National Council for Negro Woman (NCNW) at their 16th Annual Harambee Breakfast on September 24, 2022: Mikki Taylor, Speakers Award; Cartayah Hawkins Reid, Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune Award; Nia Lwanga, Dorothy I. Height Leadership Award; Ruby Codjoe, Distinguished Professional Healthcare Service Award; Gwendolyn Bishop, Greater Elizabeth Area Section Award; Detective Darin Williamson, Humanitarian Award; Yolanda Eady-Perkins, Community Service Award; Aaliyah McLinton, Dr. McLeod Bethune S.T.E.M. Achievement Award.

On a motion made by Commissioner Leon and seconded by Commissioner Baker roll call showed seven members of the Board voted in the affirmative, with Commissioner Garretson and Commissioner Mirabella absent.

## **COMMISSIONER REPORTS AND COMMENTS**

Commissioner Leon reminded residents about the upcoming voter registration deadline on October 18<sup>th</sup>, and encouraged those who were not registered, to do so. She noted that residents could register online as well as register in-person at several upcoming events, including: Roselle Cultural Day on September 17<sup>th</sup> at Warinanco Sports Center; Linden September to Remember at Linden City Hall on September 24<sup>th</sup>; Elizabeth Puerto Rican Parade and Festival on September 25<sup>th</sup>; Hillside Health Fair on October 1<sup>st</sup>; and Family Fun Day for Hispanic Heritage Month on October 15<sup>th</sup>. She also noted that Union Library would be having a voter registration event on Tuesday, September 20<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Granados reminded residents that Union County would be celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15<sup>th</sup> through October 15<sup>th</sup>, adding that the month-long celebration had been kicked off earlier at Union College with alumni, professors, and staff coming together to celebrate their Hispanic heritage and the contributions made by Hispanics to their communities. Additionally, he thanked his Commissioner colleagues, residents, and other members of the Union County family for attending the annual Hispanic Heritage Flag Raising Ceremony at the Union County Courthouse in Elizabeth earlier that day. Commissioner Granados encouraged residents to participate in the various events slated for Hispanic Heritage Month, noting several activities, including: Cultural Day at Warinanco Sports Center on September 17<sup>th</sup>; Encanto Movie Night on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, and Family Fun Day at Rahway River Park on October 15<sup>th</sup>, among others. He noted that he looked forward to the month-long celebration of the diversity that makes Union County a strong place to live.

Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded noted the earlier Hispanic Heritage Flag Raising ceremony and recognized colleague Commissioners Granados and Leon for their efforts relative to the event. She noted that she was looking forward to the upcoming events scheduled for the month-long celebration, particularly the Encanto Movie Night, adding that the film was her daughter's favorite. On another note, Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded advised that the Office of Health Management would be hosting several free vaccination clinics in the upcoming weeks and would be expanding the County's COVID-19 testing schedule to include Mondays at the County's EMS Building in Roselle Park and Wednesdays at Plainfield's Performing Arts Center. Additionally, she advised that free flu shots would be made available to residents at several locations

throughout the County, starting on September 24<sup>th</sup>. She noted that the free flu shot clinics were open to all Union County residents, ages 9 and up, adding that children between the ages of 4-8 also qualified if they had previously received two flu shots in accordance with CDC guidelines. She further advised that masks were mandatory when visiting any of the County's clinics, noted that people experiencing fever, coughing, or sneezing would not be permitted on site. She added that walk-ins would be seen on a time-allowing basis. Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded also advised that residents could visit the County's Immunization Center in Elizabeth to obtain a variety of standard immunizations. She further advised that there was no income-eligibility requirement for the COVID-19 or seasonal flu vaccines through the Immunization Center, but warned that other immunizations were available strictly on an income-eligible basis. She encouraged residents to contact the Union County Immunization Center for more information.

Commissioner Kowalski thanked Commissioner Granados and Commissioner Leon for hosting an inspiring, flag-raising ceremony earlier for Hispanic Heritage month, adding that all the members of the Board were proud to participate in the event. On another note, she reminded residents about several upcoming recycling events throughout the County, including a paper shredding event at Union College in Cranford on September 17<sup>th</sup> and two Scrap Metal events on September 17<sup>th</sup>, one at the Cranford EMS building and the other in Rahway, at Rahway River Park. She added that scrap metal events would take place twice a month between April and November.

Commissioner Baker invited residents to attend and watch the upcoming Ride for Freedom event on September 18<sup>th</sup>, hosted by Rolling Thunder Inc's NJ Chapter 2. He advised that a \$10 registration fee would be charged per cycle and all benefits would go to the NJ Vietnam Veterans Memorial Foundation and the Vietnam Era Museum.

Vice Chair Hudak invited residents to participate in the free, upcoming Fall Fishing Derby for Persons with Disabilities and Special Needs on Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup> at Echo Lake Park. He advised that chairs and fishing polls would be provided at no charge, but encouraged participants to bring their own chairs and fishing polls if they preferred, adding that pre-registration was required for the event. On another note, he reminded residents about the County's annual commemoration of POW/MIA Remembrance Day, taking place on September 16<sup>th</sup> in front of the Union County Courthouse. He noted that this event provided an opportunity to honor the sacrifice of those who served our country and were prisoners of war or listed as missing in action.

Chair Williams announced that Union County would be re-establishing its Film Commission to assist film, TV, and or digital media production companies in scouting locations within Union County for their projects, adding that the County received multiple inquires and requests weekly from companies look to explore Union County for various media productions. She added that re-establishing this Commission would allow the County to maximize on the financial impacts that could result from film projects in the community, including tax incentives and state-tax credits that could reimburse up to 35% of costs for services provided by NJ businesses. Chair Williams noted the many offerings of Union County which made it an ideal place for entertainment projects.

County Manager Oatman wished Commissioner Leon a Happy Birthday.

Chair Williams asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. On a motion made by Commissioner Baker and seconded by Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded, roll call showed seven members of the Board voted in the affirmative, with Commissioner Garretson and Commissioner Mirabella absent.
