THURSDAY, OCTOBER 26, 2023 AGENDA SETTING MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Granados presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairman Sergio Granados, Vice-Chairwoman Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, Commissioner James E. Baker, Jr, Commissioner Joseph C. Bodek, Commissioner Bette Jane Kowalski, Commissioner Lourdes M. Leon, Commissioner Alexander Mirabella, and Commissioner Rebecca Williams were present, with Commissioner Angela R. Garretson absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Bruce H. Bergen Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

Chairman Granados noted the events that unfolded in Maine the previous evening, adding that these incidents underscored the important of existing gun legislation and expanding on these laws. He advised that NJ has some of the strong gun legislation, resulting in being one of the states with the lowest incidence of gun violence. PRESENTATIONS BY THE BOARD

A resolution presentation was made by the Board to representatives of the Union County Performing Arts Center (UCPAC) congratulating them on their 95th Anniversary, and further recognizing the UCPAC's contributions to the greater Union County Community since the opening night of the Bratter and Pollack's million-dollar Rahway Theatre on Tuesday, October 16th, 1928 at 7:30 PM - a gala benefit film and stage show featuring House Organist Chet Kingsbury performing on the historical Wurlitzer pipe organ.

Chairman Granados noted that the Board was honored to present a resolution to the UCPAC in honor of their 95th Anniversary. He noted that the UCPAC was an

important cornerstone of the Union County community, adding that he looked forward to having the arts continue to thrive in Union County.

UCPAC Executive Director, Diana Hunt, thanked the Board for the recognition, noting that UCPAC greatly appreciated their support and investment in the arts.

Former County Manager and UCPAC Board Member, Al Faella, read a letter authored by Colleen Gialanella thanking the Board for the recognition and their continued support of the arts and UCPAC.

Chairman Granados thanked UCPAC for their continued efforts.

Chairman Granados called upon his colleagues to join him for a special presentation.

Chairman Granados recognized Commissioner colleague, Alexander Mirabella, for 25 years of service to the County of Union. He advised that Commissioner Mirabella had served as Chairman of the Board six times during his career, noting his valuable leadership during the COVID-19 Pandemic of 2020. He noted Commissioner Mirabella's impressive career, adding that he has left a positive, lasting impact on the County of Union.

Vice-Chairwoman Palmieri-Mouded asked Director Anderson for a total of Code Blue Nights for 2022.

Director Anderson advised that 94 Code Blue Nights had been declared, adding that over 300 adults & children had been served by this initiative.

Commissioner Baker asked for an estimated increase from one year to the next.

Division of Individual and Family Support Services Division Director Christina Topolosky advised that she believed the Code Blue Nights had increased by nine nights from the prior year.

Chairman Granados asked Director Anderson to provide additional information related to this increase following the meeting.

- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with Synergex International Corporation, Gold River, CA formerly known as Unitronix Data Systems, for the provision of software License and Software Maintenance for the Department of Human Services, Division of Social Services commencing on January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 in an amount not to exceed \$164,386.76. (Chairman Sergio Granados)
- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to apply for, accept and execute the CY2024 Alcoholism/Drug Abuse (A/DA) Grant funding from the NJ Department of Human Services, Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS), for the provision of prevention education/early intervention and treatment program for medically indigent residents of Union County in the amount of \$821,308.00 with a County Cash Match requirement not to exceed \$108,561.00 for the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. He noted that after losing his younger sister, he was inspired to help his community by creating a charitable pharmacy to assist patients that do not qualify for Medicaid or Medicare and or cannot afford to purchase insurance to cover their medication costs.
