CALL TO ORDER

Chairwoman Leon presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 6:11 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairwoman Lourdes M. Leon, Vice-Chairman Joseph C. Bodek, Commissioner James E. Baker Jr., Commissioner Michèle S. Delisfort, Commissioner Sergio Granados, Commissioner Bette Jane Kowalski, Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, and Commissioner Rebecca Williams were present, with Commissioner Alexander Mirabella absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Bruce H. Bergen Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

PRESENTATIONS BY THE BOARD

A presentation was made in recognition of National Donate Life Month to Janet Zanetich, Manager of Philanthropy and Gary Mignone, Public Relations Manager of the NJ Sharing Network and the NJ Sharing Network Foundation, commending each of their efforts to support donor families, honor the legacy of those who gave the gift of life and raise awareness about the power of organ donation and transplantation.

Chairwoman Leon called upon Vice-Chair Bodek and Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded to join her for the Resolution Presentation.

Chairwoman Leon recognized the NJ Sharing Network, a non-profit organization responsible for facilitating organ and tissue donation and transplants throughout NJ. She advised that in 2024, NJ had reached a record of 297 organ donors and 743 organs translated, marking the sixth consecutive year of growth. She further advised that nearly 4,000 NJ residents were currently on the waiting list for life-saving transplants, adding that over 103,000 people were on the national waiting list. She encouraged families to talk to each other about becoming organ and tissue donors, noting that one donor had the power to save up to eight lives and enhance the lives of more that 75 others. She thanked the NJ Sharing Network and the NJ Sharing Network Foundation for their continued, critical efforts.

Janet Zanetich, Manager of Philanthropy for the NJ Sharing Network, thanked the Board for the recognition. She noted that her staff worked tirelessly to help facilitate the gift of life through organ and tissue donation as well as honor organ heroes for their incredible generosity. She advised that during the month of April, Donate Life Month, the NJ Sharing Network wanted to acknowledge and spread awareness about the organization's life-saving mission. She noted the organization's upcoming 5K Celebration of Life event on June 8th, marking the 15th anniversary of the event. She thanked the Board once again for the recognition and for the County's continued partnership.

A presentation was made to the winners of the annual Union County Arbor Day Poetry Contest. The Arbor Day Poetry Contest is held each year to encourage environmental stewardship and tree conservation among students in grades 4-8, in partnership with the Union County Shade Tree Advisory Board.

Chairwoman Leon asked Commissioner Kowalski and Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded to join her for the second presentation.

Chairwoman Leon noted that as a former educator she was proud to be able to recognize the winners of the 2025 Arbor Day Poetry Contest. She noted that in partnership with the Union County Shade Tree Advisory Board, this annual contest encouraged environmental stewardship and tree conservation among students grades 4-8.

BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Nicole DiRado, Administrator

Payne Vauxhall Meeting Center in Union Township and Berkeley Heights Municipal Building in Berkeley Heights. She also noted that for the first time, the Department would be piloting a mobile unit at Cedar Brook Park in Plainfield for early voting for the Primary Election in June.

Commissioner Baker asked Administrator DiRado to clarify the purpose of the mobile unit.

Administrator DiRado advised that the mobile unit would serve as an early voting location where residents would be able to cast ballots for the June Primary Election.
