The Director of the Department of Parks and Community Renewal is hereby further authorized to amend or modify any fee set forth in the fee schedule for special promotions and events. In the event that the Director shall asses, amend or modify any fee he shall file a notice of said assessment, amendment or modification with the Clerk of the Board and the Director of the Department of Finance, no less than five days prior to the effective date of the assessment, amendment or modification.  Freeholder 2012 Complimentary Parks Program for Union County's Active Military Service Personnel

  - ☐ Hayride & Campfire Four admission tickets for a Hay Ride & Campfire
- □ Wheeler Pool (Rahway) or Ulrich Pool (Linden) Admission for four people to a County pool
  - □ Watchung Stables Sunday Public Trail Ride for 2 people

### Public Hearing

This meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Ordinance 2012-727 only.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, asked for more of an explanation of Ordinance 2012-727. Chairman Mirabella called upon Director of Parks and Community Renewal Ronald Zuber to explain. Director Zuber explained that the Ordinance contains fee changes and the Chairman's initiatives that include a park program for Veterans, the ice skating rink, party rooms and golf carts.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, asked if the changing of fees were published in the newspaper. Director Zuber, replied, yes. He asked for the percentage of the increase in fees, and the number of the rounds of golf played in Union County.

Chairman Mirabella stated that he was uncertain as to the percentage. Mr. Buettner asked which fees were changed. Director of Golf Operations Armando Sanchez stated that the green fees have remained flat, the residence players' card went from \$40 to \$45, seniors remained flat and the non-resident fees went from \$75 to \$100. He stated that last year there was a \$2 reservation fee, which is now included in the green fee. He said there has not been an increase in green fees since 2008. Freeholder Sullivan moved Ordinance 2012-727 for Final Reading and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise same in accordance with the law.

### PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, asked how many jobs the agreement mentioned in Resolution 2012-158 will create. On Resolution 2012-167, he asked about the staff reduction. He thanked the Board for the savings in Resolution 2012-169. He asked when will Runnells Specialized Hospital break even or start making money. On Resolution 2012-172, he stated that the contract amount is three times more than it should be.

Director Taylor responded to Resolution 2012-158. It is an integrated system for Human Services and the Payroll staff, without this system additional staff would be needed to process payroll.

Director Zuber responded to Resolution 2012-167. He explained that there are two open positions in the Information Technology Department. He said professional froms Kean University will help in day to day issues and repairs.

Chairman Mirabella thanked Mr. Paterson for his kind works. He addressed Mr. Paterson's concerns about Runnells Specialized Hospital, stating that the result of the State's reimbursements is making it difficult to break even. He thanked the staff for the savings mentioned in Resolution 2012-169.

Director Graziano responded to Resolution 2012-172. He explained that the problem is not in Scotch Plains, it is the Election Board building located at 271 North Broad Street in Elizabeth. He said there was a major problem with the façade. The comices were falling due to water that was between the first and second floors when they replaced the windows. The area rotted and Netta Architects were contacted for an emergency building stabilization. It is causing a safety issue for the walking public.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, had questions regarding Resolution 2012-174. Chairman Mirabella stated that it is for a grant acceptance through the UASI Region, and could not provide this training inhouse.

Director Moran stated that Resolution 2012-174 is through the Homeland Security Grant, and is 100% federally grant funded. He explained that the cost includes air travel, lodging, food and training, and is a four day course that trains for tanker truck fires. He stated that the fire suppressant training is not offered in the Metropolitan area. He added that the recent tanker truck fire located in the Bayway section of Elizabeth requires this type of training. It was a tremendous attribute in extinguishing the fire.

Marc Rapizzi, Elizabeth, stated that he is a landlord of multi-family homes in Elizabeth. He is in support of Resolution 2012-166, stating that the Housing and Community Development Services are professional and organized and has dealt with them for ten years.

Director Zuber stated that there were two RFPs in late 2011 and early 2012 and they were not happy with the amounts. He said it is monitored by the Bureau of Housing. Director Zuber explained the process and stated that they have a high rating and they were recommended by the Housing Authority.

John Bury, Kenilworth, spoke about the lawsuits in Resolutions 2012-184, 2012-185 and 2012-186 and 2012-187, stating that they should be represented by in-house attorneys. He stated that the law firm mentioned in 2012-187 is personnel counsel.

County Counsel Barry stated that some employees are represented in-house, but there are times when there are conflicts of interest, and the County is responsible for having them defended. He stated that due to the allegations and based upon his evaluation, they are required to have their own counsel due to potential conflicts of interest. He stated that Palumbo and Renaud are not personnel council.

Tina Renna, Cranford, asked if Resolution 2012-167 is an on-going contract. On Resolution 2012-168, she which equipment needs to be repaired. In reference to Resolution 2012-169, she asked for a more detailed explanation. On Resolution 2012-173, she asked what site it refers to.

Chairman Mirabella stated that there is one addition and two vacancies in reference to Resolution 2012-167.

Director Yuska stated that in response to Resolution 2012-168, it is specific hardware, such as screw driver torks and safety screw drivers.

Director Graziano stated that in reference to Resolution 2012-173, it is the Cherry Street garage. He said the wells need to be removed, monitored and excavated. A licensed professional needs to be hired as per the Federal Government.

Administrator of Runnells Specialized Hospital Joan Wheeler stated that the savings in Resolution 2012-169, is based on negotiations. She said it is Medicare Part A State funded for residence and patients in the psychiatric unit, and is on a per diem rate.

### PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on any matter.

Dr. Rubino, Summit Council Member, asked for an emergency tax reduction cut. He asked that the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund tax be reduced by 50%, and that Union County reached its goal of 100 acres, and suggested it should go to a referendum on November ballots.

Pat (inaudible), Council of Summit, spoke about the City of Summit's high taxes. He said the residences of Summit pays more to the County budget than the City's budget. They are 4% of the population but pay 11% of the tax levy. He appreciates the shared services and welcomed the Board to Summit for their Freeholder Meeting.

Greg Casco, Westfield, stated that he is opposed to the Hawk Light on Central Avenue in Clark, and stated that there is much confusion and accidents. He said the mid-block crossing is a major problem, and made mention of recent fatalities in the location and this evening a cyclist was struck.

Lisa Alan, Summit, stated that Union County has surpassed Essex County in taxes. She appreciates the Freeholder Meetings and asked how to get information on the Budget.

Chairman Mirabella stated that the 2012 Budget has not yet been established.

John Bury, Kenilworth, stated that it is encouraging to see residences of the City of Summit in attendance. He had questions about the Unemployment Trust Fund.

Director Taylor stated that she did not have the exact balance of the Unemployment Trust Fund athand. She stated that the Trust Fund pays out to those who qualify.

Chairman Mirabella asked Director Taylor to make the information available.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, made comments about a press release in the Westfield Leader stating the Chairman's initiative is "putting people first." He asked that the Board listen to the people. He spoke about County concerts, MusicFest and the proposed family court building.

Mike Yarkosky, Union Council #8, spoke about County layoffs and urged the Board to work for creative solutions rather than having layoffs. He also said he is opposed to privatization.

Tina Renna, Cranford, spoke about position controls and County layoffs. She commented on the vehicle list for department heads. She had questions pertaining to the new courthouse project, the cost and the purchase of 10 Cherry Street in Elizabeth.

Mrs. Renna stated that there were discussions in Executive Session pertaining to MusicFest. She

said the Union County Performing Arts Center is a 501(c) (3) Corporation, and there is no access to their records. She asked about the cash monies collected at MusicFest 2010. Mrs. Renna asked how former County Manager Devanney continues to be part of MusicFest.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, commented on tax cuts and those who attended the meeting from the City of Summit.

Mr. Buettner said that he is opposed to Resolution 2012-157 and 2012-174.

### FREEHOLDER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Freeholder Wright reminded artists of Union County about the annual Union County Senior Citizens Art Exhibit, coming up in June. All Union County residents age 60 and up are invited to submit their work for consideration. You can be a professional artist, an amateur artist, or even a first-time artist. You can work in paint, pencil, clay, silkscreen, or almost any other medium.

The show will be held in June but entries must be submitted before Wednesday, May 23rd to be eligible. So don't delay - call the Union County Office of Cultural and Heritage Affairs to get our guidelines and an application form. The number is 908-352-3513.

Freeholder Estrada stated that in reference to the fire training, we are very close in proximity to gas tanks. The firefighters and the community are well-benefitted by this type of training.

Freeholder Estrada thanked the members of Council 8 for attending the meeting.

Freeholder Hudak also thanked the members of Council 8 for attending the meeting. He agreed with Freeholder Estrada about the importance of having our firefighters trained to that capacity due to our location.

Freeholder Hudak stated that in reference to the new family courthouse project, the State has required the County to make improvements to the current courthouse, which is over 100 years old to comply with modern fire codes. He stated that it is practical to construct a new family courthouse.

Freeholder Kowalski stated that she is not in favor of the previous speakers negative comments about Runnells Specialized Hospital. She stated that they have received outstanding ratings by State agencies and the Board receives many complimentary letters from families of its patients.

Freeholder Kowalski thanked and congratulated Freeholder Estrada, as Secretary Treasurer of NJAC.

Freeholder Kowalski spoke about the Civil War event that was held that day at the Courthouse.

Freeholder Jalloh thanked the public for attending the Freeholder Meeting. He commented on the City of Summit's taxes and made comments regarding the acceptance of grants, and the services the County is able to provide as a result of the grants.

Freeholder Jalloh acknowledged Black History Month, and urged the public to attend the various events that are being held throughout the County for the month of February.

Freeholder Scanlon thanked the members of Council 8 for attending the Freeholder Meeting. She commented on how much the City of Summit has received through the Open Space, Recreation, and Historic Preservation Trust Fund.

Freeholder Sullivan remarked about the family courthouse project. He said that in 1995 the courts went under the State's control. The improvements and utilities are County tax dollars. He said the State advised the County to comply to modern fire codes for the current family court located in the Tower of the Courthouse. There were many costly improvements needed. He said the County is in cooperation with the Courts to complete the new family courtroom.

Freeholder Sullivan spoke about the comments made by Summit residences. He stated that open space is the smallest part of the fund, a lot more money is spent for recreation for all the municipalities. He said the City of Summit received more money than paid.

Freeholder Sullivan spoke about the Kidde training for the firefighters. He referenced the most recent tanker truck explosion at the Bayway section of Elizabeth. He said he spoke with Mayor Bollwage and based upon the extensive training the firefighters received for this type of fire, many lives were saved as a result of this vigorous training.

Freeholder Sullivan thanked the members of Council 8 for attending the Freeholder Meeting. He said that as Chairman of the Fiscal Committee, they are working with a tax cap and Federal and State funding cuts. He stated that Runnells Specialized Hospital has been cut severely by State funding. He said they are faced with challenging times and a different budget. He hopes the public could attend more Agenda meetings where there is more dialogue between the Board and Directors.

Freeholder Carter congratulated Nicole DiRado as the new Deputy County Clerk and congratulated James Pellettiere as the new Clerk of the Board.

Chairman Mirabella stated that a very special guest will be attending the 76th Annual Union County Baseball Association Hot Stove League Baseball Dinner, Yankees pitching star Tommy John. He will be the special guest speaker honoring our outstanding student athletes. He stated that over the years, UCBA has enabled thousands of Union County boys and girls to enjoy the great sport of baseball, and the Freeholder Board is very proud to support their work. He said it is never too early to think about baseball season. The summer youth league is for 8 to 15 year olds. Chairman Mirabella gave an update on the Union County Means Business initiative. This program involves a yearlong series of networking sessions to help our business owners and managers connect with state and local resources. The kickoff session was held last week and I'm happy to report that it was booked to capacity. He said that tells us we are on the right track with a useful and effective new service.
