### MINUTES OF THE AGENDA SETTING MEETING

Chairman Daniel P. Sullivan called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Roll call showed Vice Chairman Deborah P. Scanlon, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella, Freeholder Rayland Van Blake and Freeholder Nancy Ward were in attendance. Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh and Freeholder Rick Proctor were absent.

Also present were County Manager George W. Devanney, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq. and Clerk of the Board Nicole L. DiRado.

The Prayer and Salute to the Flag were led by the Clerk of the Board.

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by the Clerk of the Board.

### PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD

Chairman Sullivan called upon Deputy Director of Parks and Community Renewal Ronald Zuber. Deputy Director Zuber stated that Director of Golf Operations Armando Sanchez and individuals from the New Jersey State Golf Association have prepared a presentation to update the Board on the Galloping Hill Golf Course and the County's relationship with the New Jersey State Golf Association (NJSGA).

Galloping Hill Golf Course and The New Jersey State Golf Association

Director of Golf Operations Armando Sanchez gave a brief overview of the golf outings, current revenue and Union County's relationship with the NJSGA. He also provided the Board with the year-to-date revenue of the golf courses and introduced the President of the NJSGA, John Murray, Executive Director Stephen Foehl and Former President Robert



Cronheim. Overall, they explained to the Board that the Memorandum of Understanding with the NJSGA states that the Galloping Hill Golf Course will be the new headquarters The presentation is attached.

Chairman Sullivan thanked them for updating the Board on the golf conditions. He stated that the Board is enormously pleased with the revenue, play and conditions of the golf courses. He stated that the agreement will be beneficial to everyone involved. He added that the Galloping Hill Golf Course Clubhouse is a premium location for a banquet facility and he also thanked KemperSports for all their work.

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Division of Emergency Management Bureau of Hazardous Materials Response

Chairman Sullivan called upon Director of Public Safety Andrew Moran for a brief overview of the accident that occurred on June 16, 2010.

Director Moran stated that on June 16<sup>th</sup> a gasoline tanker truck overturned on Bonnie Burn Road in Watchung. He stated that the First Responders, Hazmat and Public Safety Personnel were at the scene quickly. He said that they had to contain the gas leak, deal with live electrical wires, traffic and many other safety issues.

Director Moran asked Director of Emergency Management Chris Scaturo to attend the meeting to explain to the Board what happened that day.

Director Scaturo first thanked the Board for their support over the years which allows them have the proper equipment for emergencies, such as the one that happened on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

Director Scaturo stated that the tanker which overturned has a 9,000 gallon gasoline capacity which contained five compartments. This truck contained 8,500 gallons of gas. He stated the truck driver was injured and was brought to the hospital. After being released, he came back to the scene and provided information about the truck. Director Scaturo stated that the first responders were at the scene within four minutes of the call and Fire Services were also contacted. He stated that the Fire Mutual Aid Coordinator stated that there was a significant amount of gas leaking from the truck, which elevated the response. They used an absorbent boom to contain the flow and they deployed the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), (which is a nonprofit Security Grant Program, administered by the U.S. Department



of Homeland Security) which brought in help from the Township of Millburn and other in and out-of-county municipalities.

Director Scaturo explained further how they attended to the response, the action plan that was in place, grounding the tanker and the challenges they faced that day. He thanked Director of the Division Engineering, Public Works and Facilities Joseph Graziano and Director of Public Works Joseph Policay for their assistance in providing them with the essential storm drain map information.

Director Scaturo stated that he was happy to report that no one else was injured and they were successful because of their resources and personnel.

Chairman Sullivan asked for the length of time that Bonnie Burn Road was closed. Director Scaturo stated that the road was closed until 4:30 or 5:00 the next morning, which was almost twenty-four hours after the incident.

Chairman Sullivan stated that the Board was receiving updates throughout the day from Union County Police Chief Daniel Vaniska. He asked about the traffic flow during the road closure and if the driver received any summonses. Director Scaturo stated that the traffic was very heavy, especially during the rush hours and he believes that the driver received three or four summons and may have lost his job.

Vice Chairman Scanlon asked if the County will bill the trucking company for any of the costs to the County. Director Scaturo replied, yes, they will be billed for the County's and Municipality's costs and they are in the progress of getting the expenses together.

Vice Chairman Scanlon stated that she has a police radio and she commended them for the quick response and containment of the gas leak.

Freeholder Mirabella asked how the accident happened. Director Scaturo stated that to his knowledge, the truck driver was being tailgated and he was going downhill at a high speed and lost control, resulting in the overturn of the truck. He added that there were 130 people involved in getting everything under control and cleaned up.

Freeholder Mirabella commended them for a great job and their expertise and quick response was evident of how important the training and having the correct equipment and personnel bears a huge impact in these circumstances. He thanked them and congratulated them for a job well done.

### **DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE**

Lawrence Caroselli, Director

Director Caroselli thanked everyone for their thoughts and well wishes while he was out due to surgery and said he is glad to be back to work. Chairman Sullivan welcomed him back.

Chairman Sullivan asked Director Caroselli to give an update on the sale of the Bond Anticipation Notes that happened during the day.

Director Caroselli stated that they received bids from seven financial institutions. He said that they received tremendous rates. Beneficial Finance gave the best rate at .463% and Wells Fargo at .491% having a term that will begin on July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011. He said that these rates are slightly higher than last year as the market has changed. He said he was happy to report that the County has been given a AAA rating by Moody's Bond Credit Rating.

Chairman Sullivan stated that this is excellent news and it shows that financial institutions have confidence in Union County.

- 1. Authorizing the County Manager to award a contract pursuant to an RFP for Retirement Planning Services to **Economic Planning Group, Edison, New Jersey,** for the County of Union's Deferred Compensation Plan for the contract period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 at no cost to the County. **(FREEHOLDER MIRABELLA)**
- 2. Modifying the 2010 Union County Adopted Budget in the amount of \$7,000 as a result of notification received from the State of New Jersey Department of Environment Protection for a program entitled: "ARRA BSF Forestry Service Grant." (FREEHOLDER MIRABELLA)
- 3. Modifying the 2010 Union County Adopted Budget in the amount of \$4,500 as a result of notification received from the State of New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety for a program entitled: "State Facilities Education Act (SFEA) Grant." (FREEHOLDER MIRABELLA)
- 4. Modifying the 2010 Union County Adopted Budget in the amount of \$1,262,769 as a result of notification received from the New Jersey Department of Labor for a program entitled: "ARRA Workforce Investment Act." (FREEHOLDER MIRABELLA)



Freeholder Mirabella asked for an explanation of item #4. Director Caroselli stated that it is to provide summer youth employment and Director of Human Services Frank Guzzo could give a more in depth explanation.

Director Guzzo stated that the purpose is for youth programs to provide summer employment opportunities countywide for approximately 350 youths ages 17-24 that reside in households currently receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) benefits.

5. Modifying the 2010 Union County Adopted Budget in the amount of \$401,038 as a result of notification received from the New Jersey Department of Labor for a program entitled: "Work First New Jersey." (FREEHOLDER MIRABELLA)

Freeholder Mirabella said he was happy that Director Caroselli was able to attend the Freeholder Meeting in person, rather than via webcam.

Freeholder Mirabella asked if items #2 through #5 are for the acceptance of "new" grants. Director Caroselli replied that the ARRA grants mentioned in items #2 and #4 are the first time the County is receiving these types of grants.

### **DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES**

Frank Guzzo, Director

- 1. Authorizing the County Manager to award the amount of not to exceed \$1,262,769 for Workforce Investment Board recommended youth programs to provide summer employment opportunities for the grant period of July 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010 to youth aged 17-24 that reside in households currently receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families benefits. {Federal funding: \$1,262,769} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)
- 2. Amending Resolution Nos. 2010-418 and 2010-424 both dated May 13, 2010 to extend PY 2009 Work First New Jersey contracts for three months ending September 30, 2010. This request is to further increase the amount of funding by an additional amount of \$401,038 for the continuation of services under the PY 2009 New Jersey Department of Labor & Workforce Development/Work First New Jersey Welfare to Work Program. This resolution would further authorize the County Manager to transfer funds among the listed agencies during the contract period should service needs change and/or if any of the listed agencies fails to meet its contractual obligations. {Federal funding: \$401,038} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)
- 3. Amending Resolution 2009-562, which authorized a contract with the **U.S. Department** of Health and Human Services, Division of Unaccompanied Children's Services. The federal agency and County Department of Human Services recommend that the



number of guaranteed secure beds be reduced temporarily to five with access to fifteen additional beds on a space available basis for a total of twenty beds. This temporary reduction is effective for a three month period beginning July 1, 2010 thru September 30, 2010. {Federal funding: \$180,000} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)

- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with **Union County College, Cranford, New Jersey,** in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 for the operation of a summer youth educational/occupational training program to in-school and out-of-school youth aged 17-21 during the summer months of July and August that will lead to a Workforce Investment Act recognized certificate and/or provide career awareness and career exploration information. {Federal funding: \$150,000} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)
- 5. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with **PROCEED, Inc.,** Elizabeth, New Jersey, for the provision of comprehensive support and case management services to approximately one hundred eligible youth aged 17-21 for the contract period of July 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010 in an amount not to exceed \$75,000. {Federal funding: \$75,000} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)

Freeholder Ward asked Director Guzzo to explain to the Board the difference between items #4 and #5. Director Guzzo stated that item #5 is a contract with PROCEED, Inc. to provide recruitment and assessment for 100 kids which is part of a summer program that is needed year-round.

Director Guzzo explained that item #4 (after the recruitment and assessment as mentioned in the explanation of item #5) is for retail and sales customer training to provide the kids with a career path.

Freeholder Ward asked if the students will be compensated. Director Guzzo stated that they will be paid a stipend of \$5.00 per hour; essentially they will be paid to learn.

- 6. Amending Resolution No. 2010-279, to award an additional \$31,628 in State Welfare to Work and Work First New Jersey grant funds for the contract period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 to Veolia Transportation Services, Inc., Oak Brook, Illinois, for the continued provision of the Rahway to Plainfield Welfare to Work Shuttle service. {State funding: \$31,628} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)
- 7. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with the **Clark Board of Education**, **Clark**, **New Jersey**, to provide comprehensive year round youth program that will include a paid summer work experience component in an amount not to exceed \$24,000 {Federal funding: \$24,000} (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)

Vice Chairman Scanlon asked who is eligible for the Program mentioned in item #7. Director Guzzo stated that the Program provides services for kids with disabilities and



the Clark Board of Education has done a very good job providing this service. He said that he believes it is for ages 16-18, but will make certain and get back to the Board. Freeholder Mirabella asked if the Township of Clark administers the Program for kids throughout the County. Director Guzzo replied, yes, they do.

8. Amending Resolution No. 2010-56, to change the time period of the "Social Services for the Homeless American Recovery & Reinvestment Act" only from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 to January 1, 2010 through September 30, 2010. Subcontracts under the Social Services for the Homeless and American Recovery & Reinvestment Act funding source would be for a nine month period. All other stipulations reflected in the original and amended resolutions remain the same. (FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI)

Deputy Director of Parks and Community Renewal Ronald Zuber represented the Department.

- 2. Amending Resolution No. 2009-770, a contract with **William Kubal, Bolington, Illinois,** for on-site and follow-up instructions on HUD'S Integrated Disbursement and Information System for the contract period of September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2010 in an additional amount of \$11,500 for a new total amount of \$29,000. (VICE CHAIRMAN SCANLON)
- 3. Amending Resolution No. 2009-436, (BA. #32) a bid award to **Tuckahoe Sand and Gravel, Inc., Pleasantville, New Jersey,** to increase the funds from \$39,060 to \$46,872 for the rehabilitation of current bunkers and construction of new bunkers at the Galloping Hill Golf Course. (VICE CHAIRMAN SCANLON)
  - Freeholder Mirabella asked for an explanation for item #3. Deputy Director Zuber called upon Director of Golf Operations Armando Sanchez to explain. Director Sanchez stated that they ran out of sand to construct the bunkers at the Galloping Hill Golf Course and the current bid allowed them to purchase more sand to continue the project.

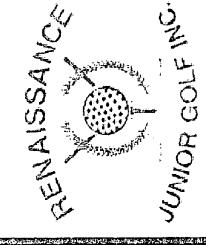

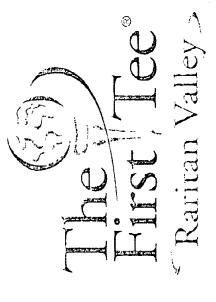

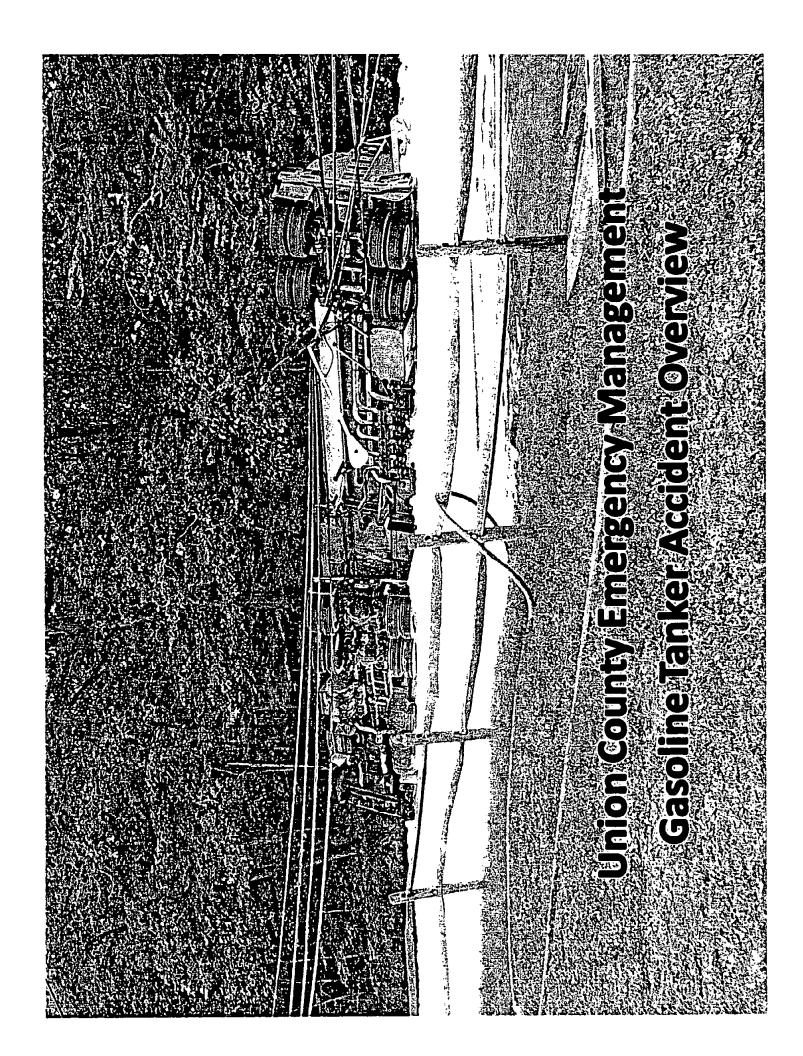
