The Office was represented by County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq.

1. Authorizing the County Manager to apply for and accept grant funding in the amount of \$50,013 from the State of New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice for the period of October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011 in order to continue to enhance services to victims of sexual assault in Union County. There is a County match in the amount of

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\$14,664 required. {Federal funding: \$50,013; County match: \$14,664} **(CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN)**

2. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a professional services agreement with **Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners** to serve as independent contractors for the County of Union SART/SANE Program for the contract period of October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011 in the amount of **\$64,677**. {Federal funding: \$50,013; Match funding: \$14,664} (CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN)

Vice Chairman Scanlon stated that she was under the impression that item #2 had already been adopted by the Board at the last Freeholder Meeting. Mr. Barry indicated that he would research the issue and get her an answer.

DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

M. Elizabeth Genievich, Deputy County Manager / Director

Freeholder Mirabella asked if the County has used the vendor mentioned in item 1 "b" in the past, and how often they were used in the past three years for snow removal services. Director Graziano responded and said that last year they were used many times, especially in the City of Summit and the Township of Berkeley Heights, but the two winters prior, they were not used at all.

Freeholder Jalloh asked if item "1b" is at a competitive rate. Director Graziano responded. He stated that it is a competitive rate on a need only basis.

Freeholder Mirabella asked to verify if item "1b" is on a need only basis. Director Graziano replied, yes, the County will pay for services, only if it is used.



- c. <u>Department of Engineering, Public Works and Facilities, Division of Facilities Management:</u> **Elevator Maintenance Corporation, Kearny, New Jersey,** to provide elevator maintenance and repair services for 20 elevator locations throughout the County of Union for the period of January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012 in an amount not to exceed \$581,200.

Freeholder Mirabella asked if we have a relationship with other counties or just Somerset County, referring to item #2. He also asked how the County will benefit from the agreement.

Director of the Division of Purchasing stated that Somerset County is the largest county-initiated Cooperative Pricing System and will be used as a back-up. Freeholder Mirabella asked if the agreement is reciprocal. Director Yuska stated that the Director of Purchasing in Somerset County had established the Cooperative Pricing System 20 years ago and will not need Union County to reciprocate. Freeholder Mirabella asked Director Yuska if there has been research in the other 20 counties in the State. Director Yuska stated that he is a member of the New Jersey Association of County Purchasing Agents and he keeps up with other County's bids. He stated that Morris County has the system, but there is a cost of \$1,000 to use it.



- 3. Authorizing County Manager to enroll various County departments, agencies and employees in professional organizations and associations in an amount not to exceed \$135,000. (CHAIRMAN SULLIVAN)
