Advanced Counterfeit Driver License Recognition Thursday, November 14, 2019 -- 9AM to 4PM

Instructor: Joseph Vasil, Vasil I.D. Training LLC

This comprehensive, one-day "hands-on advanced course is designed to assist law enforcement officers with the growing trend in the use of fraudulent driver licenses, and take the officer to the next level of document fraud detection. In 2016 the US Department of Homeland Security identified 16 different U.S. driver licenses produced overseas that are considered HIGH QUALITY COUNTERFEITS. This course will focus in on those 16 states. These authentic-looking "modern day" credentials that are available online have compromised nearly every security feature on their ID's making them virtually "undetectable and more sophisticated than ID Chief" counterfeits of a few years ago. This course will instruct law enforcement officers the proper ID protocol to detect/identify these fraudulent ID's from all 16 states. Officers will be able to handle genuine and counterfeit ID's side by side for comparison. Instruction will include methods to detect counterfeit driver licenses from all 50 states as well as International Driving Permits, and Mexican ID'S. Special instruction includes how to detect the latest intel in altered driver licenses. Instruction will include appropriate 2C statutes. The course materials are updated weekly to include the latest counterfeit Drivers Licenses. The course materials include a free UV light, magnifier and reference guide, and "cheat sheets" to recognize counterfeit licenses from New Jersey, Pennsylvania and New York and one additional cheat sheet of the state your choice.

10.0 PATROL TACTICS

Advanced Latent Fingerprint Comparisons (3)

Monday through Friday, October 21-25, 2019 -- (FIVE DAYS) 9AM to 4PM at Union County Sheriff's Office Training Center, 5 Elizabethtown Plaza (7th Floor), Elizabeth

Instructors: Union County Sheriff's Office: Sergeant David Krill and Detective Adrian Gardner

This 40 hour course is designed for law enforcement personnel who examine and compare latent prints. This course will advance the examiner to comparisons of more complex prints. Practical exercises will accompany each lecture to reinforce the covered topics and a majority of the class will be spent examining and comparing latent prints. Examiners will use magnifying loops as well as comparison software during the class. It is required that prospective students have completed a basic comparison class and have some experience with fingerprint comparisons. Topics of Discussion includes: ACE-V Methodology; sufficiency decisions; palm print comparison; overlay impressions; tonal reversals; and distortion.

12.0 CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION

"Ambush Stress:" Stress Management for Law Enforcement in the 21st Century Tuesday/Wednesday, December 3-4, 2019-- (TWO DAYS) 9AM to 4PM

Instructor: Detective Frank Matthews, New York Police Department (ret.)

This two-day course is designed specifically for the unique needs of law enforcement personnel and will teach the attendees the skills necessary to optimize the management of their stress level in their professional and personal lives. Learn the positive and negative effects of the human "Stress Response" on the modern Law Enforcement Officer, including: how to deal with the continuous threat of ambush (the most extreme level of stress); how to maintain the optimal level of stress arousal and remain in "The Tactical Zone"; why excessive use of force is linked to hyper stress and discover how to prevent it; how to achieve enhanced situational awareness through stress management; how to identify, address, and manage the debilitating and unique stressors of a career in Law Enforcement. Attendees will be taught proven tactics, and hands-on methods, to manage and mitigate stress. This training is facilitated by decorated NYPD Detective Frank Matthews, who has served as a respected Stress Management educator at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital for over 18 years.

1.0 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT; 10.0 PATROL CONCEPTS

Anti-Smuggling / Anti-Terrorism

Tuesday, November 12, 2019 -- 9AM to 4PM

Instructor: Daun White, Supervisory Special Agent, Homeland Security Investigations

This class will begin with an introduction to the way the DHS/ICE and CBP targets the smuggling of contraband into the United States. Class discussion will demonstrate how electronic intelligence collected by the DHS/ICE and CBP can be used by other law enforcement agencies to assist in broadening the scope of their investigative cases. Also discussed will be various methods of concealment used by smugglers within sea cargo, air cargo, and the air passenger environment. Threats to the law enforcement officer from the smuggling of chemical, biological and nuclear weapons will also be addressed.

10.0 PATROL CONCEPTS; 14.0 DOMESTIC TERRORISM / HOMELAND SECURITY

Arrest, Search & Seizure

Monday, September 16, 2019 -- 9AM to 4PM

Instructor: Assistant Prosecutor Julie Peterman, Union County Prosecutor's Office

This course will explore recent developments in the area of arrest, search and seizure, as applied in the state of New Jersey. The search and seizure component of the course will emphasize the developments in automobile searches in New Jersey, as well as other recent court decisions. The arrest component of the course will address recent New Jersey decisions on arrest practices and Miranda requirements. Because this course involves a case law update, it is recommended for law enforcement officers of any experience level seeking information on how recent decisions from New Jersey courts affects how they do their jobs.

This course is the morning session of the full-day NARCOTICS I course. Seats for the morning session will be assigned as available once the NARCOTICS I course registration is finalized.

Autism Spectrum Disorder:

Police Officer Strategies for Interaction, Response & Safety

Monday, December 16, 2019 -- 9AM to 3PM

Instructors: Adrienne Robertiello, Autism Educator, Children's Specialized Hospital
Officer Joseph Carratella, Elizabeth Police Department

The CDC estimates the current prevalence of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in the United States at 1 in 68, with New Jersey reported as having the nation's highest rate at 1 in 45. It is critical that officers have ample knowledge of ASD as they are likely to encounter those with the disorder in the course of public safety efforts, crime prevention and response, and general community interactions. This course supplements the *New Jersey Developmental Disabilities Awareness Training for NJ First Responders* which is mandated by Public Law 2008, Chapter 80. Participants will obtain comprehensive information about individuals with ASD including communication, social skills, sensory issues, unpredictable responses, meltdowns, self-injurious behaviors, aggression, reduced understanding of danger, and more. The presenters will provide strategies for interacting and responding to calls related to those who may have this disorder, methods to address safety challenges, and tools to develop community relationships to aid in the prevention of negative outcomes and injuries. Topics will include recognizing characteristics of ASD; personal and community safety; modified response techniques; neglect, abuse, bullying, and harassment; crisis intervention; transportation, travel, and vehicular safety; medical emergencies; search and rescue, and emergency management.

Basic Internal Affairs Training presented by Law Enforcement Solutions LLC Tuesday through Thursday, September 3-5, 2019 --

(THREE DAYS) -- 8AM to 4PM

Instructors: Law Enforcement Solutions LLC

The Basic Internal Affairs Training is a three-day course developed for county and municipal police departments. The course will provide comprehensive instruction in all aspects of the internal affairs function and the Attorney General's Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures. All county and municipal police officers recently assigned to the internal affairs function should attend. Veteran investigators may also benefit from the course. About the instructors: Dermot O'Grady retired from the Division of Criminal Justice as an assistant attorney general following 27 years of service. Mr. O'Grady served as deputy director in DCJ, acting county prosecutor and director in the Office of State Police Affairs. Mr. O'Grady is a co-author of the Attorney General's Internal Affairs Policy and Procedures. Lawrence Evans retired from the New Brunswick Police Department as a Captain following 25 years of service. Mr. Evans also served for 15 years with the Division of Criminal Justice. He left in 2017 after serving as administrator of the Police Training Commission.

Basic Spanish II for Law Enforcement/
Patrol Officer Encounters With The Latino Community
Tuesday/Wednesday, October 1-2, 2019 -- (TWO DAYS) 9AM to 4PM

Instructors: Police Officer Hans Noriega, Plainfield Police Department PO Gilbert Martinez, Franklin Township Police Department

PREREQUISITE: Basic Spanish I for Law Enforcement/Patrol Officer Encounters With The Latino Community

PRE-COURSE WORK: Students should review prior material before class.

This two-day course is a continuation to the Law Enforcement Encounters With The Latino Community/Basic Spanish I course. It is designed to provide students with the opportunity to review and explore more in detail the materials provided in Basic Spanish I, with an emphasis on the correct pronunciation and use of key phrases used in a wide variety of scenarios.

Additionally, students will spend the majority of class time dealing with scenarios in Spanish which will challenge students to control and handle simple calls for service.

Bias Crime

A bias incident can affect an entire community. Because the investigation and prosecution of bias crime is a top priority, law enforcement officers must be especially trained to detect, report, and intervene when a bias crime occurs. This course is designed to assist both the patrol officer and detective with an understanding of what constitutes a bias crime, the surrounding legal issues, past and pending legislation, the patrol response, investigative methods, intelligence gathering, reporting requirements, organized hate groups and responding to the needs of the victims and community.

Bloodstain Pattern Analysis I

Libra Forensic Consulting

This 40-hour course is designed for any officer or technician involved in criminal or forensic investigations. The course will allow the attendee to demonstrate knowledge of the terminology, history, science and mathematics surrounding bloodstain pattern analysis. The objectives of this course follow the requirements of the International Association of Bloodstain Pattern Analysis and the IABPA approves our course.

12.0 CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS

Case Law Update for Canine Handlers

Friday, September 27, 2019 -- (HALF DAY) 9AM to 12 Noon

Instructors: Assistant Prosecutor Julie Peterman, Union County Prosecutor's Office Sergeant Brian Howarth, Union County Sheriff's Office

This course is part of the training for canine handlers and is sponsored by the Union County Sheriff. The course includes instruction on recent search and seizure cases, as well as a review of cases that apply specifically to canine handlers in the context of narcotics investigations, other criminal investigations, correctional facilities, explosives and school searches. The course is designed to give canine handlers a thorough understanding of case law so that when they are called for assistance, they can effectively assess the legality of using a canine partner to participate in the investigation. Past attendees include officers from the New Jersey State Police, the New Jersey Department of Corrections, the Federal Park Police (assigned to patrol Liberty State Park), and dozens of county and municipal officers.

5.0 LEGAL REQUIREMENTS OF ARREST, SEARCH, SEIZURE, EVIDENCE, & USE OF FORCE; 10.0 PATROL CONCEPTS

Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) Course - Intermediate and Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst (CCPA) Course - Advanced

Monday through Friday, July 15-19, 2019 -- 8:30AM to 4:30PM

NOTE: It is strongly recommended that students attending this course complete the Cellebrite Mobile Forensics Fundamentals (CMFF) course or test out prior to attending.

These two courses -- the two-day intermedia level Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) course and the three-day advanced Cellebrite Certified Physical Analysis (CCPA) Course -- will be held back-to back.

The two-day Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) course is an intermediate level certification program which builds on the concepts from the CMFF course. This course is designed for those participants tasked with extracting data in a forensically sound manner using UFED Touch or UFED 4PC. This course aims to teach data extraction team members such as technically savvy investigators, digital forensic examiners, IT staff, internal affairs investigators, first responders and personnel designated to handle extraction of digital evidence how to perform extractions on a variety of devices. These extractions include logical, file system and physical extractions from mobile devices as well SIM cards, and external storage such as SD cards. Participants in this course will gain a basic understanding of how to open the extractions in Physical Analyzer software, conduct basic searches and how to create bookmarks and reports. The CCO course topics include Forensic Handling of Mobile Devices, to recognize legal considerations for seizing and searching devices, identify evidence handling procedures on scenes involving mobile devices, use UFED Phone Detective to identify a specific mobile device, recognize various locking mechanisms found on mobile devices, and practice applying best practices when seizing devices to a mock scenario; UFED Touch and UFED 4PC, including the components for the UFED Touch and UFED 4PC, how to license UFED technology; and update the firmware, Install UFED 4PC, and Configure UFED Touch and/or UFED 4PC; Cellebrite Extraction Methodology to Identify best practices for digital forensic extractions, Practice forensically sterilizing media, Complete SIM card extractions using UFED Touch/4PC, Conduct SD card extractions in a forensically sound manner, Use the UFED Touch/4PC and Physical Analyzer to conduct device extractions, Complete the removal of a passcode from a locked device using UFED Touch/4PC, and Describe how to use UFED Camera Services; Introduction to Analyzing User Data including Basic Physical Analyzer Configuration, Open extractions with Physical Analyzer, View data in Physical Analyzer, and Learn to bookmark items of interest; Reporting on Technical Findings including the fundamental elements of a report, reporting options within UFED Physical Analyzer, and creating a report based on evidentiary items.

Participants are offered an optional certification examination at the conclusion of class. Successful completion of the exam results in a Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) certification credential.

Successful course completion without attempting or passing the optional exam and skill challenge results in a certificate of attendance.

Attaining the CCO certification credential, while optional, is a prerequisite for taking the Cellebrite Certified Mobile Examiner (CCME) test.

Demonstration of mastery of these concepts is one of the prerequisites for students desiring to take the Cellebrite Certified Mobile Examiner (CCME) certification examination.

Students considering the CCME certification credential are also required to complete the Cellebrite Mobile Forensic Fundamentals (CMFF) course or Cellebrite Mobile Forensic Fundamentals (CMFF) Test Out Option and the Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst (CCPA) course.

NOTE: It is strongly recommended that students attending the three-day Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst (CCPA) course complete the Cellebrite Mobile Forensics Fundamentals (CMFF) course or test out, as well as the Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) course prior to attending.

The three-day Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst (CCPA) course is an advanced level program designed for technically savvy investigators, digital evidence analysts and forensic practitioners. As this course focuses on the analysis and advanced search techniques using UFED Physical Analyzer, participants will not be conducting extractions from devices in this course. UFED Physical Analyzer software will be used extensively to explore recovered deleted data, database contents, advanced search and analysis techniques, verification and validation, and reporting. The CCPA course content includes UFED Physical Analyzer Overview, including Installation of the Physical Analyzer and Translation Package; licensing options, and configuring, opening extractions, and view data in Physical Analyzer; Android Overview and Analysis including its history, understanding its popularity, Android hardware, the OS and file system, key aspects of Android security, and the value of Android to investigators; iOS Overview and Analysis including the history of Apple iOS, understanding its popularity, Apple hardware, the Apple iOS and file system, and key aspects of Apple iOS security, and the value of Apple iOS to investigators; Advanced Functions including using the Open > Advanced function, Analyzing location information, Using the translation function, Wear Leveling and Garbage Collection, Conducting a byte search and manually bookmark data, Conducting searches for 7-Bit, and Using RegEx (regular expression) searches; Verification and Validation including verification and validation of data decoded within the Physical Analyzer tool; Plug-Ins and Chain Manager including its capabilities; Reporting of Technical Findings including reporting options within UFED Physical Analyzer, and Creating a report based on evidentiary items.

Participants are offered an optional written examination and a practical skills test at class conclusion.

Successful class completion without attempting or passing the optional examination and skills test results in a Cellebrite Physical Analyst Certificate of Completion.

Successful completion of the Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst (CCPA) examination and practical skills test results in a Cellebrite Certified Physical Analyst Certification credential.

Demonstration of mastery of these concepts is one of the prerequisites for students desiring to take the Cellebrite Certified Mobile Examiner (CCME) certification examination. Students considering the CCME Certification credential are also required to successfully complete the Cellebrite Mobile Forensic Fundamentals (CMFF) course or Cellebrite Mobile Forensic Fundamentals (CMFF) Test Out Option and the Cellebrite Certified Operator (CCO) course.

Reports of missing and/or abducted children can be among the most difficult, challenging and emotionally charged cases experienced by an officer or an agency. This course is designed to assist patrol officers, detectives and supervisors with their response to an investigation of missing or abducted persons. The main focus of the course is that of a missing and/or abducted child. This course will cover patrol officer, detective and supervisor responsibilities during the initial response, AMBER Alert, the role of the Child Abduction Response Team (CART), interviewing, neighborhood canvass, roadblock canvass, search, recovery, sources of information and includes three abduction case studies. This course will also provide law enforcement with information to assist with the investigation and search for missing persons with special needs including Autism, Alzheimer's and Dementia.

Certain police procedures carried out as part of normal investigations, police stops and questionings can easily be misunderstood by citizen residents, and can therefore result in confrontation and dispute. These misunderstandings in turn can escalate into various levels of criminal offenses which otherwise were not the purpose of the original stop and investigation. In 1999, amidst a national controversy surrounding events much like today's headlines about Ferguson, North Carolina, and Miami, Union County Human Relations Commissioners agreed that steps needed to be taken to forestall these scenarios from occurring whenever possible. In Spring 2000, the Union County Human Relations Commission and law enforcement community piloted the four-session Police & Teens Together (PATT) Program, and since then have delivered it at every Union County high school with excellent results and documented success. The simple format provides an open forum for teens and police to share concerns and upsets, ask questions, exchange viewpoints, and "trade places" in a dynamic role play scenario that delivers impactful results in a fun-filled educational setting, with the benefits of the students sharing their "lessons learned" with classmates, friends and family. Officers who deal with juveniles, community policing and school resource officers are invited to learn how to implement this user-friendly program in your high schools, to increase the level of respect and cooperation and add "voices of reason" that can be heard in your schools and community.

Directions to the Academy

GSP Traveling South

Take Parkway exit #135. Bear right down the ramp onto Central Avenue.

Turn left at the first light (Raritan Road in CLARK).

Turn right onto Lake Avenue.

Turn left onto Raritan Road/Scotch Plains. (Center for Hope Hospice is on your left.)

About 1/4 mile up, enter the Union County Vo-Tech campus by turning left into the first driveway (located immediately past the School Administration building.)

Location of the Police Academy on the UC Vo-Tech Campus

The campus has a one-way traffic pattern.

Enter the campus by turning left into the driveway (located to the left of the school buildings).

Continue straight through the parking lot all the way to the back.

Turn right. Drive behind all of the buildings into the main parking lot on the opposite side.

As you emerge into the main parking lot, the Police Academy is the stand-alone building on your left.

Please park in the YELLOW LINED parking spaces closest to the Police Academy.

GSP Traveling North

Take Parkway exit #135. Stay left to go UNDER the overpass.

Bear right onto Central Avenue.

Turn left at the first light (Raritan Road in CLARK).

Turn right onto Lake Avenue.

Turn left onto Raritan Road/Scotch Plains. (Center for Hope Hospice is on your left.)

About 1/4 mile up, enter the Union County Vo-Tech campus by turning left into the first driveway (located immediately past the School Administration building.)

Follow the bold directions above to the Academy.

Route 22 East or West

Take the Terrill Road exit off of Route 22 (Sears is your landmark). Continue on Terrill for several miles. Terrill Road bears to the left and becomes Raritan Road.

The Union County Vo-Tech campus entrance driveway is approximately a half-mile down on the right (immediately past the front of the main Union County Vo/Tech School buildings.) Follow the **bold directions** above to the Academy.

Route 78 East or West

Take Berkeley Heights/Scotch Plains exit #41.

From 78 Eastbound: At the top of the ramp, make a left at intersection (Drift Road).

From 78 Westbound: At the top of the ramp, make a right onto Drift Road.

At the traffic light (Bonnie Burn Road), turn right.

Go to second traffic light and bear right, which will take you over the Route 22 overpass.

(If you miss the turn, follow Route 22 directions above.)

At the bottom of the overpass, bear right onto Park Avenue.

Proceed straight for about three miles, following the road to as it curves to the left.

From Route 22 East

Turn RIGHT onto Jefferson Avenue. You will be in the Home Depot parking lot. Follow the road around to the right rear of the building. The range will be directly in front of you, in the rear right corner.

From Route 22 West

From Newark, take Route 22 WEST through Hillside into Union.

As you move further into Union, the cement median on your left will be replaced by a center isle with various businesses.

When you see the IHOP in the center isle, be sure to get into the left lane.

Immediately but safely proceed into the right lane.

Turn RIGHT onto Jefferson Avenue. You will be in the Home Depot parking lot.

Follow the road around to the right rear of the building.



A Brief History of the John H. Stamler Police Academy

Since July 1986, the Union County Police Chiefs Association forged a "Unique Partnership" with the Union County Prosecutor's Office in the overall operation of the Police Academy. This enabled broader opportunities for the basic and in-service training programs, and ensures maintaining the highest standards of training, competence and professionalism. It is the totality of this "Unique Partnership" that produces successful law enforcement officers to protect and serve our citizens, and provides continual education to assist them in honing

In March 1989, construction began on a permanent home for the Police Academy, located on the grounds of the Union County Vocational-Technical School in Scotch Plains. The present state-of-the-art facility was dedicated on November 18, 1991, and named the John H. Stamler Police Academy of Union County, in honor of the late Prosecutor whose vision and determination served as the catalyst for bringing this project to fruition.

The new Academy officially opened its doors for operation and greeted the members of the 66th Session of the Basic Police Training Class on January 31, 1992. The Academy is offered without a fee to all Union County law enforcement agencies.
