First Assistant Prosecutor Tim Isenhour represented the Office.

There were no questions or comments from the Board.

Authorizing the County Manager through, the Office of the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to apply for and accept funding from the State Office of Victim Witness Advocacy for the STOP Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Program in the amount of \$25,999, requiring a county match of \$8,666 for the period of June 16, 2017 through May 31, 2018. - 2. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to purchase humidifiers for the UCPO Laboratory from Reiner Group, Inc. of Fair Lawn, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$30,785.00. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Office of the Prosecutor's Office, to apply for and accept funding from the Division of Criminal Justice, State Office of Victim Witness Advocacy for the project entitled Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Grant Program from the period of January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017 in the amount of \$98,544. A county match of \$24,636 is required. The total project amount is \$123,180. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

1. Authorizing a payment to Brown & Brown, County General Insurance Agent of Record, to renew the Livestock Mortality Policy with Great American Assurance Company, Cincinnati,

Ohio, to cover death of horses due to unforeseen circumstances from February 24, 2017 through February 23, 2018 in an amount not to exceed \$1,725.00. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Vice Chairman Granados inquired if any horses have died while having this policy.

Director Yuska advised that no horses have died.

Director Yuska advised that at the January 29th Regular Meeting, he provided the Board with an incorrect number of exclusionary employees affected by the resolution adjusting the non-contractual salary ranges, and advised that there were 520 employees affected.

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Ron Charles, Director

1. Amending Resolution Number 2016-331, in an additional amount of \$469,268.21 for the purpose of relocating approximately forty (40) Union County adult inmates to Essex County Correctional Facility during construction phase in an amount not to exceed \$1,969,268.21. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Vice Chairman Granados inquired how long the construction phase was going to take.

Director Charles advised that they are on schedule for an April completion date.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Amy Wagner, Director

1. Authorizing the County Manager to renew a contract with All Covered, a division of Konica Minolta Business Solutions, Cherry Hill, NJ, through the competitive contracting process (RCCP 2013-2), to provide the necessary technical support for the networks, servers and computer system throughout the County of Union for the 2017 calendar year, in an amount not to exceed \$281,580. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Freeholder Mirabella inquired as to the responsibilities/assistance this vendor would provide to the County's Bureau of Information Technology (IT).

Director Wagner advised that this firm provides 24 hour monitoring and maintenance of the 75 servers throughout Union County. She advised they also provide one on-site staff member to assist the County's IT personnel.

Freeholder Hudak inquired as to the amount of last year's contract, and if the County spent the full amount allotted.

Director Wagner advised that the amount is identical to last year's contract, and that the County utilized the full amount.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to award a contract to the Union County Economic Development Corporation, to provide General Economic Development Services to Private

Businesses in Union County, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

3. Authorizing the County Manager to award a contract to the Union County Economic Development Corporation to provide procurement training/technical assistance to private businesses within the County of Union for the period of January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Freeholder Jalloh asked for additional information/clarification.

Director Wagner advised that this resolution would offer procurement training for those businesses wanting to do business with governments. She advised that they provided service to 89 clients and \$160 million in government contracts were awarded, noting that as a result of those contracts 440 jobs were created or retained. She added that they offer 35 different training sessions on various types of work to 2,544 participants

Freeholder Jalloh inquired if this training was for just Union County.

Director Wagner advised that the jobs were for just Union County, clarifying that the numbers stated were for only Union County businesses.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING, PUBLIC WORKS & FACILITIES MANAGEMENT Joseph Graziano, Director

1. Authorizing the County Manager to execute Right of Way/Agreements with various owners in association with the Gordon Street Bridge Replacement - West First Avenue to Westfield Avenue, Borough of Roselle and Roselle Park, County of Union, New Jersey for an amount not to exceed \$203,720.00 (Union County Engineering Project Number 2011-051) (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Estrada asked if the \$203,720 will be covered in the agreement with the federal government.

Director Graziano advised that this amount would be covered (paid for) by the federal government. He advised they are looking to get the project out to bid in the summer.

Freeholder Estrada inquired what the costs were for the County to provide the services outlined in Resolutions #1 through #3.

Golf Operations Director Armando Sanchez advised the primary cost to the County is the cost of staffing, he noted that the PGA professionals donate their time. He added that the County waives the access fee of the driving range as well.

Freeholder Estrada inquired as to the number of youths participating in these programs last year.

Golf Operations Director Armando Sanchez advised that a little over 1,100 youths participated in the various programs.

Freeholder Estrada commented on the benefits of this program.

1. Golf Operations Director Armando Sanchez advised that their headquarters is based out of Florida along with the PGA and LPGA, but the County deals with the local chapter.
