



UNION COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 16, 2014
REGULAR MEETING AGENDA

Chairman Christopher Hudak presided and called the meeting to order at 7:55pm. Roll call showed Vice Chairman Mohamed S. Jalloh, Freeholder Bruce Bergen, Freeholder Linda Carter, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella, Freeholder Vernell Wright were in attendance. Freeholder Sergio Granados was absent.

Also present were County Manager Alfred Faella, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq. and Clerk of the Board James Pelletiere.

The Prayer and Salute to the Flag were led by the Clerk of the Board.

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was led by the Clerk of the Board.

COMMUNICATIONS

Note and File

Chairman Hudak called for a motion to approve the Communications. On a motion made by Freeholder Kowalski and seconded by Vice Chairman Jalloh, roll call showed eight members of the Board voted in the affirmative with Freeholder Granados absent.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Pat Mochetti, New Providence, commented on Resolution Numbers 2014-856, 857, 858, 859, and 860. He asked how much will the County of Union have to match and how much has the County matched in total for 2014.

Director Taylor stated there is a \$49,000 County match for Resolution Number 2014-857 and a \$48,000 match for Resolution Number 2014-858. Director Taylor stated that there was no County match for the other four resolutions. Director Taylor noted that the County allocated \$1.2 million for matching funds in the 2014 Budget. She stated that these grants total \$995,134. She stated that the County has received \$17.7 million in grant funds since the adoption of the 2014 budget; noting that prior to the adoption of the budget, the County accepted \$15.8 million in grant funds for a total grant acceptance amount for 2014 of approximately \$33 million.

John Bury, Kenilworth, commented on Resolution Number 2014-854. He questioned why Diana Youst, Acting Superintendent, could not just leave Hudson County.

Mr. Bury commented on Resolution Number 2014-854. He questioned where the \$250,000 is coming from.

Director Taylor stated the County authorized \$6.6 million funds in golf operations other expenses in the 2014 budget. She advised that the earlier resolution only partially awarded funds to Kemper's contract. This resolution awards the additional funds through December 31, 2014 with funds that we already budgeted. She said it is not tied to revenue. She clarified that the \$250,000 funds is already included in the budget, now allocating dollar. (Referring to Resolution Number 2014-854)

Director Guzzo stated that Ms. Youst is a 28 year employee of Hudson County. He advised the Board of the issues relative to Hudson County not participating in governmental transfers and potential civil-service issues with her employment with Union County. He stated that the intent is for there to be a transition from a MOU to Union County employment as the County transitions juveniles from Hudson County detention center to the Union County facility. He clarified that the MOU reimburses Hudson County for salary and fringe benefits through the end of the year, with an option to extend if needed.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on any matter.

Pat Mochetti, New Providence, made comments relative to Resolution Number 2014-852. He questioned where the \$1 million dollars for the Kids Recreation Trust Funds come from.

Mr. Mochetti commented on the potential of Union County inmates moving to Hudson County. He asked what plans are being made for the facilities if they are moved. Mr. Mochetti questioned the number residents that have obtained a fulltime job or apprenticeship through WIB efforts. Mr. Mochetti questioned if the County has ever turned down grants.

Thomas Hannon, Cranford Commissioner, stated that he, along with 2 other members of the citizen of Cranford, was in attendance representing over 3,000 signatories (both on-line and written petition) opposing the soccer field complex at the Union County College Cranford Campus. He asked for an update on the current status.

County Manager Faella stated that he and Director Zuber met on two occasions with the President of Union County College and that they have had preliminary discussions on developing a field at Oakridge Park.

Chairman Hudak said he's supportive of the college and the Board's preference is to have it at Oakridge.

Barbara Egger, representing the Nurses union, stated that as of yesterday Runnells employees received their 5th date of layoff plan (December 1, 2014). She stated that some employees have resigned. Mr. Egger claimed that as of today not one employee has been offered a job with Center Management. She commented on the issues that exist if the County is continuing to plan to own and operate the psychiatric unit; specifically how it relates to civil service. Ms. Egger asked the Board to have Center Management speak to the employees.

Chairman Hudak asked Director Guzzo to speak.

Director Guzzo agreed that this process has taken longer than anyone anticipated, but disagreed that it has done so due to poor planning. He stated everything the County has done, has been done with the employees at heart. He explained that this last extension was based on the sole fact that the employees do not have enough time to make an informed decision on their employment. He stated that he is, and has been, available to discuss this with anyone and at any time.

John Bury, Kenilworth, made comments on the positives of discussing matters at public meetings. He made comments regarding his concerns in regards to the inmates being transferred to Hudson County, specifically with transportation costs. He stated that he believes that Gloucester County is losing money by outsourcing their jail. He questioned the administrative efficiency of Hudson County. He questioned how the County would utilize the current Union County Jail facility.

County Counsel Barry stated that the County has held very preliminary discussions and the statements made tonight are based on incorrect facts and are speculative.

FREEHOLDER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Freeholder Bergen made comments relative to the 350th Anniversary of Elizabethtown, including Revolutionary War Re-Enactments throughout Union County.

Freeholder Wright made comments relative to Four Centuries in a Weekend Event: "Train through Time," which coordinates shuttle buses and walking directions with New Jersey Transit's Raritan Valley Line. She stated that Four Centuries sites including the popular Deserted Village and a special history hike at the Ash Brook Reservation, where you can learn how the swampy terrain factored into the Revolutionary War. She further commented in regards to other Fall activities, including the County's unique "Pumpkin Sail" event at Echo Lake Park on November 1st, right after Halloween.

Freeholder Kowalski encouraged residents to participate and enjoy the Four Centuries in a Weekend events and activities.

Freeholder Carter made comments relative to the Union County Means Business breakfast networking session on October 21, 2014. She advised that it will feature three special guests: Senator Cory Booker, Kristina Hahn from Google; and Stan Robinson, who is CEO of his company SHR Marketing. She advised that they'll be conducting a roundtable discussion on e-commerce and will take place at Hamilton Stage in Rahway.

Freeholder Estrada offered his congratulations to Deputy County Manager Reyes on receiving the Prestigious "Leadership in Government" Award given by the Latino Chambers of Commerce.

Freeholder Mirabella made comments relative to the Red Ribbon Day which will be held on October 18th at Nomahegan Park. He said the Freeholder Board is a supporter of this annual event with the non-profit organization, Prevention Links. He stated that the Red Ribbon Day also features the Red Ribbon Walk fundraiser and that the proceeds this year will go to Recovery High School; which is the newest addition to our award-winning Vo-Tech schools.

Freeholder Mirabella made some comments relative to the upcoming information session for Vo-Tech schools on Saturday, October 18, 2014.

Freeholder Mirabella further wished the best on Election Day to Freeholders Estrada, Wright, Chairman Hudak, Joseph Cryan and James LaCorte.

County Manager Faella commented on Runnells Hospital, stating that the Administration is fully aware of the effects of the prolonged negotiations have had on the County's employees. He added that the County would continue to do everything they can to keep the employees informed. He also stated that the County would ensure adequate and appropriate staffing levels for the hospital.

He also advised residents to visit the County's official website for details of all of the County's Fall programming.

Vice Chairman Jalloh congratulated the municipalities on their participation with the Trust Fund grant programs. He noted that you can easily see these dollars at work as you drive through the County of Union.

Vice Chairtman Jalloh thanked Ms. Eggress for her comments in regards to Runnells Specialized Hospital. However, he stated that it would be irresponsible for the County to act quickly without doing it due diligence.

Vice Chairman Jalloh stated that the Board has not seen any information on any possible transfer of Union County inmates. He advised that the Board has only provided the County Manager to begin discussing the concept.

Chairman Hudak said he had the pleasure of joining the Elizabeth Family and Children's Services at Kean University, for their second annual Champion for Children event. He stated that it was an honor to participate on behalf of the Freeholder Board, and to celebrate the advocacy, guidance, and commitment of the Union County community toward positive youth development.

Chairman Hudak stated that Basketball Hall of Famer Bob Hurley, who was a coach and is President of St. Anthony High School in Jersey City, and former Governor, Richard Codey were both recognized at the event, along with community service organizations here in Union County. He thanked all of those in attendance.

Chairman Hudak thanked Trust Fund Committee Chairman Bruce Bergen and the Trust Fund staff on their work with this year's grant programs.

Chairman Hudak commended the County Manager, County Counsel, the Department Heads and county employces who have done a tremendous job over the past three years during difficult times.

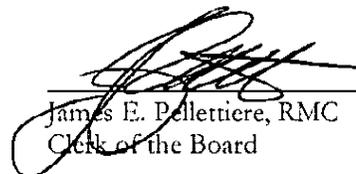
