# CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bruce H. Bergen presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 7:02pm.

# ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairman Bruce H. Bergen, Vice Chairman Sergio Granados, Freeholder Linda Carter, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh, Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella and Vernell Wright were present, with Freeholder Christopher Hudak absent.

Also present were County Manager Alfred J. Faella, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

## PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

# STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

#### PRESENTATION TO THE BOARD

A presentation will be made by Mr. Gary W. White to the Board relative to Fibrodysplasia Ossificans Progressiva (FOP) research.

Chairman Bergen called upon Mr. Gary W. White to the podium to make a presentation to the Board.

Mr. Gary W. White thanked the Board for the opportunity to update the Board as to the progress made in the awareness program for FOP throughout New Jersey. He stated that FOP is a disease where children grow a second skeleton in their bodies when their muscles and ligaments turn into bone. He stated that he learned about the disease in 2001 when he heard a presentation made by Dr. Fred Kaplan, of the University of Pennsylvania. He stated that he was so moved by his speech, he decided that he would do everything he could do to spread awareness.

Mr. Gary W. White stated that in 2002, he and his son wrote to all 566 mayors in New Jersey asking them to adopt a proclamation to urge research and awareness of FOP. He added they wrote to all 21 Freeholder Boards and all state governors. He proudly stated that all 21 Boards of Chosen Freeholders passed resolutions in support, and of the 566 municipalities, they have received 478 proclamations. He stated that last year, the New Jersey Historical Society informed him that there has never been an initiative like this in the State of New Jersey; adding that once this initiative is completed, they will provide the books to the State of New Jersey for their archives.

owledging the 15 year endeavor

Mr. Gary W. White stated that this year they held a fundraiser acknowledging the 15 year endeavor and recognizing those individuals who have greatly assisted in the success in raising awareness. He stated that Sheriff Cryan was recognized for his efforts when he was an Assemblyman, noting that he introduced him to the Legislative Health Committee. He stated that Freeholder Estrada was not able to make the event, but that he wanted to come tonight to present him with his plaque. He read the inscription aloud.

Freeholder Estrada stated that this is a tremendous task that they have engaged in. He commended him on his commitment and tireless efforts in achieving his goal in raising awareness of FOP. He thanked him for the honor and wished him the best of luck on obtaining the remaining proclamations.

# OFFICE OF THE UNION COUNTY PROSECUTOR

#### Grace H. Park, Acting Prosecutor

First Assistant Prosecutor Tim Isenhour represented the Office.

1. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to purchase surveillance equipment from Special Services Group, LLC, Denair, CA in an amount not to exceed \$27,000. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Vice Chairman Granados asked for additional explanation as to the type of surveillance equipment that will be purchased.

First Assistant Prosecutor Tim Isenhour advised that this is confidential equipment that will allow individuals to conduct surveillances without having individuals physically close to the scene. He stated that they install such equipment in multiple municipalities and utilize them in some of their cases. He added that the funding for this equipment is from last year's capital budget.

- 2. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to enter into a contract with O'Brien and Kolano, LLC, Glen Gardner, NJ, to provide Crisis Intervention Training to law enforcement and mental health personnel in an amount not to exceed \$22,400. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager through the Union County Prosecutor's Office to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners to serve as Independent Contractors as part of the Union County Sexual Assault Response Team for the period of October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017 in the amount of \$24,580.00. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)
- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement with Hertrich Fleet Services, Milford, DE to purchase two 2017 Chevrolet Suburban vehicles at a total cost not to exceed \$100,000 through NJ State Contract A89939. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Freeholder Wright asked if the purchase was a replacement or for two additional vehicles.

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First Assistant Prosecutor Tim Isenhour advised that this resolution is for a replacement of two vehicles. He added that the Prosecutor's Office has six vehicles in the UCERT fleet and primarily carry a lot of equipment. He stated that last year the Prosecutor's Office replaced two vehicles with 10 years and a quarter million miles on them, noting that this is the same with this request. He stated that one of the vehicles is being purchased out of capital and one out of forfeiture funds.

5. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to purchase computer software from SHI International, 290 Davidson Avenue, Somerset, NJ in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 through NJ State Contract #89851. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional explanation as to the purpose of resolution request #5.

First Assistant Prosecutor Tim Isenhour advised they were hoping to obtain this through grant funding, but instead will be using forfeiture funds to purchase this software. He advised that the Office of Victim Witness Advocacy changed some of the reporting requirements of the office. He advised that this software will allow the county to comply with the very specific details they are requesting of the office; noting that without this software, the office would have had to double its staffing in order comply. He stated that if they are successful in obtaining grant funds, they will use such instead of the forfeiture funds.

#### DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Freeholder Estrada asked if the cost for this contract increased over the years. He also inquired if the \$15,500 will cover expenses through the year.

Director Guzzo stated that the county started out with the same amount as last year, but the county has had more indigent burials than expected. He said he was hopeful that this amount will cover the costs necessary for the remainder of the year.

- 2.
