## **PUBLIC PORTION COMMENT**

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The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Pat Mochetti, New Providence, made comments relative to Resolution 2012-847. He asked which of the three municipalities did not participate, and asked why.

On Resolutions 2012-850 and 2012-851 asked if the cost is offset by user fees at the stables.

Resolution 2012-861 asked if the medical examiner does not perform his duties well, then what will happen if he has a 5 year contract. He asked if a five year contract is normal practice.

Administrator of the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund Vikki Durbin-Drake stated that the three towns that did not receiving grants are Kenilworth, Clark and Winfield Park. She said they were contacted many times and it was their decision not to participate; citing the match in funds requirement as a possible reason and/or improvements not needed at this time.

Chairman Mirabella stated that there are some municipalities who do not participate every year due to not having the enough funding or recreational improvements not needed.

Chairman Mirabella stated that there are many fees that offset the expenditures for Resolutions 2012-850 and 2012-851.

Counsel Bob Barry responded in reference to Resolution 2012-861, stating that the County is mandated to have a medical examiner and the term is set by State Statute. It is not a “contract of employment.: He said he could be terminated if there is cause.

**2012-845 FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI:** Amending Resolution Number 2011-959, to reflect a reallocation of funds between vendors and endorse the amended 2012 Alcohol/Drug Abuse Spending Plan, as approved by LACADA on October 2, 2012, for the period of January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. This amendment de-obligates \$15,100 from the total award for JFK-Steps Recovery Center and \$7,400 from the total award for Sunrise House/Dudley House, and reallocates \$3,700 to Sunrise House, \$3,700 to Turning Point, \$5,034 to Bridgeway Rehabilitation Services, \$5,033 to Trinitas Regional Medical Center and \$5,033 to Proceed, Inc.

**2012-846 FREEHOLDER KOWALSKI:** Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a shared services agreement with Bergen County for the purposes of providing up to 20 secure detention beds for its juvenile detention population on an as needed basis effective November 1, 2012 through October 31, 2013 at a per diem cost of \$225.00. Additional charges will be billed to and paid by Bergen County for items listed in the preliminary report on contract parameters.

**2012-847 FREEHOLDER SCANLON:** Authorizing the County Manager to award Kids Recreation Trust Grants 2012 to 18 municipalities in the County of Union in accordance with the Kids Recreation Trust Grant criteria as stated in said grant application, through the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund, in an amount not to exceed \$1,150,057.50.

**2012-848 FREEHOLDER SCANLON:** Authorizing the County Manager to award Greening Union County 2012 Grants to the fourteen (14) municipalities, in accordance with the Greening Union County grant's criteria and funded through the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund in a total amount not to exceed \$93,003.00.

Knabb & Sons, Kutztown, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of providing straw for Watchung Stable, for a period of 12 months, with an option of an additional 12 months, in the amount of \$94,250.

**2012-851 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN:** Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Parks and Community Renewal: John R. Knabb & Sons, Kutztown, Pennsylvania, for the purpose of providing hay for Watchung Stable, for the contract period of 12 months from award, with an option to renew for an additional 12 months, in an amount of not to exceed \$181,875.

**2012-852 FREEHOLDER SULLIVAN:** Supporting Senate Bill No. 2202 to expand the New Jersey HomeKeeper Program to be used as financial assistance to help families pay their mortgages and maintain ownership of their homes.

Bridge over the Elizabeth River, City of Elizabeth, and if approved, to enter into an Agreement with the NJTPA for this funding program.

**2012-860 CHAIRMAN MIRABELLA:** Authorizing the County Manager to execute a Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Department of Interior, U.S. Geological Survey, for the operations and maintenance of a Flood Monitoring System in the Lower Rahway River Basin, in the amount of \$14,990.00 beginning October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013.

**2012-861 CHAIRMAN MIRABELLA:** Appointing Junaid R. Shaikh, M.D., Montville, New Jersey, as the Union County Medical Examiner for a five (5) year term commencing on November 1, 2012 through October 31, 2017 at an annual salary of \$185,000.00.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION**

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The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on any matter.

(Inaudible), Union, asked if there are any proposed layoffs.

Chairman Mirabella stated that they are not considering layoffs at this time.

John Bury, Kenilworth, spoke about a press release on September 27, 2011 stating that the banquet facility at the Galloping Hill Golf Course would be ready for the 2012 golf season. He said since it is not ready, he asked about the new date and the new amount. He also asked if KemperSports will be operating the banquet facility, and asked if it is legal to compete with privately owned facilities that pay taxes to Union County, or if there are any limitations.

Director Zuber stated that there were construction delays and it is scheduled for January 2013.

County Manager Faella stated that they are still on budget. He stated he could get that information for him.

County Counsel Barry stated that in reference to the banquet facility at the Galloping Hill Golf Course, this is part of the overall operations of the Golf Course. It was not created, nor intended to

be competitive. It will be utilized as part of it. He said it sounds like it is a hypothetical comment of what can be done.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, asked for the projected cost of the banquet facility. He said it was estimated at \$17 million.

County Manager Faella did not have the exact figures but said it is close to the \$17 million budget. He will provide the information.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, urged the Board to invite Executive Director Charlotte DeFilippo back to a Regular Freeholder Meeting to make the presentation of the solar project.

Chairman Mirabella stated that the Board does not need to hear the presentation again, and there are reports available. He said he does not anticipate having Ms. DeFilippo back.

Mr. Buettner stated that the Agenda Meetings are not aired for the public to see.

## **FREEHOLDER REPORTS AND COMMENTS**

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Freeholder Kowalski reminded the public that the “Four Centuries in a Weekend: A Journey through Union County’s History” is coming up this weekend. This is one of the county’s most popular events, and it is a tour through some of the most treasured historic sites in our communities. This year’s event will take place Saturday, October 20 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, October 21st from noon to 5 p.m. Four Centuries started back in 1994 with 16 sites and now we have grown to 24. The County of Union is proud to sponsor Four Centuries, and he thanked the many volunteers who take care of these properties year round, and who put in the extra effort to make this event a success. Freeholder Kowalski stated that Sunday, October 21st will have the Mastodon exhibit at Trailside and there are haunted hay rides at the Deserted Village on October 27th and 28th.

Freeholder Scanlon thanked everyone involved with the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund. She said it was a pleasure to hand out over \$1 million in checks to the municipalities.

Freeholder Sullivan said he was dismayed to hear the Freeholder debate was not going to be held this year. He said he enjoyed participating and watching as there was a lot of information exchanged. He said the League of Women Voters Membership is down and they were not able to have a moderator.

Freeholder Sullivan said that he gives credit to those who put their name on a ballot.

Freeholder Sullivan predicted the outcome of the election and he congratulated all the candidates. He wished his colleagues luck in the election.

Freeholder Wright stated that the last recycling event of the season will be on October 27th, and I just wanted to take a moment to talk about how important this service has become. Every year, thousands of Union County residents visit our recycling events. This is a free service that provides a

safe, environmentally sound way to dispose of unwanted household chemicals, electronic goods, personal papers and even old tires. We also added new services for scrap metal and fluorescent tube lights this year. These programs enable everyone to pitch in and do something positive for the environment, and for the overall health of our communities. With that in mind, I would like to encourage you to come out to our last event this season, which is a combined event for electronic equipment and personal paper shredding. It will be on Saturday October 27th, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Alcatel-Lucent Technologies facility, 600 Mountain Avenue in New Providence.

Freeholder Estrada spoke about the safety of children during Halloween. He also mentioned the 14 year old girl who was shot in Pakistan because she expressed her advocacy to the rights of education for girls.

Freeholder Hudak reminded the public that Union County's Red Ribbon Day is coming up on Saturday, October 20th at Oak Ridge Park in Clark. This is a full day of fun, free activities for children and families from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., along with a health fair. He stated that Red Ribbon is designed to help parents provide their children with positive messages about staying healthy, and preventing drug and alcohol abuse.

The Red Ribbon 5K Run and a Family Fun Walk will also take place before the event, starting at 9:30 a.m. Red Ribbon Day is sponsored by the Freeholder Board with Prevention Links and the Union County D.A.R.E. Freeholder Hudak wished Chairman Mirabella and Freeholder Jalloh the best of luck during the election and wished all the candidates well.

Freeholder Hudak stated that Vote by Mail is still available and to visit the County Clerk's Office for an application. He urged the public to vote.

Freeholder Hudak commended Freeholder Scanlon on the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Preservation Trust Fund for the grant dollars provided to the municipalities for their recreational use.

County Manager Faella thanked the Board for the support of Resolution 2012-852 and stressed its importance.

Chairman Mirabella spoke on the upcoming sixth and final session of this year's Union County Means Business series of networking breakfasts that was held. The goal of the series was to provide the business community with information on how they can connect with government resources at the local, state and federal government. We started with high hopes and it has truly exceeded all of our expectations. So while I will conclude this year's series with very grateful thanks for all the participants and partners that made it a success. He also stated that it will keep it going next year, too. Right now we are conducting an online survey asking our participants to send us their ideas and suggestions for future programs. Chairman Mirabella spoke about the upcoming Veterans Job Fair. This event is to alert military veterans and active-duty military personnel to the upcoming Veterans Job Fair, which will be held on Thursday, October 25th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at VFW Post 2230 in Kenilworth, at 33 South 21<sup>st</sup> Street. This is a free event for veterans, active-duty personnel and their families. Along with representatives from local employers, government agencies will be hand with additional information on benefits, services and other resources, and the event will also include free health screenings from the Lyons VA Medical Center.

Chairman Mirabella thanked our state and federal partners in advance, and he especially thanked the more than 50 employers that have pulled together to help make this endeavor a successful one. Chairman Mirabella stated that he, Freeholder Estrada and Freeholder Kowalski attended former Freeholder Chester Holmes' event where friends and family celebrated his career.
