BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Union that the "Laws of Union County" are hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 2, -§107-ARTICLE IV - FEES FOR RECREATION FACILITIES

The Director of the Department of Parks and Community Renewal is hereby authorized to set fees and one time charges not specifically included in the fee schedule. The Director of the Department of Parks and Community Renewal is hereby further authorized to amend or modify any fee set forth in the fee schedule for special promotions and events. In the event that the Director shall asses, amend or modify any fee he shall file a notice of said assessment, amendment or modification with the Clerk of the Board and the Director of the Department of Finance, no less than five days prior to the effective date of the assessment, amendment or modification.

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF \$40,960,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF OUTSTANDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING A SUM NOT EXCEEDING \$41,000,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT EXCEEDING \$41,000,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF REFUNDING BONDS OF SAID COUNTY TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION.

> BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

> Section 1. The County of Union (the "County"), State of New Jersey is hereby authorized to refund \$40,960,000 aggregate principal amount of outstanding bonds (subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities) dated March 1, 2004 and maturing on or after March 1, 2015 (the "Outstanding Bonds").

The Outstanding Bonds consist of the following two issues of

bonds, bearing interest at the rates per annum, payable on March

1 and September 1 of each year until maturity or prior redemption, and maturing in annual installments on March 1 in each year, as follows:

The Outstanding Bonds are subject to optional redemption on or after March 1, 2014 at a redemption price of 100%.

The Board of Chosen Freeholders may determine by subsequent resolution not to refund a portion of the Outstanding Bonds.

Section 2. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County has ascertained and hereby determines that the Outstanding Bonds set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance have not been paid or discharged and that the County is authorized by Section 51(a) of the Local Bond Law of New Jersey (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law") to issue its refunding bonds as hereinafter provided to refund the Outstanding Bonds. The object of the refunding is to effect debt service savings for the County.

Section 3. A sum not exceeding \$41,000,000 is hereby appropriated (a) to refund the Outstanding Bonds set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance in the aggregate principal amount of \$40,960,000 and (b) to pay an amount not exceeding \$350,000 for the cost of the issuance of the refunding bonds, including underwriter's compensation, printing, advertising, financial and legal expenses therefor, as permitted by Section 51(b) of the Local Bond Law (collectively, the "Purpose").

Section 4. To finance the Purpose, refunding bonds of said County in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$41,000,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law (the "Refunding Bonds"). The Refunding Bonds shall be sold at private sale by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and shall be in registered form and shall contain the word "refunding" in their title and shall recite that they are issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law and shall bear such date or dates,

mature at such time or times not exceeding 40 years from their date, bear interest at such rate or rates per annum, be payable at such time or times, be in such denominations, carry such registration privileges, be executed in such manner consistent with the provisions of the Local Bond Law for bonds of a county, be payable at such place or places, and be subject to such terms of redemption, with or without premium, as may be hereafter determined by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders within the limitations prescribed by law.

Section 5. The Refunding Bonds shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the County and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all taxable real property within the County for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Refunding Bonds without limitation as to rate or amount. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the Refunding Bonds. Each Refunding Bond issued pursuant to this ordinance shall recite that all conditions, acts and things required by the Constitution or statutes of the State of New Jersey to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in the issuance of the Refunding Bond exist, have happened and have been performed, and that the Refunding Bond, together with all other indebtedness of the County, is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution or statutes of said State.

Section 6. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to execute a certificate addressed to the underwriters of the Refunding Bonds stating that the preliminary official statement to be prepared by the County with respect to the Refunding Bonds is "deemed final" as of its date within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The distribution of such preliminary official statement to potential purchasers of the Refunding Bonds is hereby approved.

Section 7. All matters with respect to the Refunding Bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by subsequent resolution or resolutions to be hereafter adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County, or the performance or determination thereof delegated by resolution or resolutions, to the Director of Finance.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of said County, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said County, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$41,000,000, but \$40,960,000 (the principal amount of the Outstanding Bonds being paid from the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds) shall be deducted from gross debt pursuant to Section 52 of the Local Bond Law, and that the issuance of the bonds authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that no sum need be appropriated hereby as a down payment.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Tom Getzendanner, Council Member, City of Summit, congratulated the new administration. He had questions regarding the refinancing of bonds mentioned in Ordinance 2013-745.

Mr. Getzendanner also had questions pertaining to Resolutions 2013-47, awarding additional grant funds of CDBG Block Grants to the UCED Corp; Resolution 2013-57 extending the Perselay Consulting contract; Resolution 2013-62, managing wildlife, 2013-65, lawn furniture for the Galloping Hill Golf Course and Resolution 2013-90, lowering speed limits in Summit.

Mr. Getzendanner also spoke about committing to a 2% Cap. He stated that Morris County has pledged a 0% tax increase. He made remarks about privatizing the Jail and Runnells Hospital.

Mr. Getzendanner's statement is attached.

Director Taylor stated that the County's debt is currently .823% which is in association with \$561,000 million net debt.

County Manager Faella responded to Resolution 2013-47, stating that the purpose of the Resolution is to assist small businesses with a focus on small loans given the state of the economy.

Director Guzzo stated that Resolution 2013-57 is to extend the contract for three months with Perselay Consultants for the jail study. He said there are no additional dollars and are within the budget this year.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, congratulated Chairman Carter on her first formal meeting.

Mr. Paterson stated that Director Riordan had mentioned at a previous Freeholder Meeting that the holding time for inmates has decreased. He asked about the savings. He also asked if Perselay Consultants is including privatization of the County Jail in their study.

Mr. Paterson asked if the machines mentioned in Resolution 2013-77 will have paper print out capabilities.

Director Riordan responed to Resolution 2013-57. He stated that it is difficult to determine a savings amount due to the fact that the population is very fluid and changes hour to hour and day to day. He said there was a Resolution for a contract for medical services for \$400,000 less. He said for every inmate the cost of the meals are \$1.33 x 3 meals per day. He said there is a reduction of 5 or 6 posts per day that will not need to be manned.

Chairman Carter asked if there has been a present study done. Director Riordan replied, yes.

Mr. Kobitz stated that in reference to Resolution 2013-77, is for current machines used and that 18 counties use these same machines. There is no paper trail for the machines. New machines are needed and the cost is \$40 million for 18 of the 21 municipalities. He said funds have been cut a few years ago due to the economy.

Tina Renna, Cranford, asked for an explanation of Resolution 2013-61, and asked if there will be additional purchases pertaining to Resolution 2013-65. She asked for an explanation of Resolution 2013-78. She asked about the consultant's purposed and asked why the County employees cannot be trained to provide these services.

Director DiRado stated that Resolution 2013-61 includes 18 Position Controls, one is a promotion in the Finance Department and the remaining is transferring employees from grant dollars to County dollars.

Director Zuber explained that the lawn furniture for the Galloping Hill Golf Course included 104 dining room chairs and 22 tables, lounge chairs, modular chairs and coffee tables.

Director Yuska represented the Prosecutor's Office and stated that the county received a large grant to expand the DNA lab. Resolution 2013-78 will allow the county to use grant funds to pay for special training of a consultant. It is solely grant funded.

John Bury, Kenilworth, asked about Resolution 2013-67. Chairman Carter stated it is for a software package.

Administrator of Runnells Hospital Joan Wheeler explained further that Resolution 2013-67 for a software system for accounting and billing purposes for the Hospital. He said the contract in 2012 did not include the secure sockets layer which is for patient privacy when information is transmitted through the software.

Pat Mochetti, New Providence, asked why vendors are being used from out of State, such as: Resolutions 2013-67, 76, 77,82 and 86.

County Counsel Barry explained that according to RFP or the bid processing laws, it does not limit the County to use vendors in New Jersey.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

This meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on any matter.

Rich Madden, Summit Council President, congratulated them on their administration, and thanked the Board for their work in Summit and throughout the County in with their tremendous efforts with Storm Sandy. He also added that they held a great seminar.

Council President Madden stated that Summit is the largest tax payer in the County. He made comments relative to the County's taxes and the City of Summit's, along with the Summit's Board of Education. He noted that equilization is a state equation and that it was good to have high ratables. He made some remarks about Summit's High School awards.

Council President Madden asked for the Board's help with the Passaic River litigation. He thanked Freeholder Mirabella, County Counsel Barry, Mayor Bollwage and Senator Lesniak for defending the City. He also spoke about the City's infrastructure, JCP&L telephone poles. He said he appreciates the emergency management. He also spoke about the cost of having a full day kindergarten in the City. He asked the Board to consider a reduction in taxes. He spoke about merging the County police and privatizing the jail and Runnells Hospital. He made positive comments about shared

services.

Maria Esmaria, Elizabeth, asked for direction to complain about DYFS being denied services for her autistic child.

Chairman Carter referred her to Director Guzzo.

Tom Getzandanner, Council Member, Summit, thanked Chairman Carter for her initiative address she delivered at the County's Reorganization meeting. He spoke about the 2% Cap, Morris County's 0% tax increase, privatizing the Jail and Runnells Hospital and merging the County Police and Sheriff's Office.

Mary Ellen Taylor, Berkeley Heights, made derogatory remarks about DYFS and spoke about guardianship for the disabled. She also made comments defending Tina Renna having to appear in court to reveal her sources about the alleged missing County generators. Ms. Taylor stated that her 80 year old parents have been abused by people in Berkeley Heights, stating that they have been in violation of an Ordinance. She also mentioned that there are many sidewalks that are not in compliance with ADA requirements.

Matthew Taylor, Berkeley Heights, asked the Board if his wife could speak on his behalf.

Chairman Carter offered for Mr. Taylor to remain in his seat and they would bring him a microphone. He refused and approached the pulpit.

Mr. Taylor stated that he attends an Adult Learning Center in Basking Ridge Monday through Friday and Director Guzzo is working with him.

Pat Mochetti, New Providence, stated that Union County is the second highest taxpayer in the State. He stated that experts state that a 5% tax reduction can be done without interrupting services. He stated that there may be some programs that could be eliminated or combined. He suggested the County look into shared services with other counties.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, stated that there was an article in the Westfield Leader that County Clerk Rajoppi reports a \$6 million savings, and he was pleased. He was also pleased about the savings at the jail. He stated he would be happy to see a 0% increase to the County Budget or a 2% cap. He noted the number of employees paid through grant funds and the fact that grants are reducing. He suggested ending those services.

Director DiRado explained Resolution 2013-61, stating that there are 18 employees that are being transferred from grant dollars to county dollars.

Director Graziano explained that the grants dollars that are being transferred to County dollars is for individuals who make the signs for traffic, surveying and traffic studies. He stated it included 13 employees.

Director Hudak asked about the utilization by the municipalities.

Director Graziano stated that the County helps the municipalities with line striping, traffic studies and making signs. He said regardless, the State would require the County to hire people for this job.

Freeholder Hudak asked if they are still catching up with the aftermath of Storm Sandy.

Director Graziano replied yes, adding they have a good reputation with the County's sign shop, Mr. Papparelli, and they have a good shared service agreement with Rahway and Linden.

Tina Renna, Cranford, asked that the new employee handbook be made available to the public. She made allegations that County equipment could be borrowed by County employees provided they are returned in the same condition. She asked about the tracking system that is in place.

Director DiRado stated that the 2013 Handbook was adopted at the Reorganization Meeting. He stated that no County employee is allowed to borrow equipment.

County Counsel confirmed Director DiRado's statement.

Jim Buettner, Cranford, congratulated Chairman Carter on being chosen as the Chairman of the Freeholder Board in such a short time of being on the Board. He welcomed Freeholder Bergen to the Board. He also stated that since there was not a Freeholder debate held, he is unaware of his qualifications.

Mr. Buettner made comments about the generators and Ms. Renna being subpoenaed to appear in court to reveal her sources.

John Bury, Kenilworth, had questions on the County's audits and questioned the use of county grant funds; specifically Ryan White Funds.

Director Guzzo stated that Mr. Bury made ridiculous comments about the use of Ryan White Funds. He stated it is unjust and simply inaccurate. The County foregoes using any Ryan White Funds towards administrative costs. All funds are directed to assist people with Aides.

FREEHOLDER REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Freeholder Sullivan complimented Administrator Wheeler and Directors Taylor and Guzzo for being prepared. He stated that in reference to the Position Controls, the sign department is an important part of the County and will be included in the 2013 budget.

Freeholder Sullivan stated that the Executive Budget will be released shortly and there will be presentations made to the public in March.

Freeholder Sullivan welcomed Freeholder Bergen to the Board.

Freeholder Bergen stated that he has been in public life for 20 years, and it has never been his practice to make comments on broad allegations having no facts to support them.

Freeholder Bergen stated that frequently, we admire the individual who can push through illness to get the job done. Unfortunately, that type of toughness is not the best approach when dealing with contagious diseases, particularly the flu. As we know now, the flu is sweeping across the nation, claiming a number of lives. It is taking its toll in the workplace and our schools. The point we need to stress is that if you think you have flu symptoms you should stay home and seek medical help. While it may turn out your symptoms do not constitute the flu, it is best to err on the side of caution. If you have not received a flu shot, I urge to go our webpage at <u>www.ucnj.org</u>

http://www.ucnj.org to learn where to find a shot. That link will also connect you with tips and preventative measures on dealing with the flu season. As the saying goes, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

Freeholder Jalloh congratulated County Manager Faella and Director DiRado for the employee handbook training. He said all employees need to know what is expected. The manual is mostly the same. The employees sometimes need to be reminded so there is no misunderstanding.

Freeholder Jalloh stated that he is proud to announce this year the Freeholder Board has partnered with Union County College to host the first annual Black History Month Kick-Off Reception. The event will take place on Friday, February 8th at Union County College's Kellogg Building in Elizabeth, and will bring members of the community together to enjoy an exciting program and highlight various other Black History programs taking place throughout the County.

In addition, the Board will also be honoring to Ella S. Teal from the Urban League of Union County with the first Chester Holmes Humanitarian Award.

Freeholder Kowalski stated that earlier this month, he joined the organization Mayors against Illegal Guns at an event in Cranford, to help mobilize support for meaningful action on gun violence. She said there is no question that we have a problem, and that it will only get worse unless we change the way we are addressing that problem. Mayors against Illegal Guns has formulated a number of responses that are respectful of the Constitutional rights that we all enjoy as American citizens, but that will help tighten the many loopholes that have enabled far too many guns to fall into the wrong hands.

Freeholder Kowalski stated that she is very proud to join in this effort along with other elected officials in Union County and across New Jersey, including our own Sheriff Froehlich.

Freeholder Mirabella stated that he appreciates the comments from the Council Members of Summit. He said Council President Madden was helpful over the past year. He thanked him for the Forum.

Freeholder Mirabella complimented Chairman Carter on her first formal meeting. He called upon the public to check on the elderly during this cold winter.

County Manager Faella said he was pleased to announce that the Union County Child Advocacy Center received a National award, which we were one of ten awarded.

Freeholder Hudak spoke about the shared services with various municipalities, which will save them tax dollars. He said they are always looking to be as close as possible to the 2% cap.

Freeholder Hudak congratulated Freeholder Bergen on his election. He made comments pertaining to the 0% Morris County tax. He said there are seven Freeholders in Morris County, six voted in favor of it and one abstained. The Freeholder who abstained has been on the Board for a number of years. He also noted he found it interesting that it is a non-binding Resolution.

Freeholder Carter thanked everyone for their support for her first public meeting. She said the Directors and the County Manager work very hard. There are difficult issues and circumstances.

She stated that the Governor's cuts trickle down to the County level, stating we are not criminal or corrupt. She asked that everyone remain respectful during the meetings.

Freeholder Carter thanked the Council members of Summit for other options and stated that the Board will review those options.

Chairman Carter stated that on February 21st the County will be starting up a new service for seniors. This is a series of free information sessions, where seniors can come in and connect with information about all of the resources available to them. We know that sometimes it can be confusing to get information online or over the phone, and these sessions will give seniors a chance to sort things out in person. We will have staff at these sessions to provide guidance on all senior services including help with utilities, medications and health insurance. The sessions will be located at community centers and libraries throughout the county, including Elizabeth, Berkeley Heights, Hillside, Cranford and Clark. If you or someone you know would like to attend one of these sessions you can get the complete schedule and location details by calling our Division on Aging toll free, at 888-280-8226.

Chairman Carter reiterated the comments made by Freeholder Mirabella to check on neighbors and elderly during these cold days, and for any heat issues to contact the County.

Congratulations, Madam Chairman, on your new administration.

I'm Tom Getzendanner, a councilman from Summit, with several agenda comments:

- Ord#745 refinancing \$41mm bonds what's our total indebtedness now, bonds + notes, on- and off-balance sheet agencies? Including backstop guarantees?
- <u>Reso#47</u> awarding \$27mm more CDBG block grants to the UCED Corp I thought there was pressure to de-fund not increase this 38yr old program?
- <u>Reso#57</u> extending Perselay consulting contract another 3mos are they studying Jail efficiency? Or Runnells Hospital? You need to get beyond feasibility, and actually implement their suggestions this very budget cycle.
- <u>Reso#62</u> managing wildlife good to let US Agriculture Dept cull our deer herd.
- <u>Reso#65</u> buying \$67k lawn furniture for Galloping Hills clubhouse sooner we privatize this facility the better, and get out of golf course business.
- <u>Reso#90</u> lowering speed limits by 5mph on certain roads in Scotch Plains our police chief might welcome same flexibility in Summit.

We also want to thank Chairwoman Carter for making "efficient, economic county govt" a top priority in her inaugural address. But it's a mistake to delegate that mission to just Policy sub-committee members.

Summit believes the entire Freeholder board should "exhaustively review all workforce and operational procedures." And commit to a pre-determined tax bogey, namely the nominal 2% CAP. Not using any categorical waivers to circumvent that 2% limit.

Most of your 21 constituent towns already do this voluntarily. Apparently the Morris County Freeholders have even gone a step further, and pledged a 0% tax increase!

Privatizing the Jail and Runnells Hospital won't yield enough savings to accomplish this austerity here in Union County. You really have to merge County Police with the Sheriff's Office. Like state officials recommended decades ago (Bergen and Union are only 2 counties in New Jersey with unconsolidated enforcement today).
