ORDINANCES FOR INTRODUCTION

765-2015 BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW ADDITIONAL FURNISHINGS, NEW COMMUNICATION AND **NEW** EQUIPMENT, SIGNAL **SYSTEMS** INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT AND NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES AND A NEW FIRE ENGINE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$44,904,146 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE A STATE GRANT, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The County of Union (the "County"), State of New Jersey is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new additional furnishings, new communication and signal systems equipment, new information technology and telecommunications equipment and new automotive vehicles and a new fire engine, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said County, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements and acquisitions includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable thereof.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements and acquisitions described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be

met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the State grant and the down payment appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements and acquisitions shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefitted.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements and acquisitions is not a current expense of said County.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (I) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the State grant hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$3,625,913 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. The sum of \$6,155,600 received or to be received as a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the infrastructure improvements authorized in Section 4.B above.

Section 7. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$1,553,756, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said County, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$1,553,756 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bonds of said County of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$37,194,790 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 9. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said County of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$37,194,790 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 10. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, by the County Manager and by the County Treasurer and shall be under the seal of said County and attested by the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the County Treasurer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 11.73 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 12. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of said County, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said County, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$37,194,790 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 13. Any funds received from private parties, the State of New Jersey or any of its agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes (other than the State grant hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 14. The County intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements and acquisitions described in Section 4 of this bond ordinance. If the County incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the County hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 15. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the County, and the County shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 16. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available for public inspection.

Section 17. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

FIRST READING STATEMENT

Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Fiscal Chairman, moved Ordinance Number 765-2015 for First Reading and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise same in accordance with the law. The Final Reading and Public Hearing are scheduled for July 16, 2015.

Chairman Jalloh called for a motion. On a motion made by Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Fiscal Chairman and seconded by Freeholder Kowalski roll call showed 9 members of the Board voted in the affirmative.

766-2015 GUARANTY ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON CERTAIN COUNTY GUARANTEED REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2015 (OAK WOOD PLAZA-ELIZABETH) OF THE UNION COUNTY IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$2,200,000 FOR THE PURPOSE **OF PROVIDING** ADDITIONAL SECURITY IN CONNECTION WITH THE **AUTHORITY'S** BONDS AND DETERMINING CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS IN RELATION TO THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Union County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created by an ordinance of the Board of Chosen Freeholders (the "Board of Chosen Freeholders") of the County of Union, New Jersey (the "County"), as a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey (the "State") pursuant to in accordance with the County Improvement Authorities Law, constituting Chapter 183 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1960 of the State, as amended and supplemented from time to time (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has been requested to provide supplemental financing for the acquisition and construction of an affordable residential development located at 200-220 Parker Road and 460 Irvington Avenue, City of Elizabeth, Union County, New Jersey and which will consist of the demolition of two 60 unit apartment buildings and the new construction of approximately 96 new townhouse rental units and all work related thereto (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project is expected to provide dwelling accommodations for occupancy by persons and families of low and moderate income; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined to assist in the financing of the Project, to the extent permitted by law, if such assistance will assure the continued availability of dwelling accommodations for occupancy by persons and families of low and moderate income; and

WHEREAS, the Authority expects to obtain funds to assist the financing of the Project through the issuance of its bonds in an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 13 ("Section 13") of the Act (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-56), prior to the issuance of the Bonds, the Authority shall make a detailed report with respect to such financing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County, which report shall include copies or a description of, without limitation, the various financing documents; and

WHEREAS, the Authority shall make application, on behalf of the Authority, the County, and the City of Elizabeth (the "City") to the Local Finance Board in the Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs of the State (the "Local")

Finance Board") for the Local Finance Board's review of the financing, including, inter alia, this County guaranty ordinance, the Guaranty Agreement (as defined herein), a deficiency agreement with the City (the "City Deficiency Agreement"), and the City ordinance authorizing such City Deficiency Agreement; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of Section 37 of the Act (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-80) and this guaranty ordinance, the County shall be obligated, if necessary, to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the County without limitation as to rate or amount to make the timely payment of the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, in order to induce the prospective purchasers of the Bonds to purchase same, the Bonds shall otherwise be secured by this guaranty ordinance, unconditionally and irrevocably guaranteeing the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on the Bonds, all pursuant to Section 37 of the Act (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-80); and

WHEREAS, the Authority believes: (i) it is in the public interest to accomplish such purpose; (ii) said purpose is for the health, wealth, convenience or betterment of the inhabitants of the County and the City; (iii) the amounts to be expended for said purpose are not unreasonable or exorbitant; and (iv) the proposal is an efficient and feasible means of providing services for the needs of the inhabitants of the County and the City and will not create an undue financial burden to be placed upon the Authority, the City or the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of the full membership thereof affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1. This guaranty ordinance shall be adopted by the governing body of the County in the manner provided for adoption of a bond ordinance as provided in the Local Bond Law, constituting Chapter 169 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1960 of the State, as amended (the "Local Bond Law"), codified as N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1, et seq.

Section 2. Pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the Act, specifically Section 37 of the Act (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-80), the County is hereby authorized to and hereby shall unconditionally and irrevocably guarantee the punctual payment of the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$2,200,000 (the "County Guaranty"), which Bonds are to be issued to finance the Project as described in the preamble hereof, on such terms and conditions as may be agreed to by and between the County and the Authority.

Upon the endorsement of the Bonds referred to in Section 3 below, the County shall be unconditionally and irrevocably obligated to pay the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on the Bonds, when due, in the same manner and to the same extent as in the case of bonds issued by the County and, accordingly, the County shall be unconditionally and irrevocably obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the County for the payment thereof without limitation as to rate or amount when required under the provisions of applicable law.

Section 3. The Chairman of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the County Manager,

the Finance Director of the County, or the County Treasurer (each an "Authorized Officer") shall, by manual or facsimile signature, execute an endorsement on each of the Bonds evidencing this guaranty by the County as to the punctual payment of the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest thereon. The endorsement on each of the Bonds shall be in substantially the following form, and absent the fully executed endorsement in such following form on any such Bond, such Bond shall not be entitled to the benefits of this guaranty ordinance:

"GUARANTY OF THE COUNTY OF UNION.

The payment of the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on the within Bond is hereby fully, unconditionally and irrevocably guaranteed by the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "County"), and the County shall be unconditionally and irrevocably obligated to pay the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on this Bond, when due, in the same manner and to the same extent as in the case of bonds issued by the County and, accordingly, the County shall be unconditionally and irrevocably obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the County for the payment hereof without limitation as to rate or amount when required under the provisions of applicable law.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the County of Union has caused this Guaranty to be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of an Authorized Officer.

Section 4. The Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized to enter into, execute

and deliver in the name of the County and on its behalf, a guaranty agreement or similar instrument (the "Guaranty Agreement") setting forth such matters with respect to the guaranty authorized by this guaranty ordinance as the County or the Authorized Officer (after consultation with counsel to the County) deems

appropriate, and the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby authorized, if necessary, to attest to the signature of the Authorized Officer and to affix the seal of the County to the Guaranty Agreement.

Section 5. It is hereby found, determined and declared that:

- (a) This guaranty ordinance may be adopted notwithstanding any statutory debt or other limitations, including particularly any limitation or requirement under or pursuant to the Local Bond Law, but the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds which shall be entitled to the benefits of this guaranty ordinance, being an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000, shall, after their issuance, be included in the gross debt of the County for the purpose of determining the indebtedness of the County under or pursuant to the Local Bond Law.
- (b) The principal amount of the Bonds entitled to the benefits of this guaranty ordinance and included in the gross debt of the County shall be deducted and is hereby declared to be and to constitute a deduction from such gross debt under and for all the purposes of the Local Bond Law (i) from and after the time of issuance of the Bonds until the end of the fiscal year beginning next after the completion of the Project, and (ii) in any annual debt statement filed pursuant to the Local Bond Law as of the end of said fiscal year or any subsequent fiscal year if the revenues or other receipts or moneys of the Authority in such year are sufficient to pay its expenses of operation and maintenance in such year and all amounts payable in such year on account of the principal of (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest on all such guaranteed Bonds, all bonds of the County issued as provided in Section 36 of the Act (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-79) and all bonds of the Authority issued under the Act.

Section 6. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The maximum principal amount of Bonds which are hereby and hereunder guaranteed as to the punctual payment of the principal thereof (including mandatory sinking fund installments, if any) and interest thereon is and the maximum estimated cost of the Project to be financed in accordance with the transaction contemplated hereby is \$2,200,000.
- (b) The purpose described in this guaranty ordinance is not a current expense of the County and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (c) A supplemental debt statement of the County has been duly made and filed in the office of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State, and such debt statement shows that while the gross debt of the County, as defined in the Local Bond Law, is increased by this guaranty ordinance by \$2,200,000 in accordance with the provisions of the Act, the net debt of the County is not increased, and the obligation of the County authorized by or incurred pursuant to

the terms of this guaranty ordinance will, so long as deductible from gross debt of the County pursuant to the provisions of the Act, be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- (d) All other items to be contained in a bond ordinance adopted pursuant to the Local Bond Law are hereby determined to be inapplicable to the County's guaranty of the Bonds hereby.
- Section 7. The Authorized Officers are hereby further authorized to execute such other certificates or agreements relating to this guaranty ordinance that may be required by the Authority to comply with the terms of the financing documents relating to the Bonds, and to attest and cause to be affixed the seal of the County to such certificates or agreements, including, without limitation, (i) any guaranty or deficiency agreement of the County and/or City to secure the Bonds, (ii) any agreements or certificates detailing the time and method that payment under this guaranty ordinance shall be made by the County, (iii) any letters of representations or similar undertakings to be executed in connection with the sale of the Bonds, setting forth certain representations, warranties and covenants of the County as an inducement to the purchaser of the Bonds, (iv) any certificates deeming "final" (for the purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the United States Securities and Exchange Commission) any preliminary or final Official Statements of the Authority relating to the Bonds, (v) any continuing disclosure agreement or other instrument undertaking the secondary market disclosure obligations of the County required by said Rule 15c2-12. Such further agreements, instruments or certificates shall not abrogate the County's responsibilities hereunder.
- Section 8. The Authorized Officers are hereby further authorized to (i) manually execute and deliver and the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby further authorized to attest by manual signature to such execution and to affix, imprint, engrave or reproduce the corporate seal of the County to any agreement, document, instrument or closing certificate deemed necessary, desirable or convenient by the Authorized Officers, in their respective sole discretion, after consultation with counsel to the County, to be executed in connection with the execution and delivery of this guaranty ordinance and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby, which determination shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of each such agreement, document, instrument or closing certificate by the party authorized under this guaranty ordinance to execute such agreement, document, instrument or closing certificate, (ii) perform such other actions as the Authorized Officers deem necessary, desirable or convenient in relation to the execution and delivery thereof, and (iii) cause to be prepared any Preliminary Official Statement or Official Statement containing such information of the County as may be necessary for the sale of the Bonds.
- Section 9. The provisions of this guaranty ordinance are severable. To the extent any clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph or provision of this guaranty ordinance shall be declared invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 10. All capitalized words and terms used but not defined in this guaranty ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to such words and terms, respectively, in the preambles hereto.

Section 11. This guaranty ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

Section 12. Upon the adoption hereof, the Clerk of the Board of Freeholders shall forward certified copies of this ordinance to the County Manager, County Counsel, County Bond Counsel, Executive Director of the Authority, and McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC, Bond Counsel to the Authority.

FIRST READING STATEMENT

Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Fiscal Chairman, moved Ordinance Number 766-2015 for First Reading and authorized the Clerk of the Board to advertise same in accordance with the law. The Final Reading and Public Hearing are scheduled for July 16, 2015.

Chairman Jalloh asked for a motion. On a motion made by Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Fiscal Chairman and seconded by Freeholder Estrada roll call showed 9 members of the Board voted in the affirmative.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The meeting is open to the public for the purpose of commenting on Resolutions being offered for adoption only.

Jim Iozzi, founder of the Union County Baseball Association stated he was very excited about the Warinanco Park Ice Rink renovation. He said the size of the fields have doubled allowing the boys and girls to work on their skills. He said he is very excited referring to Resolution Number 2015-535.

Bruce Paterson, Garwood, spoke on the following Resolutions: 2015-525 additional monies in the amount of \$77,000; 2015-527 relocating an existing \$38 million new courthouse building; 2015-528 urged the Board to vote no; 2015-538 asked why money is going to the Parking Authority when four years ago a new parking garage was built; he made comments about donations referring to 2015-526

Gary Parks, Cranford, spoke in favor of Resolution Number 2015-535 and added that will be a great improvement to the County Park System.

Maria Ecchavaria, Elizabeth, complained about the meter fees in Elizabeth. She said they are high compared to other towns; 25 cents for 10 minutes relative to Resolution Number 2014-538.

County Counsel Barry stated that in 1995 the State took over the courts, but the County is still required to provide some items, and one is jury parking for he believes to be about 235 parking spaces. He said it is a State requirement.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

This meeting is open to the public comment on any governmental issue that a member of the public feels may be of concern to the residents of the county.

Chairman Jalloh announced that a public hearing will be held in Rahway on July 1st regarding the proposed improvements to Rahway River Park will be on the County's website for the time and location.

Maria Ecchavaria, Elizabeth, spoke about her friend who is not able to get a police report until her case is closed.

Barbara Majeski, Rahway, stated that the proposed improvements to Rahway River Park will affect the wildlife in the park. He urged the Board to consider Veteran's Field.

Stan Majeski, Rahway, utged the Board to use Veteran's Field instead of Rahway River Park.

Greg Roper, Elizabeth, made comments referring to lack of information provided to the residents regarding Rahway River Park and spoke of things that are not permitted on turf fields, like Javelin, gum, sunflower seeds, drinks, cleats and more. He asked how these regulations will be enforced.

George Katekeritis, Elizabeth, stated that he was overseas for 3 years and has been back for one year. He said he was taken from the airport to the Union County Jail and he said he was not in the right state of mind. He wanted to do harm to himself. She said this is one of the largest grants we have ever received, and it will be used to offset previous land acquisitions by our Open Space, Recreation, and Historic Preservation Trust Fund. She thanked those in advance who worked to obtain this significant new grant.

Freeholder Kowalski announced that Union County has kicked off a new grant program funded through the Trust Fund. The library grant program is designed to help public libraries in Union County enhance their services for children, particularly in the field of digital media. This is a special concern of hers and she thanked all of her colleagues on the Freeholder Board for supporting this effort, which will help more children engage with new opportunities to explore, interact, and imagine. The application deadline is July 3rd and she encouraged all to contact our Trust Fund Administrator for more information at 908-558-2278.

Freeholder Kowalski stated early this week she attended a meeting along with Vice Chairman Bergen at UCC with the Army Corp of Engineers regarding serious flooding regarding.

Freeholder Kowalski added that Bio Blitz last Saturday was fun for the children and their parents.

Freeholder Carter stated that the County's summer schedule of outdoor music and movies got off to an early start on May 30th when the County's Rhythm and Blues by the Brook festival returned to Cedar Brook Park in Plainfield after a hiatus of several years. She said it was a real pleasure to see the community give a big welcome back to Rhythm and Blues, and said she is resolved to make sure that it returns next year, and every year.

Freeholder Carter said the Summer Arts and Family Flix series of free outdoor music and movies kicks off next month, with shows on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings throughout July and August. She said for a complete schedule and all the details visit our Special Event calendar at ucnj.org/parks.

Freeholder Estrada stated last Saturday he attended the opening of the newly redesigned Erxleben Center Pool in Elizabeth. He said the project was undertaken with a \$150,000 grant from our Union County Open Space Recreation and Historic Preservation Fund. He said the Trust Fund was established by popular referendum almost 15 years ago, and it continues to live up to its mission of improving life in communities all over Union County.

Freeholder Estrada congratulated Director Riordan on his retirement from the County and added he will be missed.

Freeholder Mirabella thanked the Mayor of Winfield for staying for the remainder of the meeting.

Freeholder Mirabella stated he attended the UC Vocational-Technical Schools graduation as a proud father and he wish them the best. He also congratulated Director Riordan for a job well done.

Freeholder Mirabella reminded the residents that the Freeholder Board is sponsoring two more recycling events this month. A recycling event for electronic equipment will be held on Saturday, June 27. At this event, Union County residents can get rid of unwanted computers, televisions and other electronic equipment in an

environmentally proper manner. The special E-cycling event will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the campus of Union County Vo-Tech Schools, located at 1776 Raritan Road in Scotch Plains. All residents of Union County can participate at no cost. There is a limit of six electronic items per car. He stated WIB Center is located at the Mills at Jersey Gardens, 651 Kapkowski Road in Elizabeth.

Freeholder Hudak stated that in reference to Resolution 2015-535 he is pleased that they are investing in purchasing a chiller, rather than renting one and will be used all-year for other sports.

Freeholder Hudak thanked the elected officials for attending the meeting and thanked Mayor McManus for advising the Board of the roads that need attention in Winfield.

Freeholder Granados congratulated Freeholder Estrada on being awarded the Hispanic/Latino Alumni Council Society of Scholar Award and for his service and support provided to the Latino community.

Freeholder Wright thanked all of the high school students who participated in this year's UC-STEP campaign. She said as an educator, she knows how valuable it is for young people to take on responsibility, and work together for a goal. This year's group has certainly out-done themselves. Together, in just a few short months, they collected an amazing total of 19,000 donated school supplies. They also raised \$3,000 in cash. She said all of this will go to help ensure that every student in Union County has the supplies they need to succeed in school. UC-STEP is a youth leadership program initiated by Freeholder Carter in 2013. Through UC-STEP, the Freeholder Board provides high school students with support for creating and implementing countywide service programs in their schools and communities. This year's campaign was also supported by the Boys & Girls Clubs of Union County, and Ivy Visions of Plainfield. She said the program also involves a friendly competition, so I'd also like

to congratulate first-place winner Union Catholic, second-place winner UC TEAMS, and third-place winner, Governor Livingston.

County Counsel Barry congratulated Director Riordan on his retirement.

County Manager Faella congratulated Director Riordan on his retirement.

Vice Chairman Bergen stated as soon as the Board is advised of information regarding the July 1st hearing for the Rahway River Park improvements, the public will be informed via website. He stated that Mr. Paterson mischaracterized his question that he was did not want to repeat. He also spoke in regards to the violent death in South Carolina.
