The Union County Youth Services Commission (YSC) is a state-mandated committee represented by state and local juvenile justice stakeholders that plan, monitor and implement programs and services to at-risk youth and those youth involved in the juvenile justice system.

YSC meets monthly to review local service provider outcomes, distribute information on upcoming events and plan initiatives in response to identified gaps in meeting Union County Continuum of Care objectives.

YSC MISSION

To engage in juvenile justice planning and priority-setting in developing new community programming for juveniles and monitoring the effectiveness of existing programs in the community for at-risk youth and youth offenders that assist clients in becoming, independent, healthy, and safe.

YSC GOALS

- Better outcomes for clients and communities through collaboration, integration and shared responsibility.
- Reduce delinquency and antisocial behaviors resulting in youth incarceration and recidivism.

JUVENILE JUSTICE COMMISSION

POINTS OF INTERVENTION DEFINITIONS

Each of the programs in the Union County Youth Services Commission Continuum of care has a specific goal.

- REVENTION: To prevent youth from engaging in anti-social and delinquent behavior and from taking part in other problem behaviors that are pathways to delinquency.
- IVERSION: To provide services and/or informal sanctions to youth who have begun to engage in anti-social and low level delinquent behavior in an effort to prevent youth from continuing on a delinquent pathway.
- to provide short term (45-60 days) supervision sufficient to safely maintain appropriate youth in the community while awaiting the final disposition of their case.
- ISPOSITION: To provide the court with a range of options that match the supervision and service needs of youth in their communities in an effort to reduce recidivism.
- FENTRY: To provide youth transitioning from JJC residential programs and youth returning from secure facilities with additional support for successful reintegration into their communities in an effort to reduce recidivism.

Service Description: The Institute of Music for Children's Afterschool and Summer programs will provide Union County pre-teens and teens, ages 8-18, with delinquency prevention services including: instruction in performing arts (voice, drama, dance, spoken word), instrumental music (guitar, drums, piano, harp violin, cello), and/or multi-media (electric music or video production), with a focus on sustained motivation, regular attendance, at-home practice, and public performance.

Service Description: Using a fun activity and an interactive based program for youth and their mentors that engages the community to ensure mentoring does not occur by chance. It is a comprehensive youth development initiative with group, individual and peer-to-peer mentoring, along with parent activities to help reinforce their child's learning experience using a family engagement process by connecting the families to needed resources on an as needed basis. Role models are integrated into a holistic student support system to help them to formatively focus on their future (positive careers and lifestyles) and an evidence based curriculum is used to help improve pro-social behaviors, thinking, and self-esteem along with team building activities and other positive exposures to assist in positive development. The sessions are, at a minimum, one hour per week, year-round, with a minimum of 26 weeks of participation required in a calendar year to successfully complete the program.

Service Description: The Family Crisis Intervention Unit (FCIU) is a legislatively mandated program for families experiencing family conflict, runaway behavior, truancy, minor delinquency, threat to safety issues, and human trafficking within the family unit warranting intervention. The goal is to mediate the immediate crisis and make recommendations to prevent involvement or further involvement with the court. When all appropriate resources have been utilized, and the family is still in crisis, FCIU has the option of filing a Family Crisis Petition with Family Court. This program has 24/7 response capability.

The Union County Juvenile Detention Center (JDC) Electric Monitoring Program is utilized as an alternative to secure detention upon release, while awaiting disposition to assist in sustaining Union County's continuing participation in New Jersey's Juvenile Detention Alternative Initiative (JDAI). Thirty-five (35) youth are to be served in this program annually. Union County JDC will install and remove the Electronic Monitoring (EM) units as well as provide initial intake.

The primary goal is to prevent detention overcrowding by permitting low risk offenders to be monitored at home while awaiting final court disposition of their case. Youth are monitored 24/7 via a GPS tracking system for compliance with home confinement and other court ordered conditions of release. Provide linkages to resources as needed.

Service Description: A six to nine month program that provides co-occuring mental health and substance abuse treatment for court-involved youth and their families. Services at Trinitas Regional Medical Center provide a development of positive coping skills, identification of relapse triggers, individual and family therapy, group therapy, medication management (if applicable), relapse prevention, random drug screens and regular monitoring. Treatment utilizes an emotionally- restorative and empathy building approach while emphasizing the development of emotional intelligence and healthy personal empowerment for youth and their families. Our clinical team collaborates with other supportive agencies that may be involved in the youth's life such as their school, physician, case management, probation and/or parole in order to create a strong and efficient support system.

Service Description: Trinitas Regional Medical Center's Outpatient Early Intervention and Sexual Offender Program provides trauma-sensitive cognitive behavior therapy and sexual offender specific treatment services to at-risk youth who are not involved in the juvenile justice system, court-ordered youth charged with sexual offending behaviors and reentry youth who are returning from JJC residential/secure facility who are referred by Probation and/or Parole. Programming includes individual, group, and family therapy; Union County S.H.A.R.E (Sexual Harassment and Regaining Empowerment) Program for youth ages 11-18 who are either a victim of a cyber sexting crime or those who have committed a cyber sexting crime.

Target Population: Youth between the ages of 13-21 years old with sexual behaviors and/or sexually abusive behaviors who have been court ordered or serving a term of probation in the disposition category or youth returning from a Juvenile Justice Commission secure and/or residential facility in the re-entry category; youth not court involved who are displaying early signs of inappropriate sexual behavior between the ages of 8-13 years old.

Service Description: An interactive Union County youth, family and community support based program for youth involved in the Juvenile Justice system with an overarching goal of mentoring/coaching that comprehensively helps to redirect misguided youth while helping to reduce recidivism. Youth are assigned program services to possibly include (but not be limited to) family support visits, mentoring/coaching/life-skill services, assisting participant's navigation of required resources and systems, influencing and reinforcing positive decision making, promoting pro-social behavior, assisting in the development of appropriate life structure for self-accountability, acquiring job readiness skills, social services connections, reconnection or enrollment in school, addressing basic needs (such as transportation, health, wellness and recreational activities) and parental support and engagement prior to and upon release from a Juvenile Justice Commission facility along with any other services as deemed appropriate.

Service Description: The Family Engagement Program reduces the barriers families face in successfully supporting their child toward positive outcomes. The goal is to increase positive outcomes for youth involved in the Juvenile Justice System by engaging parents as leaders and decision makers in the Juvenile Justice System while simultaneously building family strengths and a sense of empowerment. The Family Engagement Program provides case management for system-involved youth and their families. Voices of Support monthly meetings are a peer-to-peer network for families currently supporting, or who have previously supported, a youth throughout the Union County Juvenile Justice System. The Family Engagement Program provides parent and professional trainings on Family Engagement.
