WHAT 15 BIO-BLITZ 2010?

A Bio-Blitz is a 24-hour intensive effort to measure the biodiversity ("species richness") of a natural area. Often, Bio-Blitzes are conducted in urban parks and green spaces.

Union County's ecologically diverse and historically rich parkland makes up the fifth oldest county park system in the nation. In 2005, the county began a systematic survey of its parks through the annual Bio-Blitz. This year, our 6th Annual Bio-Blitz will be held at Clark Reservoir and Esposito Park in Clark, and Milton Lake Park in Rahway. Union County will once again partner with Kean University to raise awareness of the diversity of life in this urban/suburban parkland and, in turn, the importance of preserving and managing essential wildlife habitat. We hope to foster a sense of stewardship and appreciation among school and community groups and individuals. Additionally, Bio-Blitz promotes the use of parkland as outdoor classrooms.

Throughout the evening of June 11th and the following day, scientists, expert naturalists, and amateurs will sample and identify as many plant and animal species as possible. The findings from this 24-hour "snapshot" will provide invaluable information about the parks' ecosystems and may help county officials manage parkland for wildlife.

WHY ESPOSITO PARK, CLARK RESERVOIR AND MILTON LAKE PARK?

The Clark Reservoir encompasses 168.25 acres and abuts the 51.44-acre Milton Lake Park. Esposito Park, the site of Bio-Blitz Central, is 13 acres in size, and aside from active recreation amenities such as a skate park and playground, includes a small wetland, stream, and wildflower meadow. Together, the 232.69-acre study site offers ample sampling opportunities. While Milton Lake Park was acquired by the County in 1936, Clark Reservoir and Esposito Park were both acquired in 2007. Originally called the Middlesex Reservoir, it was sold to the Township of Clark in 1997 and then sold to the County for \$1 in 2007. The purchase of the Reservoir and Esposito Park was made possible through the County's Open Space Trust Fund and is in keeping with the historic Olmsted vision of a connected greenway park system. Greenways provide valuable habitat, and act as a stopover and wildlife corridor for resident and migratory wildlife, including red tail hawks, great egrets, great blue herons, screech and great horned owls, coyotes, red fox, and much more.


