Growing Strawberries

Strawberries are loved by students and teachers alike. Not only do kids enjoy eating the juicy berries, but the majority of strawberry care and harvest all happen during the school year (mid-May to mid-June). Join 4-H Agent Jim Nichnadowicz as he demonstrates how to plant strawberries in a children's garden; discusses the easiest ways to control weeds and where to buy the best varieties of strawberries for the sweetest harvest. He will also share references and lesson plans.

Healthy Habits with Garden/Nutrition Education Curriculum: Pre-K—Grade 4 Dr Karen Ensle Grow It, Try It, Like It! Is one example of a garden-themed nutrition education kit featuring MyPlate for child care center staff (Pre-K) that introduces children to fruit and vegetables using hands-on, planting, and nutrition education activities. Gardens in a Hurry—Container Gardening Jim Nichnadowicz

Don't have the time, money, or space to build a full scale raised-bed garden? Then try a container garden. Using simple containers such as buckets, tubs and crates you can build a container garden in minutes. Join 4-H Agent Jim Nichnadowicz as he discusses choosing containers, preparing them, soil and fertilizer, plants that grow best, and how to maintain them. Copies of the curriculum, "Garden in the City" will be given to all participants.
