4-H Master Tree Stewards

The Master Tree Steward Program is an enjoyable free educational program that teaches adult volunteers about the nature and life of trees. Learn how trees start, grow, and reproduce; how to plant trees; their importance to our environment; and fun ways to share this knowledge with children. Homework is easy reading and a simple project. There are no exams or quizzes. After completing the training program, graduates are given a teaching kit and supplies, and are scheduled to teach a one-hour program about once a month to groups of schoolchildren January–May.

Your commitment is SHORT term, but importance and impact is LONG term.

Training is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Wednesdays from September to December. Classes are held on the second floor of the Colleen Fraser building, (in the County Police Complex) 300 North Ave E, in Westfield. (across the street from the Westfield Diner)
