# THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 2017 AGENDA SETTING MEETING AGENDA

#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bruce H. Bergen presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 7:03pm.

#### ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairman Bruce H. Bergen, Vice Chairman Sergio Granados, Freeholder Linda Carter, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella, and Freeholder Vernell Wright were present, with Freeholder Christopher Hudak and Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski absent.

Also present were County Manager Alfred J. Faella, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

#### PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

## OFFICE OF THE UNION COUNTY PROSECUTOR

Grace H. Park, Acting Prosecutor

First Assistant Prosecutor Isenhour represented the Office.

1. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to purchase equipment from Rescue Phone, Inc., Crofton, Maryland in an amount not to exceed \$26,490.00. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Freeholder Estrada inquired as to the type of equipment to be purchased.

First Assistant Prosecutor Isenhour advised the Board that he would prefer not to divulge some of the details of this equipment, but in general terms the equipment involves communication systems to allow law enforcement to do their jobs.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to apply for and accept grant funding from the NJ Department of Law and Public Safety, Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program for the period of January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017 in the amount of \$30,430.02. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

#### **DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES**

Michael Yuska, Director

Deputy Director Laura Scutari represented the Department.

- 1. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement with Travelers Casualty & Surety Co., Hartford, CT for a Public Official Bond for Bibi Taylor, for the period of April 15, 2017 through April 14, 2018 in the amount of \$952.00. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)
- 2. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq. for the Department of Human Services, Division on Aging to Bayshore Ford, New Castle, DE, for the purpose of providing one (1) Food Transport Vehicle in the amount of \$48,128.56. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to award a contract to Remedy Analytics, Milwaukee, WI, to provide Prescription Monitoring Services at a contract commission of 20% of all demonstrated and attested savings that ensue over the length of the contract April 15, 2017 to April 14, 2020. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

Vice Chairman Granados inquired as to the benefit in using this vendor to provide this service.

Deputy Director Laura Scutari advised that this resolution would provide prescription monitoring services, noting that the County would pay a commission of 20% on any savings. Deputy Director Scutari called upon Mr. Weiner of Accusure to provide additional specifics.

Mr. Weiner advised the Board that Remedy Analytics will review the County's existing prescription contract to research potential opportunities for reclassifications and renegotiate rebate amounts into realized savings for the County. He stated that there are no out-of-pocket costs to the County, but rather only a fee based on actual savings to the County.

Vice Chairman Granados inquired as to successful savings from other entities.

Mr. Weiner advised that other entities have seen approximately 20% savings in overall prescription costs.

County Manager Faella stated that all county employees would maintain their same level of availability to current prescription drugs.

4. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement to provide liability coverage for the operation of the ambulances owned and operated by the County Emergency Services in

the amount of \$10,495.00 with Western World Insurance Company, Franklin Lakes, New Jersey, for the period of April 26, 2017 to April 25, 2018. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

### DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING, PUBLIC WORKS & FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

Joseph Graziano, Director

1. Amending Resolution Number 2016-798, a Professional Engineering Service Contract with T&M Associates, of Middletown, New Jersey, to provide additional professional engineering services associated with the Groundwater Remediation and Monitoring at the Venneri Complex, Westfield, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$2,100.00 for a new contract amount not to exceed \$182,660.00. (Union County Engineering Project Number 2011-031) (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional details.

Director Graziano advised that T&M Associates is the LSRP Engineers for this project. He noted that one of the well caps were damaged and needed additional repairs.

2. Amending Resolution Number 2015-131, a Professional Engineering Service Contract with Maser Consulting, PA, of Red Bank, New Jersey, to provide additional professional engineering services associated with the Replacement of Mountain Avenue Minor Bridge, Be26, Township of Berkeley Heights, in an amount not to exceed \$19,700.00 for a new contract amount not to exceed \$226,700.00. (Union County Engineering Project Number 2013-024) (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional details.

Director Graziano advised that there were additional unanticipated investigations required for a stream under the bridge being replaced. He advised that there may be a need to redirect the stream; which would require additional DEP permitting. He also noted that there was an easement issue that was unanticipated.

- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to award a contract to Rolta International, Inc., of Alpharetta, Georgia to maintain, manage, and implement the County secured GIS websites for an amount not to exceed \$25,300. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Engineering, Public Works and Facilities Management, Division of Engineering: Manor II Electric, of Holmdel, New Jersey, for the purpose of Installation of an Emergency Generator at the Union County John H. Stamler Police Academy, Scotch Plains, New Jersey, for the amount not to exceed \$355,000.00. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Chairman Bergen asked if the generator is a new purchase or replacing an older generator.

Director Graziano advised that this resolution would authorize the purchase of a new generator for the Police Academy.

Freeholder Estrada asked what the contingency was for a backup generator; if it was necessary.

Director Graziano advised that the County could utilize a portable trailer generator at Emergency Management Offices and/or at the Public Works Building. He advised that this generator would be a permanent generator that will enable the County to use the Police Academy as a Emergency Management Center in the event something happens at the Westfield Emergency Management Center.

- 5. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract extension originally obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Engineering, Public Work & Facilities, Division of Facilities Management, Division of Park Maintenance, Waste Management of NJ, Inc., Ewing, NJ, for the purpose of providing Construction Debris Disposal Services, Type 13, 13C and 27, twenty-four (24) consecutive months, commencing May 11, 2017 through May 10, 2019, in an amount not exceed \$65,700. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 6. Amending Resolution Number 2016-193, (BA#84-2013) a contract awarded through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq., to Maffey's Security Group., Elizabeth, New Jersey approving Change Order Number One (1) increasing the original contract amount by \$125,000 for a new total contract amount not to exceed \$465,500. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional details.

Director Graziano advised that prior to the sale of Runnells Hospital, the State of New Jersey issued new suicide prevention regulations which were realized after the sale of the hospital. He advised that this resolution is strictly for Cornerstone Hospital. He clarified that since the regulations were issued prior to the sale; the County is responsible for the required updates.

- 7. Resolution authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement with Vermeer North Atlantic Sales & Service, Lumberton, New Jersey, for the purchasing of various Vermeer Parts for the Vermeer Compost Turner in an amount not to exceed \$40,000. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 8. Resolution concurring with the Township of Berkeley Heights granting permission to the Mt. Carmel Society to close Springfield Avenue from the intersection of Snyder Avenue to the Berkeley Heights/Long Hill Township Bridge from 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 15, 2017 to 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, July 16, 2017 for the annual festival and fireworks display. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 9. Resolution granting permission to the Township of Berkeley Heights for the Suburban Chamber of Commerce to close Springfield Avenue from Snyder Avenue to Plainfield Avenue on Sunday, June 25, 2017 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. for the Annual Berkeley Heights Street Fair. Also, granting permission to hang a banner on Springfield Avenue from May 29, 2017 to June 26, 2017 for advertising the Annual Berkeley Heights Street Fair. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 10. Resolution concurring with the Township of Berkeley Heights granting permission to the Berkeley Heights Rescue Squad to hang a banner across Springfield Avenue from April 15, 2017 through May 28, 2017 to advertise the Squad's Annual Membership Drive. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

11. Resolution concurring with the Borough of Kenilworth to close the Boulevard from 14th Street to 24th Street on Sunday, May 21, 2017, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. for the 2017 Annual Street Fair. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

#### **DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES**

#### Frank Guzzo, Director

1. Approving Change Order Number One to Bid Agreement 15-2015, a contract with Motivated Security Services for Cornerstone Behavioral Health Hospital, for an additional \$8980 for additional security coverage not to exceed a total of \$91,264.36 through May 10, 2017. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional details.

Director Guzzo advised that this resolution coincides with Director Graziano's resolution, noting that it would authorize additional security at Cornerstone while the work is being completed. He stated that the security is necessary as the contract will require tools within a locked unit; clarifying that this will ensure the safety of the patients.

Director Guzzo made comments relative to the State of New Jersey's new regulations and need for the retrofitting work to be done at Cornerstone Hospital. He did note that much of the work that was necessary was done so in-house.

Freeholder Estrada inquired if there is any other retrofitting that the County would need to spend to be in compliance with the new regulations.

Director Guzzo advised that the State did an inspection and cited this infraction, but advised that once this is completed, the County would be up to code.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a Lease Agreement with Sharma Realty Investments LLC, Elizabeth, New Jersey, for the rental of 30 parking spaces located at 432 Westminster Avenue, Elizabeth, for Division of Social Services' employee parking in the amount of \$75 per space or \$2,250 per month, total amount not to exceed \$18,000 for the period of May 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Carter asked for additional details.

Director Guzzo advised that this resolution would authorize the leasing of additional spaces for employees of CWA/Welfare. He reminded the Board of the collective bargaining unit's concerns with employee parking, and advised that this lease would provide 30 spaces at a rate of \$75 per space.

- 3. Authorizing the use of Competitive Contracting, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1 et seq., to administer services for the Family Justice Center. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 4. Amending Resolution 2017-182 to reflect a 2017 Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) award increase in the amount of \$191,039, for a new grand total of \$424,354, to be allocated as specified in the 2nd amended 2017 CSBG Spending Plan and to reflect a three month grant extension through June 30, 2017, with no other changes to terms of agreements. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

- 5. Approving a pre-qualified list of professional medical services for the patients of Cornerstone Behavioral Health Hospital of Union County for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 6. Authorizing the County Manager to execute agreements with municipalities for the 2017 Senior Focus Initiative in an amount not to exceed \$430,655 in accordance with the 2017 Senior Focus Spending Plan. (Chairman Bruce H. Bergen)

#### Ronald Zuber, Director

Director Zuber asked for the Board's indulgence to add one resolution to seek a grant from the National Recreation Parks Association's Community Engagement Grant; where the County would seek to apply stream work at Rizzuto Park, Elizabeth.

Freeholder Estrada asked if part of the grant will be used to address the trees along the stream.

Director Zuber advised that it would, noting that there are a lot of invasive vines growing and pulling at the trees.

- 1. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Parks and Recreation: Dellano's Food, Long Valley, NJ, for the purpose of providing concessions, for the period of two (2) seasons with an option to extend for two (2) seasons subject to resolution, in the amount of \$22,304.00. (Vice Chairman Sergio Granados)
- 2. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Parks and Recreation: Ray's Food & Ice Cream Concessions, Inc., Woodland Park, NJ, for the purpose of providing concessions, for the contract period of two (2) seasons with the option to extend for two (2) seasons subject to resolution, in the amount of \$10,200.00. (Vice Chairman Sergio Granados)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Office of Cultural & Heritage Affairs, to reallocate funds received from the NJSCA to 34 Union County agencies and organizations as recommended by the Arts Grant Committee of the Cultural and Heritage Programs Advisory Board and subsequently approved by the entire Advisory Board in the amount of \$64,000.00. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
- 4. Authorizing the County Manager to award CY2017 Union County History Grants to fifteen (15) recipients in the total amount of \$22,000.00. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)
