#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bruce H. Bergen called the meeting to order at 7:04pm.

#### **ROLL CALL**

Roll call showed Chairman Bruce H. Bergen, Vice Chairman Sergio Granados, Freeholder Linda Carter, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh, Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella and Freeholder Vernell Wright were present, with Freeholder Christopher Hudak absent.

Also present were County Manager Alfred J. Faella, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

Chairman Bergen congratulated Sheriff Cryan on his election victory.

Sheriff Cryan provided the Board with an overview of the three resolutions.

There were no questions or comments from the Board.

Director Graziano advised this contract was obtained through a bid. He added that this is to install a culvert in Summit. He advised Summit will provide \$188,000 towards this project, and the County will provide \$698,715. He advised that the City of Summit will be covering the costs associated with the sanitary sewers project under the street.

7. Director Graziano advised that the County is looking to extend current contracts.

Freeholder Carter asked the Director to provide additional information.

Director Graziano advised that the county is looking to extend current contracts.

He added that these contracts (#7 & #8) used to be awarded together as one contract, noting that the County was spending approximately \$432,000/year. He advised that last year (with the contracts split) the County awarded a total of \$115,000.

9. Resolution ratifying the permission granted to the Township of Scotch Plains with regards to the closure of Park Avenue between Front Street and East Second on Saturday, November 11, 2017 from 10:45 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. for a Veteran's Ceremony. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

#### **DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE**

# Bibi Taylor, Director

1. Resolution Prescribing the Details and Bond Form Thereof for \$3,300,000 County College Bonds of 2017 (Chapter 12 State Aid) dated December 1, 2017, Authorizing the Publication, Printing and Distribution of a Notice of Sale and the Publication of a Summary Notice of Sale and Prescribing the Form Thereof for Such Bonds, Approving the Preparation, Distribution and Execution of a Preliminary and a Final Official Statement for such Bonds, Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure of Financial Information, Covenanting to Comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Authorizing Various Matters in Connection with Electronic Bidding for the Bonds. (Freeholder Alexander Mirabella)

Freeholder Estrada inquired if this \$3.3M was budgeted as part of the \$72M.

Director Taylor advised that this resolution represents an additional \$3.3M. She advised that the State typically advised the County in early February of Chapter 12 (which offset County College capital projects) funding availability. She stated that the State typically funds 50% of the debt service.

Freeholder Estrada asked for clarification if the County's portion would be \$1.8M or \$3.3M.

Director Taylor clarified that the County's portion would be \$1.8.

Freeholder Estrada inquired if the initial amount in the budget will now be lessened by \$1.8M.

Director Taylor advised that was the case.

- 2. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed second one (1)-year contract renewal to Primepoint LLC, Mt. Holly, New Jersey, to provide Integrated Human Resource and Outsourced Payroll System services starting December 1, 2017 and ending November 30, 2018 for an amount not to exceed \$180,000.00. The second one (1) year contract renewal was originally obtained through the competitive contract process in accordance with New Jersey competitive contracting law, and awarded with Resolution Number 2013-960. (Freeholder Alexander Mirabella)
- 3. Authorizing the County Manager to award and exercise the option to extend the current contract for an additional twenty (24) months period to Pino Consulting Group, Toms River, New Jersey, for the purpose of providing consulting services for preparation of the Indirect Cost Plan and Medicare and Medicaid Cost Reports for Cornerstone Behavioral Health Hospital of Union County for the contract period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019 in the total amount of not to exceed \$164,000. Director Taylor advised that her office is still in communications with the various departments with their various needs.

### **DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES**

#### Debbie-Ann Anderson, Director

1. Rescinding Resolution Number 2017-876, a professional services contract awarded to Yelena Samofalov, MD of Scotch Plains, NJ for the provision of medical supervision to the Union County Pediatric Immunization Clinic in the total amount not to exceed \$16,500 for the period of October 27, 2017 through September 26, 2018. (Freeholder Bette Jane Kowalski)

Vice Chairman Granados asked for further clarification.

Director Anderson advised the resolution being rescinded authorized the County to enter into a contract, however the physician had declined to accept the contract. She advised the Board that the County can utilize a position currently within Cornerstone.

Freeholder Estrada asked for additional clarification.

Director Anderson advised that the young lady decided that she didn't want to enter into a part-time position for this service and will be using the funds towards another individual.

Freeholder Estrada inquired if the funds will be the same amount.

County Counsel advised that the funding has been authorized however the rescission is relative to the individual authorized to be paid for the services. He advised that at some point in the near future another resolution will be put forth to the Board to award the contract to a new individual.

Freeholder Estrada asked for further clarification as to how this resolution is related to Corrnerstone.

Deputy Director Dinsmore advised that the day after the resolution was adopted, the contract was presented to Dr. Samofalov and a business registration certificate was not presented to the County. She advised that the County currently has a physician under contract at Cornerstone. She advised that in order to avoid shutting down the immunization clinic they will be using that physician under the terms of his current contract. She advised that the County will seek out another physician to award a contract for the services on a more permanent basis.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION**

Freeholder Estrada inquired as to what exactly the County is achieving through this contract.

Director Moran advised that this software license was originally transferred from Atlantic Health at no cost; advising that the County has been using this for EMS dispatch. He advised that this software standardizes the call procedure and provides pre-arrival instructions to the caller; inclusive of instructions on how to deliver a baby or assist when someone has a heart-attack. He advised on how the software can be utilized by the Law Enforcement agencies as well. He advised that the maintenance agreement is for 5 years.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with ICL Performance Products LP, Willington, DE to provide a fire suppression course to approximately 36 firefighters from the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Region, through the 2017 UASI Grant, in an amount not to exceed \$175,200. (Freeholder Linda Carter)
