Undersheriff Amilcar Colon represented the department

Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a contract with SPEX Forensics, Edison, New Jersey, for the purchase of LED ultra-portable forensic light source and laboratory unit lightsource for the upgrade of the Union County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit, in the amount not to exceed \$27,480.00. Freeholder Carter asked Undersheriff Colon in regards to the upgrade what do we currently have.

Undersheriff Colon deferred to Lt. David Quill to elaborate in regards to the LED ultra-portable forensic light source and laboratory unites.

Lt. Quill advised the Board that this gives us the cutting edge to help us develop evidence, the lab unit is stationed in the laboratory it's not a portable unit it has multiple forensic lights, helps filter out background, and enhance fingerprints helps develop a suspect. The portable one is just a hand held flash light version not as powerful but it can help trace evidence out in the field at scene.

Freeholder Mirabella asked Lt. Quill is this additional or replacement equipment.

Lt. Quill advised the Board that we have smaller version that we keep in the truck and in the past they were multiple units for each lights have to be individuals based on the lights that you are using, the new lab version this is the one that's like a one stop shopping for everything it has multiple filters can be changed quickly scanning an item of evidence. The hand held is much more powerful than anything we have had in the past.

Freeholder Mirabella asked Lt. Quill what is the life expectancy for this equipment.

Lt. Quill advised the Board at least five to eight years.

Deputy County Manager/Director Wagner advised the Board that it's operated through Union County College, it used to be at Mills at Jersey Garden Mall it has been relocated to the Kellogh Building because we're about to start work on the Simon Youth Academy Alternative High School at the mall.

Freeholder Jalloh asked Deputy County Manager/Director Wagner is the County running it or the agency at the Mills.

Deputy County Manager/Director Wagner advised the Board that's Union County College it's done through an RFP process and they prevailed in the RFP.

To date there has been 101 unduplicated passengers that have been using the Route 22 shuttle from 2017 we had about 73,188 rides throughout the county.

Freeholder Estrada asked Director Zuber what is the projected expenditure in terms of the project.

Director Zuber advised that this is for design inspection services and construction management and we don't have an estimate at this point.

Freeholder Estrada asked the Director that amount could change if it's super high.

Director Zuber advised that the amount we're asking for in capital could change but the amount regarding this contract they were the low bidder.

Freeholder Estrada asked the Director the design has not gone to bid yet.

Director Zuber replied no.

Freeholder Estrada asked the Director is it customarily to do it that way before we have the design is it the normal way that we go out for bid, we first assign the person who is going to the construction administration and everything else before we get the bids back.

Director Zuber advised the Board that the scope of this job means demolition of the building and pool then also designing the building, the concession stand and the locker room that goes with it and in most cases this is the way that we do it.

Freeholder Estrada asked the Director do we demolish everything and start new.

Director Zuber advised the Board that we demolish everything but one building which has historical significant.

Freeholder Estrada asked the Director can we do this in enough hours so that we don't lose the use of the pool in one year or two.

Director Zuber advised the Board that the plan is hopefully to have this out for bid as soon as possible so that the work can start almost immediately when the pool closes at the end of the summer. We will start pool demoing it, filling it in and having zero interest pool and next summer go to the next phase and if we have to work out of a trailer that's what we will do.

Freeholder Estrada the Director we're not closing the pool.

Director Zuber advised the Board that we're demolishing the pool and having all of the work done throughout the fall and winter months.

Chairman Granados asked the Clerk of the Board to make note that Freeholder Hudak is present.
