

History, Location and Highlights

The Borough of Kenilworth is located in the center of Union County and is bordered by Cranford and Roselle Park to the south, Springfield to the west, and Union to the north. Kenilworth was originally developed when the New Orange Industrial Association purchased farms and land in the area in the 1890s. It was incorporated as a borough in 1907. The borough is governed by the Mayor/Council form of local government. Kenilworth has a six-member borough council and the mayor is directly elected by the voters. Kenilworth is a small, close-knit community, with quiet residential neighborhoods and a downtown area located along Kenilworth Boulevard.

Transportation


Kenilworth is traversed by the Garden State Parkway and is close to Route 22 which runs through Union to the north. Although it does not have a train station stop, Kenilworth is close to the Raritan Valley Line with stops in nearby Roselle Park, Cranford and Union. Kenilworth is served by NJ Transit bus lines 58, 65, 114 and 117. Over

92.3% of working Kenilworth residents commute by private automobile (88.5% drove alone and 3.8% carpooled) and 3.8% take public transportation. The average commute time for a Kenilworth worker is 26 minutes. 34.3% worked outside Union County and 5.7% worked outside of New Jersey.

Housing

Kenilworth has 2,910 housing units, nearly all of which are occupied. 73.5% of its housing stock is single-unit, detached, 1.5% is single-unit attached, and 19.6% are in structures with two units. 5.3% are in structures with three or more units. Over 70% of housing was built prior to 1960. 78.1% of Kenilworth's occupied housing is owner-occupied. The median house value in Kenilworth is \$347,500 and the median gross rent is \$1,421.
