OFFICE OF THE UNION COUNTY PROSECUTOR

Michael A. Monahan, Acting Prosecutor

First Assistant Prosecutor Al Cernadas Jr. represented the Prosecutor's Office.

1. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to enter into an agreement with Prevention Links of Roselle, New Jersey for the period of May 1, 2019 through October 31, 2019 in the amount of \$25,000.00 to provide a minimum of two recovery specialists on site during the one week Operation Helping Hand program for approximately 100 participants. Further, Prevention Links agrees to provide six months of follow up, reporting, and limited case management. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Granados asked First Assistant Prosecutor Cernadas to elaborate on the program.

First Assistant Prosecutor Cernadas advised that the program related to users in possession of narcotics that are apprehended by law enforcement. He noted that following the arrest, offenders are given the option of customary processing on possession charges or they can opt to participate in a rehabilitation treatment program to help with their addiction. First Assistant Prosecutor Cernadas added that out of 100 individuals arrested on possession charges, over 90 had accepted the treatment alternative.

Vice Chairman Mirabella applauded the Prosecutor's involvement with Prevention Links, citing the invaluable services provided by the organization.
