CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Sergio Granados presided and called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed Chairman Sergio Granados, Vice Chairman Bette Jane Kowalski, Freeholder Bruce H. Bergen, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Angela R. Garretson, Freeholder Alexander Mirabella, and Freeholder Rebecca Williams were present, with Freeholder Christopher Hudak and Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward Oatman, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

PRAYER AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

Chairman Sergio Granados asked for a moment of silence in recognition of the recent passing of Reverend Dr. Clarence Bauknight, Jr, grandfather of Freeholder Mohamed S. Jalloh.

PRESENTATIONS FROM THE BOARD

A resolution presentation will be made by the Freeholder Rebecca Williams to Jennifer Popper recognizing and commending her on the 800 plus mile walk to Maine and back in memory of her husband, Michael; and further commending her upon raising funds for charities and establishing the Michael Popper EMT Scholarship for the Plainfield Rescue Squad.

Chairman Granados called upon Freeholder Rebecca Williams for the presentation. Freeholder Rebecca Williams presented a resolution to Jennifer Popper of Plainfield congratulating her on walking over 800 miles from Union County to Maine. Freeholder Williams read excerpts of the resolution and asked Jennifer Popper to say a few words.

Jennifer Popper thanked Freeholder Rebecca Williams and the entire Board for the recognition, stating her walk started on National Trails Day on June 2, 2018, beginning at Union County's Lenape Park. Jennifer said Union County has some of the most scenic, the most protected and most accessible trail routes. She stated that the Greenway is a 3,000 mile route that runs from Key

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West, Florida to Canada, noting that she hiked through seven states (New Jersey to Maine). Jennifer said her walk was based on raising money for the East Coast Greenway Alliance and the Free-Walker walking group. She said the creator of the group was present, and added that anyone who wanted to join could contact freewalker.org.

Freeholder Williams added that Jennifer had a goal of raising \$15,000 for Free-walkers and the East Coast Greenway and she raised \$17,000 for these two non-profit organizations.

County Clerk Rajoppi invited the Board to attend the swearing in ceremony of her new Deputy, Claire Fernandez, on Friday at 3:30pm in Judge Cassidy's Courtroom. She provided an overview of her three resolutions.

Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement with Intersection, Secaucus, New Jersey for the purpose of providing design and advertising space for the Union County Votes App at NJ Transit train stations in advance of the 2019 Primary and General Elections in an amount not to exceed \$21,000. (Chairman Sergio Granados)

Authorizing the County Manager to make any and all purchases of goods and/or services required in the process of preparing and conducting an election to be provided by various vendors and to provide miscellaneous election services which might arise, in an amount not to exceed \$17,500.00 for the 2019 elections. Freeholder Estrada offered comments asking the Sheriff to extend his compliments to the Sheriff are the Honor Guards, noting that they are active and doing an outstanding job.

Chairman Granados asked Sheriff Corvelli to elaborate on Resolution #2.

Sheriff Corvelli stated the BEAST software is an upgrade to the evidence collection and inventory system. He noted the importance of the system to the CSU Unit.

Chief of Staff Tom Koundry represented the Office.

There were no questions or comments by the Board.

1. Authorizing the County Manager, through the Union County Prosecutor's Office, to enter into a contract with O'Brien & Kolano, LLC, of Glen Gardner, NJ to provide Crisis Intervention Training to law enforcement and mental health personnel in an amount not to exceed \$22,400. (Chairman Sergio Granados)

Chairman Granados stated that the Crisis Intervention Training is a great service provided by the Prosecutor's Office for the law enforcement around the County.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING, PUBLIC WORKS & FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

Director Joseph Graziano

1. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an Agreement between the County of Union and Borough of New Providence for the installation of an Illuminated Pedestrian Warning Sign at the Intersection of Maple Street and Mountain Avenue (CR 622). **(Vice Chairman Bette Jane Kowalski)**

Freeholder Mirabella asked the Director to elaborate as to the process the various municipalities have to take for the sign installation of an illuminated pedestrian warning sign; and inquired if an Engineering Study is necessary.

Director Graziano advised the Engineering Department has been working with New Providence over a year with their traffic and safety officer, adding that numerous changes (to signage) had been made on their roads. He advised that the individual town passed a resolution, and the County is now passing a concurring resolution. He advised that this resolution is a maintenance resolution for them to maintain the sign, noting that it is a solar powered illuminated light. He added that such signage as has been done in Cranford and Westfield. He stated that the County considers these on an on-going basis as the municipalities request such from the County. He advised that a study is done to make sure they are warranted.

2. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract for the Department of Engineering, Public Works and Facilities: Division of Facilities Management with the Elizabeth Parking Authority, Elizabeth, New Jersey, for the purpose of providing Jury Parking, as per state mandate, for a contract period of twelve (12) consecutive months from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 in an amount not to exceed \$240,000. (Vice Chairman Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Estrada noted that the resolution is it a not to exceed amount, asked Director Graziano how much was used up last year.

Director Graziano stated the County utilized the entire allotment \$240,000, and added that his Department uses the entire amount every year. He stated that the contract is for 125 parking spaces, at \$8.00 dollars a day for 20 days a month, which equates to \$20,000 per month for an annual amount of \$240,000. He said it's the same price since 2015; noting that prior to that, the cost was \$6.00 per day. He added that this is for jury parking.

Freeholder Estrada asked if the amount is guaranteed no matter what.

Director Graziano advised that the amount is indeed guaranteed, noting that day there were 300 jurors and that 125 jurors parked in this parking lot and the other 175 parked elsewhere.

Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Parks and Recreation: Frank Carrajat D/B/A Middle Valley Farms of Mendham, NJ, for the purpose of providing hay (BA 55-2018), for an open ended contract period of 24 months, from the date of signing of the contract, in the amount \$382,720. (Chairman Sergio Granados)
- 2. Authorizing the County Manager to award the proposed contract obtained through advertised public bidding in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq: Department of Parks & Recreation: John R. Knabb & Sons, for the purpose of providing straw (BA 56-2018), for an open ended contract period of 24 months, from the date of signing of the contract, in the amount of \$157,500. Freeholder Mirabella asked Director Zuber for an explanation of an "open-ended contract".

Director Yuska responded on Director Zuber's behalf. He advised that the County is using an open ended contract, because the County doesn't know how much straw is needed. He noted that straw is needed for keeping the stall clean while the hay is the feed. He advised the amount will depend on how many horses there are. He added that the Department tries to do the best it can to estimate the amount of money needed, but that this "open-ended" contract allows language in the bid to state "more or less" which would enable the Department to purchase more (straw) if needed. He advised that if the contract was not open ended the law would make us go out to bid again. He assured the Board that the Department always comes back to the Board when more money is needed.

Freeholder Mirabella said it seems like we have a history with the amount of this particular product, and asked if it varies that much every two year period.

Director Yuska stated it's more of an insurance policy so that we don't take the Board's time to redo a whole bid.

Freeholder Mirabella said his preference would be for a not to exceed number. and asked how many other contracts the County uses this "open-ended" process.

Directory Yuska stated that the County uses approximately 25 to 30 open-ended contracts. He advised that he made sure that all of the plumbing and electrical contracts use the open-ended contract so that all the hours would be flexible if the County had to increase them due to some contingency. He advised that the State prefers this process over Change Orders.

Freeholder Mirabella stated he knows why it's done and that he would like to have a list of these 25-30 contracts.

Director Yuska said he will get the list for him.

County Counsel Barry stated for additional clarity, that the "open-ended" contract provides the County with some flexibility, and noted that the bid and the resolution itself, is a not to exceed amount.

3. Authorizing County Manager to execute an Access Agreement through Rahway Board of Education Property to allow access to Madison Avenue Park common area encompassing both our properties. (Chairman Sergio Granados)

Chairman Granados said Mayor Giacobbe is here along with the soccer team in support of this resolution. He asked the Director to clarify that this is the final piece in making sure the County has the MOU (with Rahway Board of Education) to go out to bid to build the turf field at Madison Avenue.

Director Zuber stated the MOU allows us to access the Board of Education property onto our parkland. He advised that the County plans on going out to bid this month and look to award in January (2019).
