AGENDA SETTING MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Kowalski presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 7:08 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed, Chairman Bette Jane Kowalski, Vice Chairman Alexander Mirabella, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Angela R. Garretson, Freeholder Sergio Granados, Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Freeholder Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, Freeholder Andrea Staten, and Freeholder Rebecca Williams were present.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act was read by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

PRESENTATIONS FROM THE BOARD

Freeholder Garretson and Freeholder Granados made the certificate and check presentation to the 2018/2019 NJAC Scholars: Aimmi Gonzales and Lucas Jacomes (Investors Bank Scholarship) and Starria Armwood (PSE&G Scholarship). New Jersey Association of Counties Executive Director John Donnadio; Investor Savings Vice President of Business Banking Carmen Rivera; PSE&G Public Affairs Manager Mike Coyle; and Union County Vocational-Technical Schools Superintendent Gwen Ryan joined the Freeholders for the presentation.

John G. Donnadio, Esq., Executive Director of NJAC, provided some background information about NJAC and spoke relative to the scholarships being presented, noting that since 2011 the organization has been able to give over \$250,000 to over 300 county vocational school graduates. He thanked the Board and the county staff for their continued input and support over the years as well as PSE&G and Investor Savings Bank, among others for their generosity.

Freeholder Granados thanked the various organizations for their educational contributions. He also spoke briefly about Starria Armwood and marveled at her intelligence, educational ambitions, and community involvement, noting that she was already attending Kean University as she finished up her senior year in high school.

Lucas Jacomes thanked the Board for the scholarship award, noting how important scholarship money is. He added that he would be attending Ramapo College and majoring in computer sciences.

Aimmi Gonzales was not present to receive her scholarship award. Superintendent Gwen Ryan accepted the award on her behalf.

Chairman Kowalski, joined by Vice Chairman Mirabella and Freeholder Staten, made a resolution presentation to U.C. Vocational-Technical Schools Superintendent Gwen Ryan.

Chairman Kowalski spoke relative to some of Ms. Ryan's professional accomplishments and congratulated her on being promoted to permanent Superintendent.

Superintendent Gwen Ryan thanked the Board for the honor. She expressed her excitement relative to her new position, noting that she was humbled by the recognition and support and looked forward to working with the Board in the coming years in her new capacity.

Chairman Kowalski, accompanied by Vice Chairman Mirabella and county employee Felice Twaddle made a resolution presentation to the Shoprite of Clark for their continued generosity as it relates to donating various goods for county-wide events.

Felice Twaddle expressed her gratitude towards Shoprite of Clark for their extreme generosity, detailing several recent contributions, including their donation of 2,000 pieces of fruit for the Pride in the Park Event, among others.

Store Manager Frank Juba thanked the Board for the recognition, noting what an honor it was to be able to give back to the community.

First Assistant Prosecutor Albert Cernadas Jr. represented the Office.

Authorizing the County Manager through the Office of the Prosecutor, to apply for and accept funding from the State of New Jersey, Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of State Police Grant Program for project titled FY18 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program in the amount of \$23,478.58 in federal funds for the period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019. Freeholder Hudak asked what items and or supplies would be covered under the shared services agreement and asked for clarification related to which county would have access to said services.

First Assistant Prosecutor Al Cernadas advised that the shared service agreement has been in place for approximately six years, adding that this item is meant to update the existing agreement. He noted that Middlesex County would be responsible for the DNA analyst's salary and benefits as well as the consumables and chemicals utilized. He added that the agreement would entitle U.C. to 40% of the analyst's labor.

OFFICE OF THE UNION COUNTY SHERIFF

Peter Corvelli, Sheriff

Undersheriff Dennis Burke represented the Office.

1. Authorizing the County Manager to amend the Resolution Number 2018-910, a contract awarded through advertised public bidding (BA#48-2018) in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1, et. seq., to Maffey's Security Group, approving Change Order Number 1 for Security Systems Service, Installation and Maintenance for the Union County Sheriff's Office only. This Change Order will increase the contract amount by \$97,500.00 for a new contract amount not to exceed \$585,000.00. **(Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)**

Due to the sizeable increase, Vice Chairman Mirabella asked Undersheriff Burke to elaborate on the Change Order.

Undersheriff Burke advised that the item related to a two-year renewal contract related to the installation and maintenance of all surveillance equipment. He noted that the increase related to funding for cameras and servers, among other things associated with the Rotunda Project.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Deputy Administrator Linda Wise and Warehouse Supervisor Phillip Powers represented the Office.

Warehouse Supervisor Phil Powers advised that the agreement aimed to establish a separate and secure line of communication between the BOE warehouse and the County Clerk's Office for the purpose of election programming and result tallying.

County Manager Oatman further advised that the need for a private network was a result of new legislation which mandated an exclusive and secure line for election-related communications and access.

Director Anderson advised that the program related to transportation services provided by Paratransit for Veterans and noted that the initiative was being funded by the Department of Military Veterans Affairs.

Freeholder Hudak asked Director Anderson to elaborate on the services provided by this initiative and address the fees associated with the initiative.

Director Anderson referenced the opioid crisis public meeting held in May, noting some of the obstacles still faced by the county in addressing the growing opioid epidemic. She advised that through this initiative, individuals struggling with addiction would have round-the-clock access to this recovery resource. Director Anderson added that Prevention Links would be monitoring these individuals during and following treatment. She noted that since Union County did not have an in-patient detox center, through this initiative, transportation services would also be made available to ensure that affected individuals have access to essential resources to facilitate recovery. Director Anderson further advised that due to a new federal mandate, Medicaid and Medicare would cover the fees associated with the recovery programs. She added that Prevention Links would be directly working with the various rehabilitation facilities to ensure that paperwork was processed and coverage secured.

3. She added that Dudley House, an 18-bed facility, was scheduled to open its doors on July 1st to accommodate male veterans while more permanent housing could be secured.

Chairman Kowalski congratulated Freeholder Hudak on being awarded the Pamela Capaci Hero for Recovery Award by the Raymond J. Lesniak Experience, Strength & Hope Recovery High School. She commended him for his hard work related to substance abuse prevention and recovery.

DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION

Freeholder Hudak asked Director Zuber for an update on Wheeler Spray Park since its inception in May.

Director Zuber noted that the attraction has been a success, citing that nearly 10,000 residents had used the facility in the last few weekends, 9,800 of those being in-county residents.
