Stated Goals of UCPO's New Leadership:

- 1) Strengthen the public's trust in law enforcement.
- 2) Reduce violence in our community.
- 3) Empathetically and effectively address the opioid epidemic.
- 4) Improve the training and safety of our officers.
- 5) Protect Union County's children



- **1- Strengthen the public's trust in law enforcement:** In order to *protect* the community, one must have the *trust* of the community, and in order for the community to *trust* us they need to *know* us.
- Utilized a vacant prosecutor's agent position to recruit and hire a Community Outreach Manager to have a coordinated effort officewide in outreach.
- Increased community presence. UCPO staff attended every national night out across the county. Senior Staff at over 100 community outreach events in just the last quarter of the year.
- Formalized a written *Brady/Giglio* policy to improve compliance with rules governing disclosure of exculpatory and impeachment evidence to the defense in criminal trials.



2- Reduce Violence in Our Community

- Created the Major Crimes Division maximizing existing and available resources and directing them to serve a core mission of violence reduction through proactive violence prevention.
- Created the Intelligence-Driven Prosecution Unit, which fosters a more collaborative approach and better intelligence-sharing across county agencies.
- Began plans for the expansion of the Counter-Terrorism Task Force.



3- Empathetically and effectively address the opioid epidemic.

- Created the Opioid Task Force to aggressively and strategically pursue those who profit from poisoning the people we are sworn to protect.
- Sought and secured grant funding to expand the generous existing support from the Board of Chosen Freeholders and Governor Murphy, and began coordinating the launch of Operation Helping Hand 24/7/365.



4- Improve the Training and Safety of Our Officers

- Swore-in Chief Patricia Gusmano with nearly 30 years of intense investigative experience to not only lead this office into the future of law enforcement, but also redevelop internal cross-training for UCPO investigative staff. We want our staff to be subject-matter experts, who are also well-rounded enough to able to support other units as needed (added benefit of reduced overtime cost).
- Utilize two vacant prosecutors agent positions to create a Director of County-Wide Police Policy, Planning & Training. Recruited and hired Jonathan Parham for the position, to improve and modernize county-wide police training initiatives, with a focus on officer safety and increased de-escalation technique training.



5- Protect Union County's Children

- Developed a strategy for the increased impact of the CAC in three phases.
- Utilized existing resources to increase staffing at the Child Advocacy Center so as to be able to increase impact for child victims through Phase 1 of CAC expansion.
- Sought and obtained grant funding to be able to do internal construction so as to accommodate even more staff for an increased impact through Phase 2 of the CAC expansion.



2020 Initiatives Strengthen the public's trust

- Providing community forums that specifically meet stated community needs. (Examples: Active Shooter Training for Houses of Worship, A Community Conversation About Sensible Gun Safety at the Intersection of Art and Advocacy, Rideshare Safety and Self-Defense).
- Launching Public Service Announcements on Safety Tips.
- Training county-wide on the *Brady/Giglio* policy.
- Educational Presentations and Offerings:
 - Animal Cruelty Prevention
 - Kids Spreading Kindness for Adults
 - Drug Awareness for Parents and Educators
 - Justice in Action
 - Forensic Lab Tours
 - Career Panels
 - Supporting our Troops at Home and Abroad



2020 Initiatives Reduce Violence in Our Community

- Intelligence Liaison Program is at 100% participation among every law enforcement agency in county, plus state and federal partners.
- Additional personnel assigned to Counter-Terrorism Task Force and opened a formal working relationship between UCPO and FBI JTTF.
- Summer 2020, we will launch a forensic nurse response protocol in all non-fatal, domestic violence strangulation cases.
- Formalize a violence reduction partnership with the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of New Jersey.



2020 Initiatives Empathetically and effectively address the opioid epidemic.

- Became the first county in the state of New Jersey to expand Operation Helping Hand to a 24/7/365 Model.
- Training every department in the protocol and in maximizing recovery engagement.



2020 Initiatives Improve the Training and Safety of Our Officers

- Launching a pilot body-camera review protocol to use the incredible data points available through body-worn cameras to identify tangible ways to improve officer safety in every day interactions.
- Increased de-escalation training in the current Police Academy class by 40%. Will increase more by next class.
- Dedicated additional law enforcement assets to the Police Academy to improve upon in-service trainings.
- Created a committee to re-examine the legal courses at the Academy and update same for today's student.
- Implement roll-call training videos (makes training more accessible to departments with added benefit of reduced overtime)



2020 Initiatives Protect Union County's Children

- Phase 1 of CAC Expansion by April 2020
- Launch Union County Cares
- Create and launch Kids Spreading Kindness Campaign (and logo design contest)
- Behavioral Threat Assessment & Management Training early intervention to prevent school violence
- Reunification Procedure Training & UCPO Toolkit (2020-2021)

2020 Cost Reductions

The Prosecutor's Office is seeking an increase in the overall budget within the statutory 2% CAP in order to settled contracts for this year, 2019, and 2018. To remain within CAP several cost-reduction measures were implemented including, but not limited to, the following:

- 2019 Re-Organization resulted in over **\$150,000** in available funds realized in 2019 and 2020.
- 2020 Proposed Budget includes promotions to vacancies that result in **\$75,000** in available funds.
- 2020 Proposed Budget includes reduction of salaries associated with resulting and existing vacancies in excess of \$165,000.
- 2020 Proposed Budget includes elimination of numerous positions resulting in over **\$275,000** in available funds.
