AGENDA SETTING MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Kowalski presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order at 7:03 P.M.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed, Chairman Bette Jane Kowalski, Vice Chairman Alexander Mirabella, Freeholder Angel G. Estrada, Freeholder Sergio Granados, Freeholder Christopher Hudak, Freeholder Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded, and Freeholder Rebecca Williams were present; with Freeholder Angela R. Garretson and Freeholder Andrea Staten absent.

Also present were County Manager Edward T. Oatman, County Counsel Robert E. Barry, Esq., and Clerk of the Board James E. Pellettiere.

The prayer and salute to the flag were led by Clerk of the Board Pellettiere.

OFFICE OF THE UNION COUNTY PROSECUTOR

Lyndsay V. Ruotolo, Acting Prosecutor

1. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into an agreement with PowerDMS, Inc, Orlando, Florida, to renew subscription and licensing of Document Management Software in an amount not to exceed \$5,350.00. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)
2. Authorizing the County Manager through the Union County Prosecutor's Office to enter into a Professional Service Agreement with Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners to serve as independent contractors as part of the Union County Sexual Assault Response Team for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 in the amount of \$47,360.00. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)
3. Authorizing the County Manager through the Union County Prosecutor's Office to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with City of Newark for the utilization of the Union County Forensic Laboratory by a City of Newark Forensic Scientist. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Hudak asked Acting Prosecutor Ruotolo to elaborate on this item, in particular what the Shared Services would entail.

Acting Prosecutor Ruotolo advised that several years ago, Union County had offered to assist the City of Newark with drug-related forensic testing. She added that at the time the

arrangement was made, an influx of 250 cases maximum were anticipated, but the quantity grew exponentially. She noted that Newark had hired a Forensic Scientist to work in the U.C. Forensic Laboratory and process the caseload in an attempt to alleviate some of the current strain while also addressing cases originating in Newark that may or not be related to cases in Union County. She advised that as a result of the arrangement, Newark would be allowed to use the facility for their respective needs and Union County would be able to utilize the Forensic Scientist as the needed, without incurring additional cost.

4. Authorizing the following item to be deemed as surplus and no longer needed for use by the Union County Forensic Laboratory. Applied Biosystems 3130 Genetic Analyzer. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)
5. Authorizing a surplus Applied Biosystems 3130 Genetic Analyzer for donation to Rutgers' University - Camden Science Building, no longer needed for public purposes of this Board (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)

With regards to the 3130 Genetic Analyzer, Freeholder Estrada asked if the equipment was being retired to accommodate something more modern.

Acting Prosecutor Ruotolo advised that the cited equipment was deemed outdated and obsolete under Union County standards, as the lab is fairly contemporary. She added that the 3130 Genetic Analyzer would be donated to a state university so it can be further utilized by interns.

Chairman Kowalski added that the Union County Forensic Laboratory was recognized for its state-of-the-art equipment, hence the growing interest in a Shared Services Agreement.

Acting Prosecutor Ruotolo agreed, noting the laboratories unequalled scientific capabilities and the incredible personnel on staff.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Deputy Administrator Linda Wise and Chief Coordinator of Field Operations and Community Outreach Bridget Sloane represented the Board of Elections.

Deputy County Manager Wagner advised that this item related to several properties owned by HomeFirst, which experienced some difficulties in keeping up with the project. She added that a separate entity was identified to take over and man the project. She noted that the cited fees would be used to address the severe disrepair of several of the properties to facilitate rental and provide much needed affordable housing for eligible residents.

3. Resolution of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders concurring with the Union County Workforce Development Board approval to transfer Program Year 2018

Union County Workforce Area Budget funds in the amount of \$500,000 from WIOA Adult Accounts to WIOA Dislocated Worker Accounts. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Granados asked Deputy County Manager Wagner to elaborate on this item.

Deputy County Manager Wagner noted that this item related to the reassignment of funding from the state. She explained that when this type of funding was received from the state, funds were allocated into two accounts, one for adult workers without employment and another for dislocated worker who required assistance in obtaining new employment. She added that this item followed an appeal that was made to the state to reallocate more money to the dislocated worker fund as the need was greater.

DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION

Ron Zuber, Director _____

1. Amending Resolution Number 2017-1066, (BA#69-2015) with Deer Carcass Removal Services, LLC, for increasing the contract amount by \$15,000.00 due to the increased carcass removal, for a new total amount not to exceed \$54,000.00. (Chair Bette Jane Kowalski)

Freeholder Williams asked why the price had increased.

Director Zuber confirmed that the increase was related to an increase in the deer population.

Vice Chairman Mirabella commended Directors Ron Zuber and Michael Brennan for facilitating the introduction of alternative hunting methods, in particular bow hunting, to help mitigate the problem in a novel way.

Freeholder Palmieri-Mouded asked Director Zuber to elaborate on the removal covered by this item. She also asked if residents could use this service to report the presence of deer carcasses throughout their community.

Director Zuber advised that the item was independent from the deer hunt, but noted that the deer hunt did allow for the identification of heavily populated areas. He noted that in the last 2 years, approximately 517 carcasses involved in motor vehicle accidents had been picked up from roads throughout the county. He advised that while residents did not have direct access to the service, they could contact local law enforcement which would then be tasked with contacting the vendor to address the problem.

Freeholder Estrada asked for clarification related to fees.

Director Zuber confirmed the fees.

Freeholder Hudak asked if this item was an amendment to an existing contract.

Director Zuber confirmed that this was an amendment to a 2-year contract and advised that the additional funds requested were needed to fund the remaining contract period.

Freeholder Hudak asked Director Zuber if donations of deer carcasses were still being made.

Director Zuber confirmed that donations were being made to Hunters for the Hungry.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

Andrew Moran, Director

1. Authorizing the County Manager to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement for Tuberculosis Services with the New Jersey Medical School Global Tuberculosis Institute for a one-year period from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 in an amount not to exceed \$77,597.36. Freeholder Granados asked Director Moran to confirm whether or not the county was furnishing 50% of the cost for this item.

Director Moran confirmed that the portion furnished by the county covered half of the cost for services provided by the nurse case manager.

Freeholder Estrada asked for additional information related to Tuberculosis cases in the area to determine whether improvements and or advancements had been made.

Director Moran advised that he would provide those figures following the meeting.

2. Amending Resolution 2019-0526 to reflect language and sub award grant information provided by the State of New Jersey, accepting Federal Grant FY18 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant; subaward 18-PC-05, subaward period January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$7,969.00 (Freeholder Christopher Hudak)
3. Freeholder Hudak asked whether or not Hillside currently utilized any of the available Shared Services.

Director Moran advised that Hillside has been utilizing the Shared Services since 2012, in particular the fire and EMS services. He added that this item related to Hillside opting to utilize the Shared Services as their primary answering point for their 911 system.

Vice Chairman made comments relative to the Shared Services Agreement and argued the case for having more municipalities enroll in the service. He also requested additional information related to the municipalities currently using the Shared Services Agreement.

Director Zuber confirmed that the Shared Services Agreement did have its advantages, noting financial benefits and a boost in public safety.

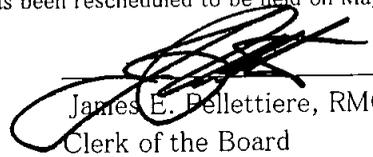
