The Committee discussed what resources and training the AJC has for individuals with disabilities. Grants and training are often not known to the population and educating CBO's and school districts could help bring these services to this population.

Barriers

The Committee discussed the need to help individuals with disabilities bridge gaps in services as well as educate clients regarding services that are available to them. Misinformation often leads to potential clients not taking advantage of services as they are afraid they could lose other services in doing so.
