

Chairman Joseph C. Bodek joined the Union County Board of County Commissioners in 2023 after being appointed to fill a vacancy on December 14, 2022. In 2026, he was sworn in as Chairman of the Board, bringing decades of public service experience and a deep commitment to responsible, community-focused governance.

Chairman Bodek is the son of a Jersey City Battalion Fire Chief and a graduate of New Jersey City University (formerly Jersey City State College), where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science with a minor in Economics in 1977. While at NJCU, he developed a strong interest in how communities function and how the government can best serve residents in practical, effective ways.

A lifelong New Jersey resident, Chairman Bodek grew up in Jersey City and moved to Linden following his high school graduation. He continues to reside in Linden with his wife, Christine. He is the proud father of two children — son Joseph John Bodek and daughter Beth Ann Rivera — and grandfather to Evelyn Mary Bodek, Adalyn Gene Rivera, and Aria Grace Rivera. Chairman Bodek's public service career spans more than four decades. He first served in elected office as a member of the Linden Board of Education beginning in 1981, where he served for more than 12 years. During that time, he also worked as a store manager for Meat City Companies. In 1989, he was appointed Clerk to the Union County Utilities Authority, overseeing environmentally responsible solid waste operations for more than 30 years before stepping down to become a County Commissioner.

As a Union County Commissioner, Chairman Bodek has served on numerous boards and committees, including the Union County College Board of School Estimates, Union County Vocational-Technical School Board of Estimates, Solid Waste Advisory Board, Construction Board of Appeals, Union County Voter Accessibility Advisory Board, and the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

In addition to his role as Chairman, Joseph C. Bodek has served as City Clerk of the City of Linden for over a decade. In that capacity, he oversees vital municipal functions including Registrar of Vital Statistics, Secretary to the Governing Body, ABC Secretary, Chairman of the Insurance Commission, and head of Personnel.

As Chairman, Bodek's 2026 Chairman's Initiatives are guided by the theme "Honoring the Past, Strengthening Our Tomorrow." His focus includes reinforcing core County services, supporting public safety and emergency preparedness, investing in parks, environmental stewardship, and quality-of-life initiatives, and recognizing historic milestones that reflect Union County's legacy while strengthening its foundation for future generations.

Commissioner Vice-Chair Rebecca L. Williams

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Vice Chair Rebecca L. Williams has served on the Commissioner Board since 2018, most recently winning reelection in 2025. In 2022, she served her first term as Chair of the Board.

For 2026, Commissioner Williams serves as Chair of the Board's Policy and Administrative Code Committee, and as a member of the County Operations Committee. This year, she also serves as Chairperson of the Union County America 250 Committee, to help lead Union County's commemoration of the 250 years of history since the American Revolution. In addition, she serves as liaison to the following advisory boards: Cultural and Heritage Advisory Board, Union County LGBTQ Ad Hoc Committee, Motion Picture & TV Advisory Board, and Green Brook Flood Control Commission.


Commissioner Williams, the first openly LGBTQ+ person to serve on the Union County Commissioner Board, has been in the forefront of community advocacy, working to address housing, senior services, education, health, public safety, community engagement, and other areas of concern. A frequent speaker on women's and LGBTQ+ empowerment, Commissioner Williams has served on panels at the League of Municipalities, The Center for American Women and Politics at Rutgers's Eagleton Institute, The National Council of Negro Women, and Social Justice Matters, Inc., among many other organizations.

Commissioner Williams prides herself on her openness and accessibility to all constituents. Known for an emphasis on constituent outreach, fiscal issues, support for arts and culture initiatives, and quality of life matters, Commissioner Williams advocates for county-local shared services that save tax dollars while improving efficiency. She remains a grassroots public servant, reaching out and following up with constituents to ensure their concerns are resolved.

Commissioner Williams is an Associate Professor of English in the Humanities and Bilingual Studies Division at Essex County College in Newark, where she teaches American Literature, Major Black American Writers, Literature and Film, Women's Literature, Survey of the Novel, African American Cinema, and English Composition. Although her primary focus is 19th century American literature, her other academic interests include early American crime narratives, African American modernism, memoir, and speculative fiction.

Commissioner James E. Baker, Jr. was elected in 2024 to serve his second three-year term as a Union County Commissioner. A lifelong resident of Rahway and a dedicated public servant, Commissioner Baker has devoted his career to providing vital human services to families and residents of Union County while supporting strong and sustainable community development.

Commissioner Baker is currently assigned to the County of Union's Fiscal and County Operations Standing Committees. He also serves as a member of the Senior Citizen & Disabled Resident Transportation Board, the Advisory Council on Aging, the Disabilities Advisory Board, the Homeless Trust Fund Advisory Board, and the Middlesex County Utilities Authority, where he is serving his fourth year.

In 2025, Commissioner Baker served as Chair of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee and as a member of the Open Space, Recreation, and Historic Preservation Trust Board. He also served on the Local Advisory Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (LACADA), the Industrial Pollution Control Authority, and the Shade Tree Advisory Board.

From 2006 to 2021, Commissioner Baker served as an At-Large Councilman in the City of Rahway, where he played a key role in numerous initiatives. His work included collaborating with veterans' organizations to establish a city park named in honor of Myron Ross, a Rahway native and African American service member killed in combat during the Vietnam War; coordinating an employee volunteer program with Merck that engaged more than 100 employees across multiple community sites in Rahway; and serving twice as President of the Rahway City Council. He also helped coordinate a partnership with the County of Union's Sheriff's Labor Assistance Program (SLAP), sponsored the effort to name the Children's Section of the Rahway Public Library in honor of the late Congressman Donald Payne, Sr., and assisted in negotiations to relocate two County-managed services—the Community Coordinated Child Care agency and the Intoxicated Drivers Resource Center (IDRC)—to the City of Rahway.

Commissioner Baker's previous experience also includes service on the State Legislative Committee of the New Jersey School Boards Association, the Urban School Board Association, the Rahway Board of Education, the Rahway Planning Board, and the Rahway Housing Authority. In addition, he served on the Boards of Directors for the Rahway Day Care Center and Jefferson Park Ministries in Elizabeth.

Commissioner Baker worked for the County of Union for 30 years, beginning as a Senior Program Development Specialist in the Division of Planning within the Department of Human Services. He later served in the Office of Community Development in the Department of Economic Development, where he helped local municipalities implement ADA-compliant sidewalks, improve road conditions, and complete other critical community infrastructure improvements.

A graduate of Wilberforce University, Commissioner Baker holds a bachelor's degree in Sociology and earned a Master's degree in Psychology from Kean University.

Commissioner Michèle S. Delisfort is a nationally respected planner, public servant, and community leader with 30 years of experience advancing equitable, resilient, and inclusive communities. Known for her deep subject-matter expertise and steady, solutions-oriented leadership, she brings a fair, informed, and forward-thinking approach to county government.

Commissioner Delisfort's career spans urban planning, redevelopment, public policy, and municipal leadership, earning her statewide recognition for thoughtful growth strategies that enhance quality of life across New Jersey. A former Mayor of Union Township, she successfully applied her business and planning expertise to governance, delivering results that matter. Her leadership helped secure millions in strategic redevelopment investments, revitalize commercial corridors, strengthen public safety, modernize infrastructure, and enhance parks and public spaces—always with a focus on accountability, fiscal responsibility, and community impact.

Commissioner Delisfort is widely recognized for her responsive and collaborative leadership style and her deep commitment to community engagement. She is known for delivering transparent government, equitable growth, and smart, strategic investments, bringing residents, stakeholders, and institutions together to achieve measurable results and lasting improvements that strengthen neighborhoods and expand opportunity. She currently serves as President of the American Planning Association—New Jersey Chapter, reflecting her leadership at the highest level of the planning profession. A trusted voice on smart growth and redevelopment policy, she is also deeply committed to mentoring the next generation of planners and public leaders.

During her tenure as Mayor, Commissioner Delisfort played a pivotal role in guiding Union Township through the COVID-19 pandemic, coordinating emergency response efforts and providing critical support to residents and local businesses during an unprecedented crisis. Today, as Union County Commissioner, she continues to lead with vision and integrity—championing smart growth, inclusive development, and forward-looking policies that deliver results and serve every community fairly.

Commissioner Lourdes M. Leon, a lifelong resident of Elizabeth, was elected to the Union County Board of County Commissioners in 2020. She made history as the first Hispanic woman elected to the Board and previously served as Chairwoman in 2025 under the theme “Union County 2025: Connecting Communities, Committed to Progress.” During her chairmanship, she advanced initiatives focused on accessibility, inclusion, and strengthening direct connections between County government and residents.

A dedicated community advocate and award-winning educator, Commissioner Leon devoted more than 27 years to the Elizabeth School District. Born in Cuba, she immigrated to Elizabeth with her parents in 1971. She began her career in education as a teacher’s aide and advanced through leadership roles to become Vice Principal and later Principal of the Donald Stewart Early Childhood Center, which she helped open in 2003. In recognition of her contributions, she received the Donald Stewart Strive for Excellence Educator’s Award in 2004–2005.

After retiring from the school district in 2013, Commissioner Leon continued her commitment to public service as President of the City of Elizabeth Mayor’s Community Development Advisory Committee, a position she has held since 2017. In 2021, as a member of the Board’s Public Safety Committee, she played a key role in overseeing Union County’s COVID-19 response, which included the administration of hundreds of thousands of tests and vaccines and the distribution of more than 10 million meals to residents in need.

As Chairwoman, Commissioner Leon championed a number of quality-of-life initiatives designed to serve residents of all ages and abilities. These included the expansion of free children’s and senior swim programs, the return of the Summer Arts concert and movie series, summer theater programming, and the growth of sensory-friendly theater and arts experiences to ensure inclusive access to cultural programming. She also launched Coffee with a Commissioner, an outreach initiative that brought County information directly to senior housing sites and community locations, allowing residents to engage one-on-one, ask questions, and access services in a welcoming, informal setting.

As a Commissioner, Leon has served as liaison to several boards and committees, including the Advisory Council on Aging, the Senior Citizen and Disabled Resident Transportation Board, the Union College School Board of Estimates, the Shade Tree Advisory Board, and the Community Development Block Grant Board. She also serves as an alternate liaison to the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority, reflecting her continued commitment to meeting residents where they are.

Commissioner Leon holds a Master of Arts degree in Educational Administration. She graduated Summa Cum Laude from Kean University and completed graduate coursework in Educational Leadership at Walden University and Marygrove College.

Commissioner Alexander Mirabella has been a dedicated member of the Union County Board of County Commissioners since his first election in 1997, and he was re-elected in 2024 for his tenth three-year term. Throughout his tenure, he has served as Vice Chairman six times and Chairman seven times, including during the critical years of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and 2021.

During the pandemic, Commissioner Mirabella led Union County's response, implementing essential services such as New Jersey's first county-based drive-through testing site at Kean University, mobile test sites, testing for the homebound, and coordinating the vaccine rollout in early 2021. He also managed federal CARES Act funds to provide meals, support small businesses, schools, libraries, nonprofits, and offer child care and rental assistance. His leadership extended to recovery efforts following Tropical Storm Ida in 2021, ensuring economic support for impacted residents.

As Board Chairman in 2021, Commissioner Mirabella's "Union County Rising" initiatives focused on COVID-19 response, economic development, parks improvements, and inclusive services, while maintaining fiscal stability to avoid tax increases or layoffs. In past roles as Chairman, he has expanded Union County parks through the Open Space Trust Fund, developed the Office of Veterans Affairs Services, created the Office of LGBTQ Affairs, and introduced the Sensory Friendly Theater program. His focus also includes infrastructure, workforce development, and sustainability measures.

Currently, Commissioner Mirabella serves as Trust Fund Chair of the Union County Performing Arts Center Board of Trustees, and is a member of the Fire Services Advisory Board, Veterans Affairs Committee, the Union County Labor Advisory Board, the Union County Fiscal Committee and the Open Space, Recreation and Historic Trust Fund. Commissioner Mirabella is the sole NJ Director to the National Association of Counties (NACO) and was appointed as the Vice Chair of the International Economic Development Task Force and the Finance, Pension and Intergovernmental committees and is a member of the Large Urban County Caucus.

Commissioner Mirabella is on the Board of Trustees for Wenzhou-Kean University in China and John Cabot University in Italy. He has also been instrumental in supporting Union College of Union County, NJ (UCNJ) and played a key role in establishing the Union County Vocational-Technical High Schools. He organizes the annual Columbus Day Italian flag-raising event and was honored by the Italian Tribune as the "Christopher Columbus Man of the Year." Previously, he served on the Roselle Park Borough Council from 1991 to 1996. Mirabella graduated from Hobart College in Geneva, NY, with a degree in Economics. He resides in Union County with his wife, Phyllis, and their two children, Alexander and Micayla.

Commissioner Stanley J. Neron is a lifelong public servant committed to strengthening families, expanding opportunities for young people, and improving quality of life across Union County. Born in Brooklyn, New York to Haitian immigrant parents and raised in Elizabeth, New Jersey, Commissioner Neron is a proud first-generation American whose work in public service is rooted in community engagement, equity, and service. He is a graduate of Kean University.

Commissioner Neron previously served on the Elizabeth Board of Education for 12 years after being elected in 2013, including two terms as President, most recently in 2025. During his tenure, the district achieved its highest graduation rate to date, reaching 89 percent. The Elizabeth Public Schools system is the second-largest school district in New Jersey. He has also served as Assistant Director of the City of Elizabeth's Department of Health and Human Services, where he supported programs serving seniors, vulnerable families, and at-risk youth. In 2010, following the Haiti earthquake, he helped coordinate statewide relief efforts and assisted families impacted by the disaster. As Director of Recreation for the City of Elizabeth, Commissioner Neron oversaw major improvements to parks and recreational facilities throughout the city, including playgrounds, athletic fields, spray parks, fitness areas, and community centers in all five wards. He also directed a youth employment program providing paid summer jobs and workforce development opportunities to nearly 300 young people each year.

Earlier in his career, Commissioner Neron worked in the entertainment industry as a writer, producer, filmmaker, and talent agent, collaborating with major media organizations and advocating for authentic storytelling and representation. He lives in Elizabeth with his wife and two children, and remains actively involved in community initiatives focused on food access, youth mentorship, and family support. He brings a strong commitment to collaboration and public service to his role on the Union County Board of County Commissioners.

Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded

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Commissioner Kimberly Palmieri-Mouded is currently serving her second term on the Union County Board of County Commissioners in 2024, following her role as Chairwoman in 2024 and Vice-Chairwoman in 2023. Since her re-election to the Board in 2021, she has led with a focus on enhancing community connectivity, inclusivity, and the well-being of residents across all ages.

As Chairwoman in 2024, Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded's "Growing Together in Union County" initiatives included several impactful programs, including the Senior Scam Workshops, which educate and protect older residents, and the Inclusive Books for All initiative, bringing diverse literature to public elementary schools countywide. She also launched the Senior Stories Program to celebrate the experiences and contributions of seniors, while promoting wellness through Free Swim Lessons for children and seniors. To foster family connections, she helped in the organization of the summer/fall music and movies series to make it more family focused. Additionally, Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded introduced the Train the Trainer Mental Health Program to support residents' mental health needs and helped establish the UCPAC Legacy Arts Club, which offers free arts workshops for residents aged 60+ to encourage creativity, self-expression, and community connection. Her focus on enhancing accessibility is reflected in continuous updates to county facilities and programs, ensuring inclusivity and improving residents' quality of life.

Born and raised in Elizabeth, NJ, and a lifelong resident of Union County, Commissioner Palmieri-Mouded holds a B.A. in English and an M.P.S. in Criminal Justice Leadership from St. John's University. After her studies, she served as Associate Dean for Student Life at St. John's University, managing student organizations, events, and off-campus community service projects. After the birth of her twins, she chose to stay home to care for her children and now volunteers at their schools in addition to her responsibilities as a County Commissioner. She currently resides in Westfield with her husband George and their five children: Matthew, Christopher, Nicholas, Ryan, and Adeline.

Commissioner Joseph Signorello III brings a track record of executive leadership and municipal innovation to the county level. Before his election to the Commissioner Board in 2024, Joe served two terms as the Mayor of Roselle Park, where he was instrumental in revitalizing the borough's infrastructure and economy. During his tenure as Mayor, he championed shared services to reduce tax burdens, oversaw significant redevelopment projects to utilize fallow properties, and prioritized the modernization of public works. His approach to government is rooted in fiscal responsibility and delivering tangible results, focusing on smart development and critical infrastructure investments that benefit residents across Union County.

In his professional career, Commissioner Signorello is an experienced executive in the financial and technology sectors. He currently works in tech consulting focusing on software development and AI deployment. His private sector background includes serving as the Chief Operating Officer of Magis Capital Partners and working extensively in international markets, including Switzerland and Germany, for major financial institutions. This global business perspective drives his commitment to bringing modern efficiencies, technology-driven solutions, and next-generation job opportunities to Union County's economy.

A lifelong resident of Union County, Joe is a product of its public education system. He is a graduate of the Union County Magnet High School in Scotch Plains and went on to earn his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Seton Hall University. His deep roots in the community—spanning generations of his family living in Roselle Park—fuel his dedication to public service. As Commissioner, he remains committed to applying his diverse background in business and local governance to ensure Union County remains a premier place to live, work, and raise a family.

Edward T. Oatman is a seasoned public administrator with over two decades of experience in government. He holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Rutgers University and a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from Kean University.

Since his appointment in 2018, Oatman has served as the Union County Manager—the 12th individual to hold the role under the County Manager form of government. He is responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of a diverse, 21-municipality government with approximately 2,500 full-time employees, and for implementing the policies set by the Union County Board of County Commissioners.

Throughout his tenure, Oatman has led with a steady hand during times of crisis and transformation. His leadership was pivotal during the COVID-19 pandemic, overseeing the launch of New Jersey's first County-run testing center and mobile unit, multiple vaccination sites, and food distribution events that delivered over 41 million meals. By 2023, the County had conducted more than 172,000 COVID tests and administered over 122,000 vaccinations. In 2024, the County continued to invest in post-pandemic recovery efforts, including workforce re-entry programs and public health infrastructure upgrades.

Under Oatman's fiscal leadership, Union County maintained a zero percent tax increase for four consecutive years (2020–2023) while continuing to deliver essential services, implement reforms, and invest in long-term capital projects. His administration successfully closed and repurposed the former Juvenile Detention Center into a Fire/EMS Training Academy, reducing costs and expanding training opportunities for first responders across the region. Oatman has also overseen major capital investments in park redevelopment, flood mitigation, and infrastructure modernization, supporting both quality of life and job creation. He continues to administer key grant programs that support small businesses, nonprofit organizations, and municipal governments, including the strategic use of ARPA funds.

A respected voice in statewide and regional affairs, Oatman was appointed in 2019 by the Governor to the Police and Fire Retirement System Board of Trustees. He also serves as Chairman of the Union County Performing Arts Center Board, sits on the Kean University Board of Trustees, the Liberty State Park Task Force, and the New Jersey-Ireland Trade Commission.

Outside of his public service career, Oatman remains active in his hometown of Woodbridge, where he resides with his three children and two dogs, Buddy and Briscoe. He continues to volunteer with local youth sports and educational initiatives, including the Woodbridge Little League and the Woodbridge Township Youth Soccer Association.


